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An ordinance providing for the abandonment of a portion of Fifteenth Street and an entire water main reservation located in and adjacent to City Block 1/3440 in the City of Dallas and County of Dallas, Texas; subject to a reverter; providing for the quitclaim thereof to City of Dallas – Park and Recreation Department; providing for the terms and conditions of the abandonment and quitclaim made herein; providing for barricading; providing for the conveyance of needed land to the City of Dallas; providing for the indemnification of the City of Dallas against damages arising out of the abandonment herein; providing for the consideration to be paid to the City of Dallas; providing for the payment of the publication fee; providing a future effective date for this abandonment; and providing an effective date for this ordinance.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Dallas, acting pursuant to law and upon the request and petition of the City of Dallas — Park and Recreation Department, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as **GRANTEE**, deems it advisable to abandon and quitclaim, subject to a reverter, the hereinafter described tracts of land to **GRANTEE**, and is of the opinion that, subject to the terms and conditions and reverter herein provided, said portion of Fifteenth Street and entire water main reservation are not needed for public use, and same should be abandoned and quitclaimed to **GRANTEE**, as hereinafter stated; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Dallas is of the opinion that the best interest and welfare of the public will be served by abandoning and quitclaiming the same to **GRANTEE** for the consideration and subject to the terms, conditions and reverter hereinafter more fully set forth;

Now, Therefore,

# BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DALLAS:

**SECTION 1.** That the tracts of land described in Exhibit A, which is attached hereto and made a part hereof for all purposes, be and the same is abandoned, vacated and closed insofar as the right, title and interest of the public are concerned; subject, however, to the reverter and the conditions and future effective date hereinafter more fully set out.

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**SECTION 2.** That for and in monetary consideration of the sum of **ELEVEN THOUSAND ONE-HUNDRED FIFTY AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$11,150.00)** paid by **GRANTEE**, and the further consideration described in Sections 8, 9, 10, and 11, the City of Dallas does by these presents **QUITCLAIM** unto the said **GRANTEE**, subject to the conditions, reservations, future effective date, the reverter, and exceptions hereinafter made and with the restrictions and upon the covenants below stated, all of its right, title and interest in and to the certain tracts of land hereinabove described in Exhibit A. Provided however, that if **GRANTEE**, its successors and assigns, fails to file a final replat of the adjoining properties as required in Section 10 of this ordinance, but no later than the earlier of (i) the date applicable pursuant to the requirements of the Dallas Development Code Chapter 51A-8.403(a)(4)(D) which provides in pertinent part, as may be amended:

- "(D) Except as provided in this subparagraph, a preliminary plat approved by the commission expires five years after the commission action date approving the plat if no progress has been made toward completion of the project in accordance with Texas Local Government Code Section 245.005. An approved minor plat, amending plat (minor), or an administrative plat expires two years after the commission action date approving the plat or within two years after the date of the subdivision administrator's action letter approving the administrative plat if no progress has been made toward completion of the project in accordance with Texas Local Government Code Section 245.005";
- or (ii) the date that is the sixth anniversary of the passage of this ordinance; THEN this ordinance and quitclaim shall be rendered null and void and the right, title and easement of the public shall absolutely revert without any necessity for suit or re-entry by the City; and no act or omission on the part of the City, its successors and assigns, shall be a waiver of the operation or enforcement of this ordinance. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD all of such right, title and interest in and to the property and premises, subject aforesaid, together with all and singular the rights, privileges, hereditaments and appurtenances thereto in any manner belonging unto the said **GRANTEE**.
- **SECTION 3.** That upon payment of the monetary consideration set forth in Section 2, **GRANTEE** accepts the terms, provisions, future effective date and conditions of this ordinance.
- **SECTION 4.** That the Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to transfer the monetary consideration set forth Section 2, plus **ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY-SIX AND**

NO/100 DOLLARS (\$186.00) for the ordinance publication and recording fees from the 2017 Bond Fund (Park and Recreation Facilities (B), Fund 1V00, Department PKR, Unit VB08, Object 3599. Said funds shall be transferred to the General Fund, Fund 0001, Department FRM, Balance Sheet 0519 and Department of Facilities and Real Estate Management shall be reimbursed for the cost of obtaining the legal description, appraisal and other administrative costs incurred. The reimbursement proceeds shall be deposited in General Fund, Fund 0001, Department FRM, Unit 1181, Object 5011 and any remaining proceeds shall be transferred to the General Capital Reserve Fund, Fund 0625, Department BMS, Unit 8888, Revenue Code 8416.

**SECTION 5.** That the abandonment and quitclaim provided for herein are made subject to all present zoning and deed restrictions, if the latter exist, and are subject to all existing easement rights of others, if any, whether apparent or non-apparent, aerial, surface, underground or otherwise, and are further subject to the conditions contained in Exhibit B, which is attached hereto and made a part hereof for all purposes.

**SECTION 6.** That the terms and conditions contained in this ordinance shall be binding upon **GRANTEE**, its successors and assigns.

**SECTION 7.** That the abandonment and quitclaim provided for herein shall extend only to the public right, title, easement and interest, and shall be construed to extend only to that interest the Governing Body of the City of Dallas may legally and lawfully abandon and vacate.

**SECTION 8.** That as a condition of this abandonment and as a part of the consideration for the quitclaim to **GRANTEE** herein, **GRANTEE**, its successors and assigns, to the extent allowed by law, agree to indemnify, defend, release and hold harmless the City of Dallas as to any and all claims for damages, fines, penalties, costs or expenses to persons or property that may arise out of, or be occasioned by or from: (i) the use and occupancy of the areas described in Exhibit A by **GRANTEE**, its successors and assigns; (ii) the presence, generation, spillage, discharge, release, treatment or disposition of any Hazardous Substance on or affecting the areas set out in Exhibit A; (iii) all corrective actions concerning any discovered Hazardous Substances on or affecting the areas

described in Exhibit A, which GRANTEE, its successors and assigns, agree to undertake and complete in accordance with applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations; and (iv) the abandonment, closing, vacation and quitclaim by the City of Dallas of the areas set out in Exhibit A. GRANTEE, its successors and assigns, hereby agree to defend any and all suits, claims, or causes of action brought against the City of Dallas on account of same, and discharge any judgment or judgments that may be rendered against the City of Dallas in connection therewith. For purposes hereof, "Hazardous Substance" means the following: (a) any "hazardous substances" under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act, 42 U.S.C. Section 9601 et seq., as amended; (b) any "hazardous substance" under the Texas Hazardous Substances Spill Prevention and Control Act, TEX. WATER CODE, Section 26.261 et seq., as amended; (c) petroleum or petroleum-based products (or any derivative or hazardous constituents thereof or additives thereto), including without limitation, fuel and lubricating oils; (d) any "hazardous chemicals" or "toxic chemicals" under the Occupational Safety and Health Act, 29 U.S.C. Section 651 et seq., as amended; (e) any "hazardous waste" under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, 42 U.S.C. Section 6901 et seq., as amended; and (f) any "chemical substance" under the Toxic Substance Control Act, 15 U.S.C. Section 2601 et seq., as amended. References to particular acts or codifications in this definition include all past and future amendments thereto, as well as applicable rules and regulations as now or hereafter promulgated thereunder.

**SECTION 9.** That this abandonment, relinquishment and quitclaim of the City's right, title and interest in and to said portion of Fifteenth Street and the entirety of said water main reservation easement shall not become effective until and unless: (i) the installations and facilities contemplated as necessary by Dallas Water Utilities are installed, at **GRANTEE's** expense, in the new easements as described in Section 10, to be provided by **GRANTEE** and acceptable to the Director of Planning and Development Department, as is hereinafter provided; and (ii) plans for the construction of installations contemplated as necessary by Dallas Water Utilities within the new easements are approved by the Director of Planning and Development Department; and (iii) said construction of

installations contemplated as necessary by Dallas Water Utilities are completed, approved and accepted in writing by the Director of Planning and Development Department. **GRANTEE** will grant the new easements at no cost consideration to the City and all work shall be done at the sole cost of **GRANTEE** and to the satisfaction of the Director of Planning and Development Department. Failure to relocate to the new easements in accordance with the terms of this section shall render this ordinance null and void and of no further effect.

SECTION 10. That as a condition of this abandonment and as a part of the consideration for the quitclaim made herein, GRANTEE shall record a final replat of the adjoining properties within one year of the effective date of this ordinance showing the dedication of not less than 3,328 square feet for a water easement in City Block 1/3440 and the dedication of not less than 1,099 square feet in City Block 1/3440 for a second water easement. This final replat shall be recorded by GRANTEE in the official real property records of the county in which the abandoned areas and the dedicated property are located, after its approval by the City Plan Commission of the City of Dallas. This abandonment shall not be effective unless and until this dedication is completed and failure to record a final replat in accordance with the term of this section shall render this ordinance null and void and of no further effect. Further, the final replat shall be recorded in the official real property records of the county in which the abandoned areas are located before a certified copy of this ordinance shall be delivered to GRANTEE.

**SECTION 11.** That as a condition of this abandonment and as a part of the consideration for the quitclaim made herein, **GRANTEE** shall, immediately upon the effectiveness of this abandonment, close, barricade and/or place signs in the areas described in Exhibit A in accordance with detailed plans approved by the Director of Department of Facilities and Real Estate Management. **GRANTEE's** responsibility for keeping the areas described in Exhibit A closed, barricaded and/or the signs in place shall continue until the street improvements and intersection returns are removed by **GRANTEE**, its successors and assigns, to the satisfaction of the Director of Department of Facilities and Real Estate Management.

SECTION 12. That the City Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to certify a copy of this ordinance for recordation in the official real property records of the county in which the abandonment areas are located, which certified copy shall be delivered to the Director of Department of Facilities and Real Estate Management, or designee. Upon receipt of the monetary consideration set forth in Section 2, plus the fee for the publishing of this ordinance, which GRANTEE shall likewise pay, and the filing of the final replat and completion of the dedication set forth in Section 10, the Director of Department of Facilities and Real Estate Management, or designee: (i) shall deliver to GRANTEE a certified copy of this ordinance, and (ii) is authorized to and shall prepare and deliver a QUITCLAIM DEED with regard to the areas abandoned herein, subject to a reverter interest, to GRANTEE hereunder, same to be executed by the City Manager on behalf of the City of Dallas, attested by the City Secretary and approved as to form by the City Attorney. The Director of Department of Facilities and Real Estate Management, or designee, shall be the sole source for receiving certified copies of this ordinance for one year after its passage.

**SECTION 13.** That this ordinance is also designated for City purposes as Contract No. FRM-2024-00024084.

**SECTION 14.** That this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the City of Dallas, and it is accordingly so ordained.
