



Determining State Priorities



- Committees requested to consider and advance potential legislative priorities (see Appendix for dates)
- Ad Hoc Committee on Legislative Affairs advanced to full City Council for consideration and final adoption
- Program should be adaptable
- Considerations
 - Legislative / delegation priorities (support, monitor, pursue, oppose)
 - Balancing the asks (wants, needs, nice-to-have)
 - Political environment (elections, current events)
 - Unforeseen circumstances



TML Suggestions for City Officials



- 1. There is a practical limit to what the League or any group can accomplish in any legislative session.
- 2. TML will expend the vast majority of its resources killing bad bills. This has always been so and will probably always be the case.
- 3. It is unlikely that any other interest group in the state monitors and opposes as many bills as the Texas Municipal League.
- 4. Unfortunately, the number of bad city-related bills grows almost every year.
- 5. Given the League's finite resources, and because vast amounts of those resources are necessarily expended in defeating bad legislation, the League must very carefully select bills that it will support or for which it will attempt to seek passage. Thus, it is important to advocate only those initiatives that are truly important and that have a realistic chance of passage.
