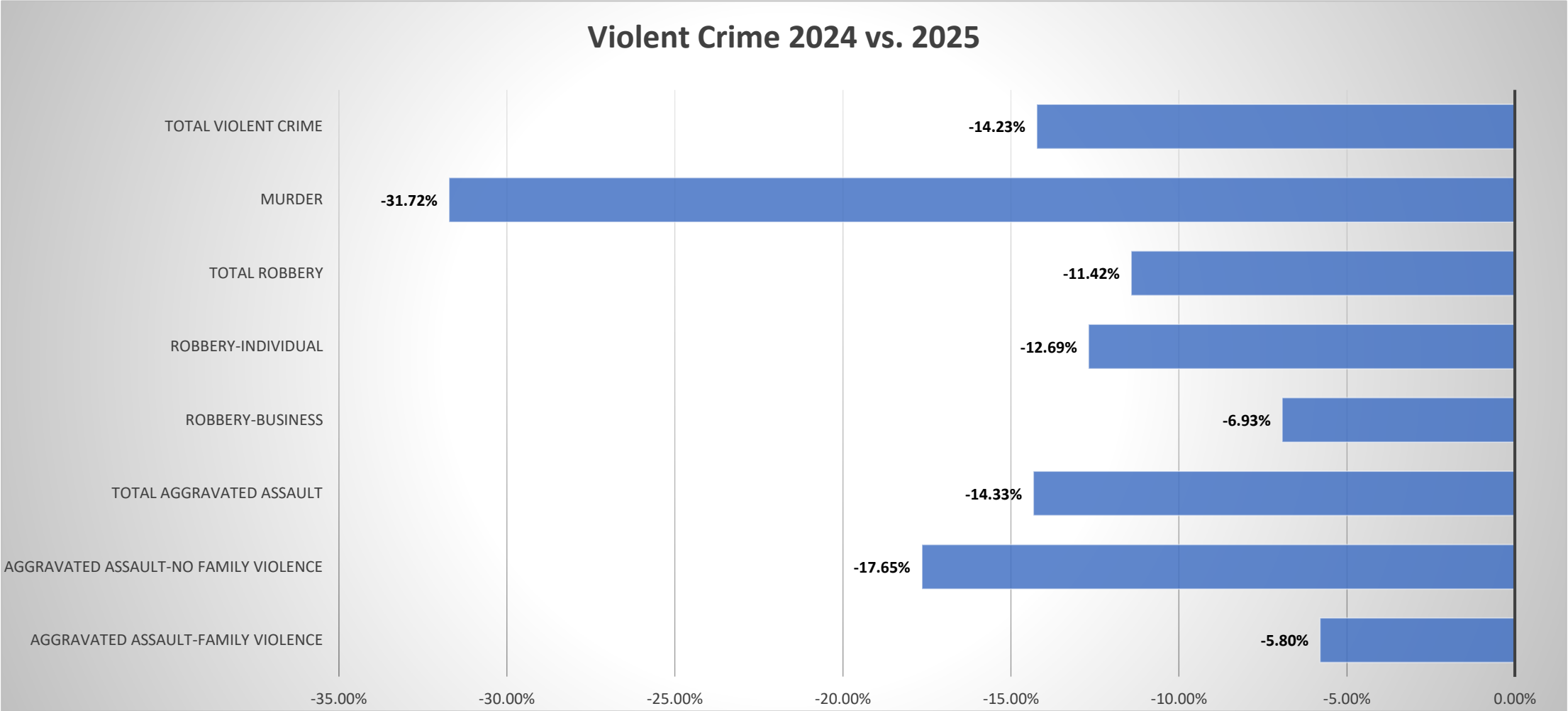
SUMMARY OF SEPTEMBER



- Overall Violent Crime is down by **-14.23%**
- There are three significant contributing factors as of year-to-date:
 - Aggravated Assaults have decreased **-14.33%**
 - Homicides have decreased **-31.72%**
 - **OJT** - 349 arrested 1,928 prior arrest; **MSJ** -118 arrested 410 prior arrest. Total **467** arrest with 2,338 prior arrest.
- We launched our Period 24 Grids on October 1st
- Focused Deterrence has moved to Neighborhood Outreach as the primary notification system.



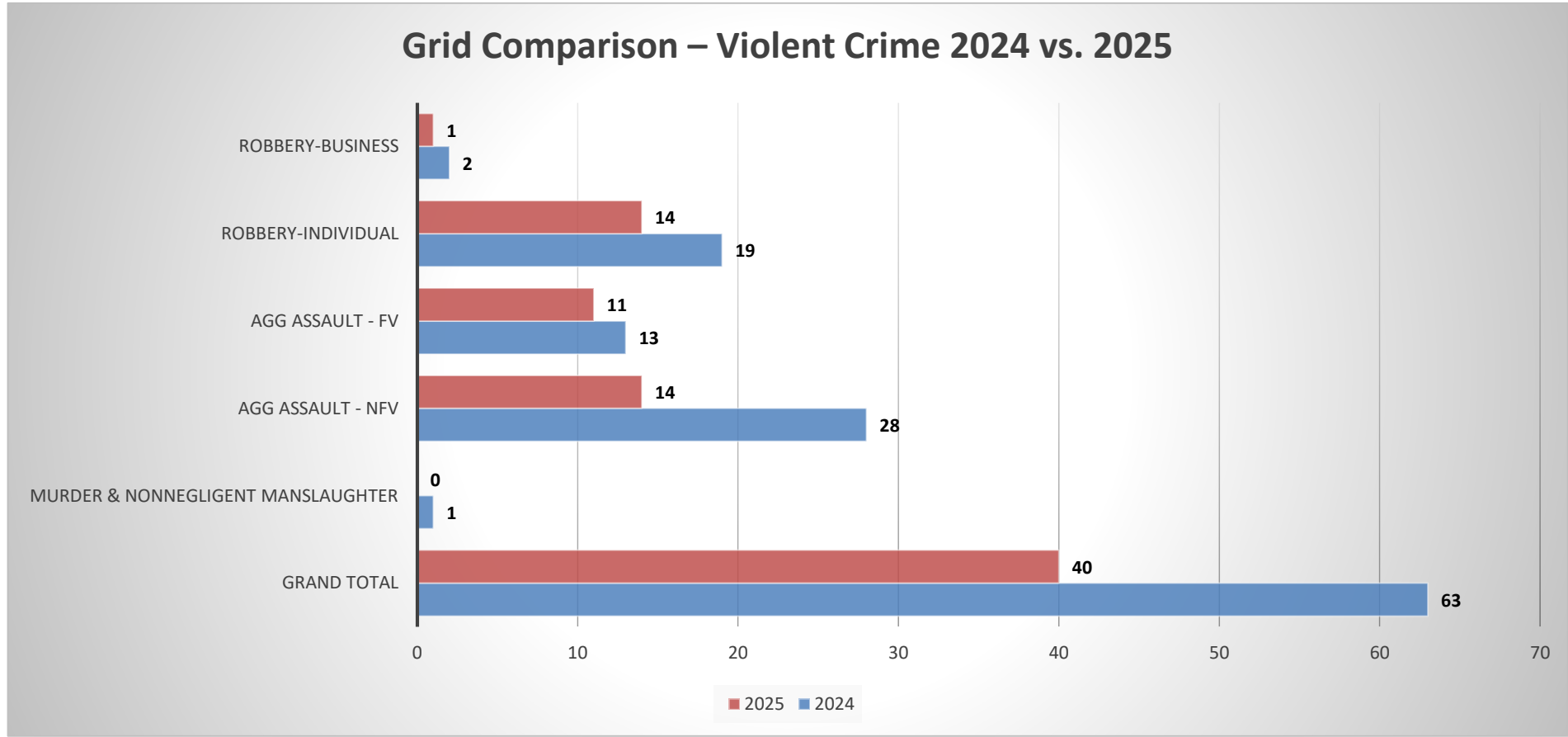

* August 1 – Sept 30

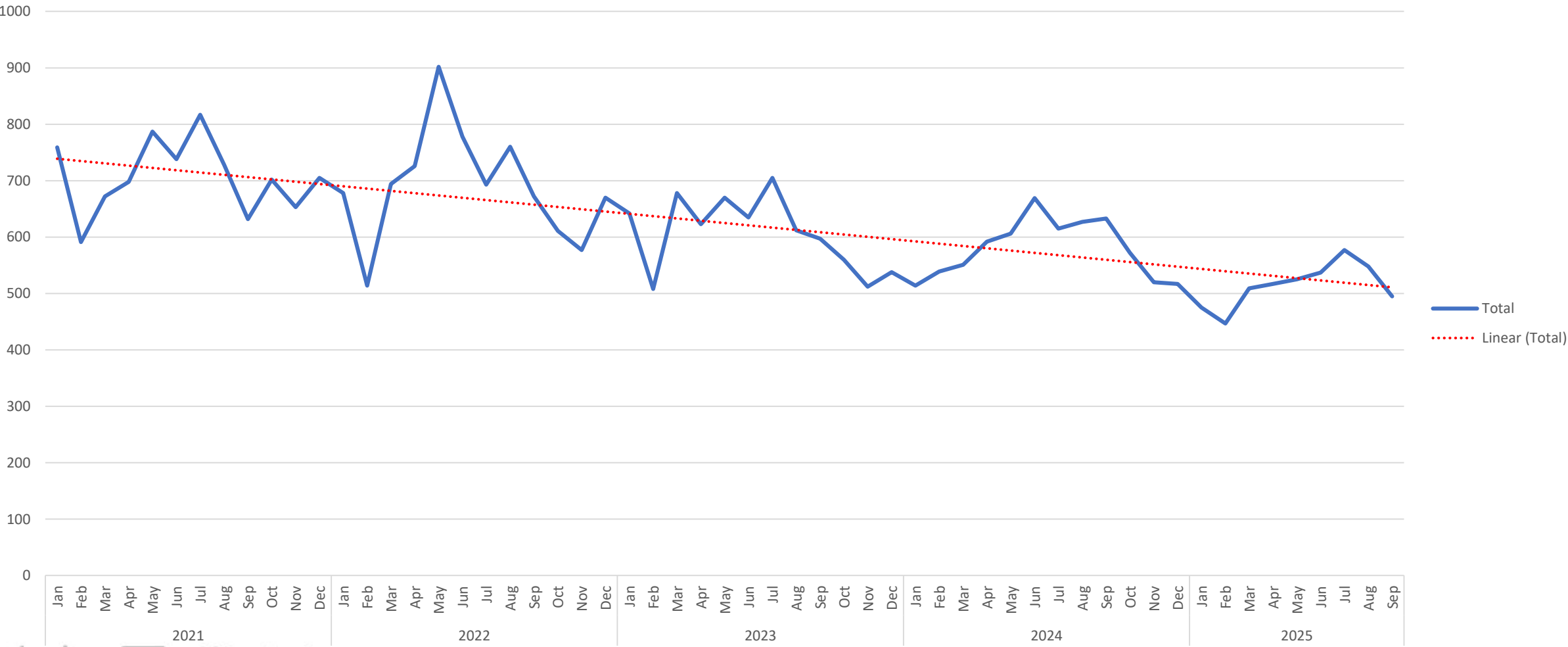

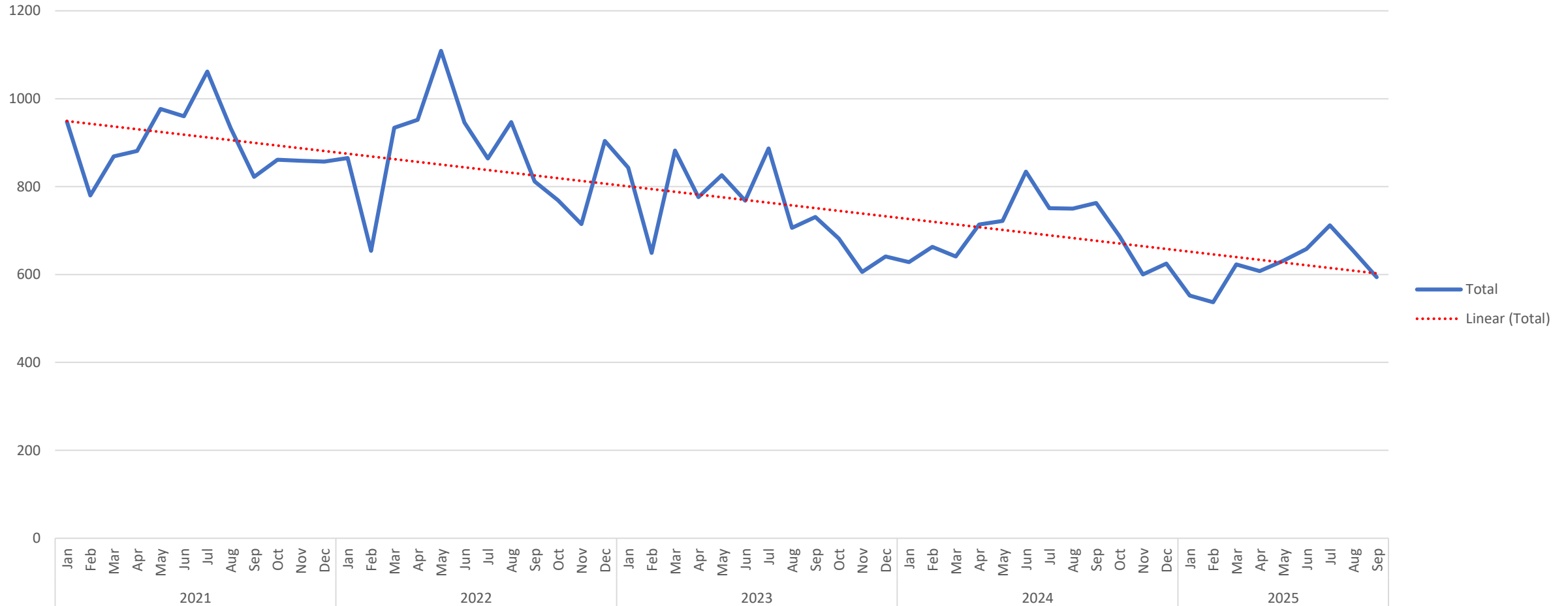
Incident Trendline

- 2025 Aggravated Assault Trend
- Aggravated Assaults **-14.33%** (661 Fewer Victims)
- Aggravated Assaults FV **-5.80%** (75 Fewer Victims)
- Aggravated Assaults NFV **-17.65%** (586 Fewer Victims)

VCPU FOCUSED DETERRENCE



- Focused Deterrence has 75 current clients.
- Focused Deterrence has compiled the client list for a fourth session.
- Custom Notification
 - Individual notifications to identified clients.
 - Meet the clients in the field.
- Focused Deterrence has identified dates for future Neighborhood Outreach.



CRIME PLAN – NEXT STEPS



- Phase 24 Grids – Began on October 1
 - Period 24 will deploy 40 grids
- Place Net work Investigations
 - Begins with a problem-focused investigation designed to uncover, identify, and disrupt the criminal networks that contribute to the violent crime in Dallas.
 - The PNI Board is made up with stakeholder government agencies such as, Office of Emergency Management & Crisis Response, Community Prosecution, Code Enforcement, and Parks and Recreation. The Board is designed to work together to address crime, and it's causes within the crime place network.
 - PNI Executive Board Meeting held with City, Community Partners, and UTSA researchers
- Focused Deterrence
 - We are constantly tracking the progress of our clients along with meeting with current partners and potential future partners.





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
