**WHEREAS,** on August 11, 2021, the City Council authorized a five-year service price agreement for temporary industrial and day labor for citywide use with A & Associates, Inc. in the estimated amount of \$54,076,750.00 and Rushmore Corporation dba ALL TEMPS 1 Personnel in the estimated amount of \$18,031,559.05, in a total estimated amount of \$72,108,309.05, by Resolution No. 21-1263.

Now, therefore,

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DALLAS:

**SECTION 1.** That the City Manager is hereby authorized to execute a service price agreement with Smith Temporaries, Inc. dba CornerStone Staffing (VS0000066539) through an interlocal agreement with the City of Arlington, approved as to form by the City Attorney, for temporary industrial and day labor for citywide use for a term of two years, in the estimated amount of \$8,000,000.00. The amount payable pursuant to this service price agreement may exceed the estimated amount but may not exceed the amount of budgetary appropriations for this service price agreement during its term. Payments made to Smith Temporaries, Inc. dba CornerStone Staffing shall be based only on the amount of the services directed to be performed by the City and properly performed by Smith Temporaries, Inc. dba CornerStone Staffing under the cooperative purchasing agreement. The City Manager is further authorized, in the City Manager's sole discretion, to exercise an option to extend the agreement for an additional six months by filing a notice of extension with the City Secretary's Office.

**SECTION 2.** That the Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to disburse funds in an estimated amount of at least \$8,000,000.00 (subject to annual appropriations), but not more than the amount of budgetary appropriations for this service price agreement during its term to Smith Temporaries, Inc. dba CornerStone Staffing from Service Price Agreement Contract No. DAS-2025-00027765.

**SECTION 3.** That this resolution shall take effect immediately from and after its passage in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the City of Dallas, and it is accordingly so resolved.
