#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

- The area of request is currently zoned IR Industrial Research and developed with a single-family structure.
- The lot is accessible from Mohawk Drive.
- The applicant proposes to maintain the existing single-family structure.
- To accomplish this, the applicant requests an MU-1 Mixed Use district.
- Since the last CPC meeting held on September 19, 2024, the applicant has volunteered deed restrictions that would prohibit many of the uses permitted in the proposed MU-1 District and reduce the maximum height. The deed restrictions would also require design standards for the site.

#### Zoning History:

There has been one zoning case in the area in the past five years.

1. **Z201-200**: On August 11, 2021, the Dallas City Council approved an application for an MF-2(A) Multifamily District on property zoned an IR Industrial Research District on the northwest line of Empire Central, southwest of Mohawk Drive.

## Land Use Compatibility:

The property is zoned Industrial Research and developed with a single-family structure. Properties to the north and east are zoned Industrial Research and developed with single-family uses and some vacant areas. Properties to south is zoned MU-1 and undeveloped. Properties to the west are zoned Planned Development District No.759 and developed with multi-family uses.

The purpose of the industrial research district is to provide for research and development, light industrial, office, and supporting commercial uses in an industrial research park setting. This district is not intended to be located in areas of low and medium density residential development. The applicant is requesting to rezone the area of request to MU-1 to allow for the continued use of the existing single-family use. MU-1 zoning district would also eliminate any difficulties in developing adjacent properties and would not disrupt neighboring residential uses.

## Landscaping:

Landscaping must be provided in accordance with the landscaping requirements in Article X, as amended.

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## Parking:

Pursuant to the Dallas Development Code, the off-street parking requirement for single family two spaces per dwelling unit. The applicant will be required to comply with standard parking ratios at permitting.

#### Market Value Analysis:

<u>Market Value Analysis (MVA)</u>, is a tool to aid residents and policymakers in <sup>understanding</sup> the elements of their local residential real estate markets. It is an objective, data-driven tool built on local administrative data and validated with local experts. The analysis was prepared for the City of Dallas by The Reinvestment Fund. Public officials and private actors can use the MVA to more precisely target intervention strategies in weak markets and support sustainable growth in stronger markets. The MVA identifies nine market types (A through I) on a spectrum of residential market strength or weakness. As illustrated in the attached MVA map, the colors range from purple representing the strongest markets (A through C) to orange, representing the weakest markets (G through I). The area of request is located in "C" MVA cluster.

- 5. Streetscape shall consist of a minimum six-foot planting zone with a minimum six-foot sidewalk.
- 6. Parking must be screened adjacent to single-family uses. The screening must have a minimum height of six feet and may have no more than 10 percent openings.
- 7. Off-street parking is prohibited in the front yard setback.
- 8. All uses must have a pedestrian connection from the ground floor entryways to Mohawk Drive.
- 9. An office use must be located on the ground floor facing Mohawk Drive and must have a minimum 50 percent facade transparency.


