**WHEREAS**, on May 28, 2025, a public hearing was held to receive comments on the Proposed FY 2025-2026 HUD Consolidated Plan Budget for U.S Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Grant Funds by Resolution No. 25-0867; and

**WHEREAS**, on August 6, 2025, the City Council closed the May 28, 2025 public hearing to receive comments on the Proposed FY 2025-26 HUD Consolidated Plan Budget for HUD Grant Funds, and authorized final adoption of the FY 2025 HUD Consolidated Plan Budget for U.S. Department of HUD Grant Funds in a total estimated amount of \$29,886,873.00 with \$12,944,689.00 for Community Development Block Grant Funds (CDBG Funds) by Resolution No. 25-1185; and

**WHEREAS**, on August 6, 2025, the City Council authorized a portion of these CDBG Funds approved for the Violence Interrupters Program, now known as Youth Safety – Violence Interrupters (YS Program); and

**WHEREAS**, the YS Program will provide safety initiatives that target youth and their families in communities identified as high risk for violent crime through community-based youth safety initiatives through partnerships with community organizations; and

**WHEREAS**, on February 6, 2026, the Office of Housing and Community Empowerment (OHCE) issued a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA), HCE-2026-00029798 CDBG Youth Safety – Violence Interrupters Program, to solicit applications from eligible organizations to administer the YS Program; and

**WHEREAS**, following review and evaluation by a four-member panel, Lone Star Justice Alliance has been selected as the subrecipient to administer community-based youth safety initiatives through partnerships with community organizations.

**Now, Therefore,**

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DALLAS:**

**SECTION 1.** That the City Manager is hereby authorized to execute a one-year subrecipient agreement, approved as to form by the City Attorney, with Lone Star Justice Alliance ~~VC0000035318~~, in an amount not to exceed ~~\$600,000.00~~, \$300,000.00 in year one and \$300,000.00 for, ~~with one~~ one-year renewal option to administer the Youth Safety – Violence Interrupters Program on behalf of the Office of Housing and Community Empowerment.

**SECTION 2.** That the Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to disburse funds in an amount not to exceed \$300,000.00 to Lone Star Justice Alliance ~~VC0000035318~~, from the FY 2025-26 Community Development Block Grant Fund, Fund CD25, Department HCE, Unit 909L, Object 3070 under Contract No. HCE-2026-00030289, Vendor VC0000035318.

**SECTION 3.** That the Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to disburse funds in an amount not to exceed \$300,000.00 (subject to annual appropriations) to Lone Star Justice Alliance VC0000035318 from the FY 2026-27 Community Development Block Grant Fund, Fund CD26, Department HCE, Unit 108M, Object 3070 under Contract No. HCE-2026-00030289, Vendor VC0000035318.

**SECTION 34.** That the City Manager or his/her designee is authorized to execute change orders or amendments to the agreements, in an amount not to exceed a total of 25 percent of the original contract amount, or for time to commit and expend funds in a timely manner when necessary.

**SECTION 45.** That the City Manager is hereby authorized to reimburse to the granting agency any expenditure identified as ineligible. The City Manager shall notify the appropriate City Council Committee of expenditures identified as ineligible not later than 30 days after the reimbursement.

**SECTION 56.** That the City Manager or his/her designee is authorized to provide additional information, make adjustments, and take other actions related to the implementation of the grant as may be necessary to satisfy the HUD requirements.

**SECTION 67.** That the City Manager shall keep the appropriate City Council Committee informed of all monitoring reports no later than 30 days after the receipt of the report.

**SECTION 78.** That the acceptance of the contract for CDBG Funds be designated as Contract No. HCE-2026-00030289.

**SECTION 89.** That this resolution does not constitute a binding agreement upon the City or subject the City to any liability or obligation with respect to these transactions until such a time as the agreement and required documents are duly approved by all parties and executed.

**SECTION 910.** That this resolution shall take effect immediately from and after its passage in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the City of Dallas, and it is accordingly so resolved.
