Proposed Charter Amendment:

REDUCE PETITION REQUIREMENTS FOR CITIZEN-INITIATED BALLOT MEASURES

What Are Citizen-Initiated Ballot Measures?

Ballot propositions can be initiated in two ways:

The Dallas City Council can place a proposition on the ballot

OR

 Registered voters in the City of Dallas* can do so via a petition process

^{*}The Commission has voted to recommend this be changed to "Dallas resident"

Dallas' Petition Process Is Too Difficult

- Dallas requires signatures from 10% of all registered voters
- 700,000 registered voters in Dallas = 70,000 signatures
- Signatures must be collected within <u>60 days</u>
- That's more than 1,000 valid signatures EVERY DAY!

Easier to Put a Proposed <u>Charter Amendment</u> on the Ballot Than a <u>City Law</u>

PETITION FOR A CHARTER AMENDMENT

- Lesser of 20,000 or 5% of registered voters
 - 180 days to collect signatures

PETITION FOR A CITY LAW

- 10% of registered voters
 - 60 days to collect signatures

More Signatures Required for a <u>Citizen-Initiated Ballot Measure</u> Than Vote In <u>Most Council Elections</u>

Dallas' Process Is More Difficult Than Other Major Cities in Texas

AUSTIN	Lesser of 5% of registered voters or 20,000 signatures	No time limit	2022
SAN ANTONIO	10% of all registered voters (20,282 signatures)	180 days	2021
HOUSTON	10% of voters in last mayoral election (24,536 signatures)	30 days	2016
DALLAS	10% of all registered voters (70,000 signatures)	60 days	2007

Dallas' Petition Process Discourages <u>Public Engagement</u> and Encourages <u>Bad Charter Amendments</u>

- Nearly <u>impossible for grassroots groups</u>/volunteers to meet stringent petition referendum requirements
- Process <u>favors well-funded groups</u> that hire signature gatherers
- Groups opt for <u>easier Charter petition process</u>, even for legislation not appropriate for Charter

PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT:

5% signature requirement 120-day collection period

- Collecting 35,000 signatures over four months is more attainable by grassroots groups
- Still stringent enough to ensure voters won't be inundated with ballot initiatives that lack broad public support
