**II. Purpose of the CPOB**

**(Chairman John Mark Davidson)**

- a. To help ensure this accountability, the Office of Community Police Oversight (OCPO) provides functional support and technical assistance to the CPOB.

**III. Public Comment / Open Microphone**

**(3 Minutes Per Person)**

- a. During the open microphone period at the beginning of each Board meeting, up to five people are allowed to speak. Those who wish to speak must register before the meeting begins. Speaker registration will open 15 minutes prior to the start of the Board meeting. Each person who speaks at a public meeting must state his or her name, address, and, if applicable, who he or she represents. The first five registered speakers will be called in the order they signed up to speak at the beginning of the meeting.

**Tiffanie Zaharko:** Was called by Chairman Davidson but not present.

**Tamera Huecherson:** Tamara Hutcherson raised two concerns regarding the Dallas Police Department operations. First, she questioned the lack of transparency surrounding the new police training academy planned for the UNT Dallas campus. She asked the City to disclose which law enforcement agencies, local, statewide, out-of-state, or international, will use the facility and for what purposes. She also expressed concern about rising project costs, unclear plans for a secondary training site, and funding being redirected from other departments despite community opposition and ties to Proposition U.

Second, Hutcherson questioned current police recruitment standards. She argued that loosening qualifications to quickly increase the number of officers undermines public safety. She shared a personal experience about an individual she believed showed troubling behavior yet graduated with the July 2024 DPD academy class. She emphasized that this raised concerns about screening, mental and psychological evaluations, and the type of individuals being hired.

She concluded by urging the Community Police Oversight Board to “ask the hard questions” of the police chief and department regarding both facility plans and recruitment practices.

**Brandon Friedman (D14):** Brandon Friedman asked whether the board has ever received a briefing from the city about the planned police training facility. After learning it had not been, he requested that a briefing be scheduled within the next few months so the board could understand the project. The Chair agreed and said it will be added to a future agenda.

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**Deloris Phillips:** Was called by Chairman Davidson but not present.

**Lynn Roth:** Lynn Roth requested a more thorough investigation into the death of her son, Walker, stating that DPD Detective Cody Clark conducted no meaningful follow-up after responding to the scene on September 27, 2024. She described evidence indicating an accidental, self-inflicted firearm discharge and raised concerns that no additional investigation or questioning occurred, despite unresolved questions such as building access through the attic. She also reported difficulty obtaining information afterward and being required to retrieve her son's firearm herself. Roth asked the board to review why the case received no further investigation.

**Billy Robertson:** Mr. Robinson, who is currently unhoused, reported that materials worth about \$6,000 were stolen from his storage units. He stated that despite repeatedly informing the DPD of the stolen items' location and who had them, detectives dismissed his concerns and did not follow up. Robinson said he personally located the items, saw them moved, and tried to provide evidence, but was repeatedly redirected or ignored. He asked why his case had not been investigated, even after he offered proof and information on how the theft occurred.

*Chairman Davidson proceeded to the next agenda item, as there were no further public comment participants.*

*The Chairman then asked the meeting to observe a moment of silence for **Officer Ryan Fritz, Badge No. 9151** from the northwest patrol division, who had passed away the week before due to Leukemia. The Chairman, on behalf of the board, offered his condolences to the family.*

*Chairman Davidson then advised the board that agenda items "V" and "VI" would be swapped due to a guest attending the meeting.*

#### **V. (VI ) Briefing on the Texas Open Meetings Act (TOMA) (City Attorney's Office)** **Chairman Davidson** invited Assistant City Attorney, Daniel Moore, to present the briefing on TOMA.

**Assistant City Attorney Daniel Moore** presented an overview of the Texas Open Meetings Act (TOMA) as it applies to the City Council and all city boards and commissions, including the CPOB. He explained that meetings must be open to the public, properly noticed on the city website and bulletin board, and that actions taken in violation of the law may be voided. Moore defined a meeting as any written or verbal deliberation involving a quorum, and warned against "walking quorums," where private or sequential communications result in secret decision-making. He outlined notice

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requirements now posted at least three business days in advance and rules for hybrid meetings, public speakers, voting procedures, and closed sessions. He emphasized that responses to public speakers must be limited unless placed on a future agenda, and that minutes are required as public records.

*Chairman Davidson opened the segment for any questions or discussion.*

During the Q&A, board members sought clarification on how quorum, voting rules, agenda limits, and the City Attorney's authority apply to the Community Police Oversight Board (CPOB) under Texas law and City of Dallas rules.

- **Leaving the Room & Quorum:** Moore confirmed that if exactly seven members (the minimum for quorum) are present and one leaves, the board no longer has quorum.
- **Voting Rules:** According to the Dallas City Code (Chapter 8), board members are not permitted to abstain. If a member is absent during a vote, their vote is automatically counted as "yes." This rule is created by the City of Dallas, not the Texas Open Meetings Act (TOMA).
- **How Quorum is Calculated:** Quorum equals a majority of the board. With 12 seated members, the quorum is 7; if all 15 seats were filled, the quorum would be 8.
- **Social Gatherings:** Board members may gather socially—even with a quorum present—provided they do not discuss official board business. Conversations about board matters are only TOMA concern once a quorum actively discusses official issues.
- **Agenda Requirements & Specificity:** The agenda must be "sufficiently specific," especially on matters of public interest. The more significant the topic, the more clearly it must be listed. If the wording is vague, the board cannot legally exceed the scope of what the agenda allows.
- **Who Decides Whether Discussion is Allowed?** The City Attorney advises the board on legal risks. Under City Code § 8-28, the board must follow the City Attorney's legal opinion unless a court rules otherwise. Members may request reconsideration from higher city attorneys, but they cannot demand it.
- **Consequences for Ignoring Legal Advice:** If the board disregards guidance and violates TOMA, outside parties can sue. Civil actions, injunctions, mandamus orders, and even criminal penalties (potentially brought by the District Attorney) may apply. **Moore agreed to research whether individual board members could personally face liability.**

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Overall, the discussion emphasized that the City Attorney's role is to protect the City from legal exposure. At the same time, board members aim to represent the public interests that may not always align but must legally operate within TOMA and the city's rules.

**VI. (V) Overview of Dallas Police Department's 911 Emergency Communications Center by Assistant Director Robert Uribe**

- a. Overview of 24/7 emergency communication and dispatch, including citywide call distribution, support for high-priority and critical incidents, and ensuring proper resource allocation and officer safety.

**Policy Analyst Siara Obasuyi** introduced DPD Assistant Director Robert Uribe, who would be delivering the presentation regarding the Emergency Communications Center. Obasuyi explained that community concerns and complaints frequently focus on police response times. To better understand 911 operations, from call intake and prioritization to officer dispatch, the office invited the 911 Emergency Communications Center to present to the board. She stated the goal is to educate board members so they can better inform their communities, and she noted that continued collaboration will help improve public understanding and support more accurate, efficient emergency responses. She then turned the presentation over to Assistant Director Robert Uribe.

**Assistant Director Robert Uribe:** Provided an overview of the 911 Communications Bureau, explaining that it operates 24/7 as the city's primary point of contact for emergency calls. He described the bureau's responsibilities, including answering and prioritizing over 1.8 million annual calls, dispatching officers, supporting critical incidents, and handling phone and online police reports. Uribe outlined how calls are categorized by priority, clarified the bureau's role in coordinating resources, and highlighted additional duties such as managing secure data access, warrant and record systems, and national law enforcement communications. He also discussed staffing, ongoing training, and technology modernization efforts aimed at improving response efficiency and public trust.

*Chairman Davidson opened the segment for questions.*

During the Q&A, **J. Victor Lander (D8)** asked whether the department measures response times by priority level. Assistant Director Uribe confirmed they review response times "daily, weekly, monthly, and yearly." When asked for the average Priority 1 response time, Uribe reported 10.9 minutes, down from 11.38 minutes last year.

**Brandon Friedman (D14)** requested the same for Priority 2; Uribe stated that the current average is 96.3 minutes, an improvement from 103 minutes last year.

**Mary Ellen Smith (D11)** inquired whether routing calls to fire or police departments reduce 911 call volume and whether traffic complaints should be directed through 911. Uribe clarified that while multi-agency responses are sometimes necessary, traffic congestion alone does not merit a high priority, stating, "If traffic is slow... that doesn't outweigh stabbings or shootings."

**Vice Chair, Ozzie Smith (D1)** requested response-time data broken down by region, citing concerns about slower service in southern areas. Uribe replied that he could

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provide the data and emphasized that the priority level is based on incident severity, not location, though geography and call volume influence staffing needs.

**Jonathan Maples (D2)** requested data comparing arrests resulting from 911 calls versus those initiated by police. Uribe agreed to explore whether that breakdown can be produced.

**J. Victor Lander (D8)** then asked if future shared data could be broken out by council district rather than just police division. Uribe responded that they would work to provide both.

Finally, **Vice Chair Smith (D1)** asked about planned technology upgrades. Uribe explained that upgrades to the Computer-Aided Dispatch (CAD) and Records Management System (RMS) are in contract negotiation, with implementation expected within 18–24 months, along with modernization of the 911 system to enable improved location tracking and potential tools, such as drones, for first responders.

*Chairman Davidson thanked Uribe, noting the Board strong interest in improving response times.*

*Chairman acknowledges board member Timothy Jackson (D7) requested that he be marked as present for the meeting at 6:49 pm.*

## **VII. Follow-Up on Request for the DPD Unarmed Aerial Squad (Drones) and Data (Executive Assistant Chief of Police Monique Alex)**

The Chairman invites Executive Assistant Chief Monique Alex to come forward for a follow-up regarding questions raised at a previous meeting. Chief Alex introduces Assistant Chief Israel Herrera as a new member of the internal affairs and shares a brief overview of his background and experience. The Chief stated that one of the three command staff will be present at the CPOB meetings, either Major Salas, Assistant Chief Herrera, or herself, from this point on.

Assistant Chief Monique Alex provided follow-up information from the previous meeting, noting that three outstanding questions remained and additional inquiries were received from Board Member Higgins on the 5th. Those questions were assigned to staff and are still being processed. To give the Board a more precise and more detailed understanding of Facial Recognition, Flock, and Drone operations, Assistant Chief Alex arranged for each unit's commander to be present at the next meeting on the 9th.

She then addressed the follow-up items promised from last month:

**Flock Data Access:** Private companies cannot access DPD's Flock data. They may share their own camera data with DPD, but do not have access to DPD systems.

**Flock Camera Distribution:** She provided counts by patrol division:

- Central: 88
- Northeast: 111
- Southeast: 98
- Southwest: 119
- North Central: 78

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- Northwest: 90
  - South Central: 105

(Most cameras are fixed; some mobile units exist.)

**Offenses Against Appointed Board Members:** After reviewing policy, SOPs, and the City Charter, DPD found no specific provisions addressing criminal offenses committed against appointed board members. She noted that Criminal Intelligence handles similar matters for elected officials, but no equivalent policy exists for appointed board members.

*The Chairman then opened the segment for questions.*

**Vice Chair Smith (D1)** asked for clarification on the policy regarding Flock data sharing. Their concern was whether the rule preventing DPD from sharing Flock data with private entities is simply a standard practice or a firmly established policy that could only be changed through a formal process, such as a vote.

**Chief M. Alex:** Chief M. Alex clarified that DPD does not share its Flock camera data with any private entity or third party, although private entities may share their data with DPD. Vice Chair Smith asked whether this restriction is contractual or an internal policy and if it could change under a new vendor. Chief Alex confirmed that the restriction is an internal DPD policy. With no further questions, the discussion concluded.

*Chairman Davidson and Board Member Walter Changa Higgins (D3) thanked the Chief for the partnership and transparency.*

## **VIII. Internal Affairs Division (IAD) Report (Major Juan Salas)**

- a. The Internal Affairs Division (IAD) provides briefings on the Dallas Police Department and IAD activities, and continues collaboration and partnerships with the OCPO and CPOB.

Chairman Davidson introduced the Internal Affairs Division (IAD) report. Major Juan Salas stated that IAD continues to “strengthen the commitment to transparency and accountability” and addressed prior questions about the property room. He confirmed that evidence retention follows legal requirements, items have destruction timelines, and owners receive notice before property is destroyed. Property seized from one person but owned by another can be reclaimed if the true owner can prove ownership, such as with a receipt. Items tied to serious cases (e.g., sexual assault or murder) “are held indefinitely.”

Major Salas invited all board members to tour IAD, noting they may come individually or in small groups. Chairman Davidson asked about scheduling, and Major Salas confirmed members may contact him directly.

Board members asked follow-up questions about how property is destroyed; Salas clarified that drugs are incinerated but was unsure about the disposal of other items. In response to Ms. Simon’s question about reclaiming mis-tagged property (e.g., a phone seized during an arrest), Salas explained that the owner must provide proof, such as a receipt.

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CPOB Board Coordinator Waldir Guerrero gave a reminder for members speak into their microphones for the benefit of virtual attendees. With no further questions, Chairman Davidson thanked Major Salas for the report and the invitation to tour IAD.

## **IX. Office of Community Police Oversight Staff Report**

### **a. Directors' Report**

**(Director Michele Andre)**

Director Michele Andre provided a brief update. She announced that a new access-control system has been installed at the OCPO office, allowing visitors to ring the office directly and improving operational efficiency. Additional security enhancements are underway.

She encouraged board members to share district events where OCPO presence would be helpful and noted a detailed engagement summary prepared by Senior Outreach Specialist Alma Perez.

Andre reported that staff attended the NACOLE Annual Conference in Minneapolis, gaining insight into trauma-informed practices, civilian oversight trends, and national challenges, including the impact of political influence on civil rights cases. She highlighted a keynote by Valerie Castile and noted the value of sessions on oversight in relation to ICE, state preemption, and reform strategies.

She thanked Communications Advisor Waldir Guerrero for maintaining office operations during staff travel.

Director Andre also updated the board on transparency initiatives: finalizing updates to the online complaint and commendation form, preparing to launch the online independent review form, and developing an internal engagement heat map with DBI. Work continues with ITS to embed the Accountability & Transparency Dashboard into the OCPO website. The dashboard will show complaint types, demographics, outcomes, and commendations received by DPD officers. She concluded her report with no further updates.

The Chair noted that there were no questions for Director Andre and offered a public acknowledgment of Board Coordinator Waldir Guerrero for stepping in to support the meeting's technological needs during the recent City ITS staff reductions. The Chair highlighted that Waldir's efforts have kept meetings running smoothly, despite this not being part of his official duties, and expressed appreciation to the entire office for "stepping up."

**Jennifer King (D10):** Board Member Ms. King expressed appreciation for the upcoming transparency dashboard, stating she is "excited" about its launch. She emphasized that improving public understanding of the office and board is essential, noting that their work still feels like a "best kept secret" in Dallas. She thanked Director Andre and her team for their efforts to increase awareness of civilian police oversight.

### **Special Investigator Report**

**(Investigator Greg Huff)**



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**Chairman Davidson** introduced Investigator Greg Huff, explaining that the board would review five new cases to determine whether each should proceed to an independent investigation by the Office of Community Police Oversight. He clarified that no investigations have been completed this month due to the shortened schedule and the NACOLE conference.

Davidson outlined the process: Investigator Huff will give a brief overview of each case, the board may ask clarifying questions and then vote on whether to authorize an independent investigation. He also acknowledged members of the public present and accommodated the speaker, Mr. Wilkinson, allowing him to provide a three-minute statement related to Case #2 before the board hears Huff's briefing.

**i. Consideration of Independent Review Request**

**1. Case No. DR2025-084 Michael Polsky**

- a. **Action:** Vote on whether the OCPO should conduct an independent investigation into Case No. DR2025-084 Michael Polsk.

*After investigator Huff shared the case briefing, the board proceeded with questions and discussion, followed by a vote.*

**Motion: J. Victor Lander (D8)** makes a motion for the office to conduct an investigation.

**Second: Jonathan Maples (D2)** seconds the motion.

**Vote:** [Yes] D1, D2, D3, D7, D8, D10, D13, D14, [No] D5, D11, D15

**Motion Passes**

**2. Case No. NI2025-0757 Senrick Wilkerson**

- a. **Action:** Vote on whether the OCPO should conduct an independent investigation into Case No. NI2025-0757 Senrick Wilkerson

**Senrick Wilkerson commented:** Wilkerson addressed the board, describing his long-standing claim that he was wrongfully convicted of rape charges. He stated that he was never arrested or arraigned, alleging that arrest dates were fabricated and that no arrest or offense report exists, despite the case proceeding to trial. He explained that he has been required to register as a sex offender for 15 years for charges he asserts "don't exist."

Mr. Wilkerson referenced documents and a self-published book supporting his allegations, stating that his publisher conducted its own review. He also claimed prosecutorial misconduct, naming the former assistant district attorney involved. He asked the board to initiate an independent investigation, emphasizing the emotional and personal toll of his experience. Chairman Davidson thanked Mr. Wilkerson for his comments.

*The board proceeded with questions and discussion regarding the case with Investigator Huff, then voted.*

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**Motion: J. Victor Lander (D8)** moves for the OCPO to conduct a full investigation  
**Second: Jonathan Maples (D2)** seconds the motion.  
**Vote:** [Yes] D1, D2, D3, D7, D8, D10, D11, D13, D14, D15 [No] D5  
**Motion Passes**

**3. Case No. NI2025-0704 Billy Robertson**

- a. **Action:** Vote on whether the OCPO should conduct an independent investigation into Case No. NI2025-0704 Billy Robertson

**Billy Robertson commented:** Mr. Robertson shared that he has been homeless following a fourth DWI case from around 20–22 years ago. He explained that he had been saving his belongings and money to get back on his feet, but his items stored in a storage unit were stolen. Despite informing the police of the location, he received no assistance and later learned that his case had been suspended. He stated that he personally witnessed his belongings being removed from the storage unit and placed in a car and expressed that something had gone “terribly wrong with the procedure.” Chairman Davidson thanked Mr. Robertson for his comments.

*The board proceeded with questions and discussion regarding the case with Investigator Huff, then voted.*

**Motion: Timothy Jackson (D7)** moves for the office to conduct the investigation  
**Second: Jennifer King (D10)** seconds the motion.  
**Vote:** Unanimous  
**Motion Passes**

**Mary Ellen Smith (D11)** requested access to a video submitted in a case. Chairman Davidson confirmed that the board would have access if it were part of the investigation.

**Director Andre** explained that a link to the case file, including police reports and available information, is usually shared via City of Dallas email, and personal emails cannot access SharePoint. She stated, “We’ll reshare the case file when it comes back up for a vote on the agenda.”

**Chairman Davidson** clarified that the board would receive an email with access to all relevant videos prior to the case being considered again. Investigator Huff added that he “normally uploads the relevant videos.”

**4. Case No. NI2025-0713 Lynn Roth**

- a. **Action:** Vote on whether the OCPO should conduct an independent investigation into Case No. NI2025-0713 Lynn Roth

**Lynn Roth commented** that her current husband, a former DPD officer now working in Fort Worth, personally knew the crime scene detective who responded to the incident involving her son. She stated that both the crime scene and homicide detectives told her husband they had never seen a situation like her son’s case in their years of experience. Ms. Roth reported that Detective Clark later expressed frustration

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that her husband had spoken with the investigators and told her he had discussed the matter with his superiors. According to Ms. Roth, Detective Clark warned that he could have her husband arrested for official oppression and interference in the investigation, even though she and her husband were only asking for a thorough and accurate investigation based on all available evidence. Chairman Davidson thanked Ms. Roth for her comments.

*The board proceeded with questions and discussion regarding the case with Investigator Huff, then voted.*

**Motion: Brandon Friedman (D14)** moves for the office to conduct an investigation

**Second: J. Victor Lander (D8)** seconds the motion.

**Vote:** [Yes] D1, D2, D3, D5, D7, D8, D10, D11, D14, D15 [No] D13

**Motion Passes**

#### **5. Case No. NI2025-0643 Daria Plautz**

- a. **Action:** Vote on whether the OCPO should conduct an independent investigation into Case No. NI2025-0643 Daria Plautz

*Investigator Huff proceeded with the case briefing regarding this case. Then, after the board asked questions and held a discussion, the case was brought to a vote.*

**Motion: Julia Simon (D13)** moves for the office to conduct an investigation

**Second: J. Victor Lander (D8)** seconds the motion.

**Vote:** [No] D1, D2, D3, D5, D7, D8, D10, D11, D13, D14, D15 [Yes]

**Motion fails and does not pass.**

The office will not move forward with an independent investigation.

During the vote, **J. Victor Lander (D8)** asked Assistant City Attorney Moore a point of procedure regarding whether he is allowed to vote "No" on a motion he has made. Moore responded, "You can vote no, but you cannot speak against it in debate, but you can vote 'No'".

**Brandon Friedman (D14)** commented on the administrative process for reviewing cases, noting that board members currently have less information than in the past: "The packets no longer contain the information we used to have. And we're not seeing the videos... it seems right now, like we're a lot more blind to these cases." He explained that this lack of readily available information has led to a higher number of requests for independent investigations, increasing the workload for OCPO. He suggested that reviewing packets and videos in advance or presenting relevant portions during meetings could "alleviate a lot of this uncertainty."

**Chairman Davidson** agreed, acknowledging the point and stating they would discuss improvements for the next meeting. Friedman also offered to provide further context after the meeting: "I can talk to anybody after the meeting about how we used to do stuff."

1. October DPD Monthly Arrest by Council District Reports

## **2. October External Administrative Complaints Reports**

Chairman Davidson asked the board to review the Monthly reports and to raise any questions or comments.

**Jonathan Maples (D2)** requested data comparing arrests resulting from 911 calls versus those initiated by officers. Director Andre confirmed the request, asking whether Maples preferred the information broken down by council district or patrol division; Maples responded that “whichever one is more convenient” would work. Maples also clarified he only needed data from “the last couple of years.” He referenced earlier comments about higher arrest numbers in the Northeast Patrol Division, noting that this would correspond to areas such as Five Points and that south. Director Andre acknowledged and confirmed the request.

### **b. Community Engagement Report (Sr. Outreach Specialist Alma Perez)**

#### **i. National Association for Civilian Oversight of Law Enforcement (NACOLE) 31<sup>st</sup> Annual Conference in Minneapolis, Minnesota**

1. OCPO Staff Director Andre, Investigator Huff, Policy Analyst Obasuyi, Senior Outreach Specialist Perez, and Executive Assistant Russell attended NACOLE's 31<sup>st</sup> Annual Conference, where they gathered with oversight professionals, advocates, law enforcement leaders, policymakers, and scholars from around the world. The theme, *'Reckoning and Resilience in the Post-George Floyd Era,'* highlighted pressing issues in police oversight, focusing on transparency, accountability, and public trust.

**Senior Outreach Specialist Alma Perez** presented the October community engagement report, highlighting a busy month focused on strengthening community relationships and promoting transparency and accountability.

She reported that OCPO participated in numerous major events, including the 4th Annual D Lolas 5K Cancer Awareness Walk and Health & Safety Fair, which drew over 2,000 attendees and featured partnerships with DPD's Northwest Division, Community Affairs, and multiple health and wellness organizations. OCPO staff distributed educational materials and discussed the complaint and commendation process with residents.

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Perez noted OCPO's participation in National Night Out across Dallas, where staff engaged with residents, listened to their concerns, and shared information about the agency's oversight. Additional October activities included Hispanic Heritage Month celebrations in Districts 4 and 14, as well as a Trunk-or-Treat event in District 12.

She also attended the NACOLE 31st Annual Conference in Minneapolis, emphasizing its value for professional development. She highlighted a key session titled "Because Kids Are Not Miniature Adults," which focused on youth-centered policing accountability and offered insights that will inform OCPO's policy and outreach work.

Perez concluded by stating OCPO will continue expanding outreach efforts in November to strengthen trust and community engagement across Dallas.

**Jonathan Maples (D2)** inquired whether any board members had been invited to the NACOLE Conference.

**Jonathan Maples (D2)** asked who from OCPO attended the NACOLE conference. Staff confirmed that the Director, Policy Analyst Obasuyi, Investigator Greg Huff, Executive Assistant Kamona, and Senior Outreach Specialist Alma Perez attended; "everybody but Waldir."

Maples questioned why no Board Members attended. Staff deferred to the Director, and Chairman Davidson cited budget restrictions. Lighthearted comments followed regarding Waldir staying behind, with Perez clarifying he volunteered not to attend.

Perez noted NACOLE offers a scholarship program, though the process is unclear; staff will investigate whether Board Members could benefit.

Maples asked about bringing the conference to Texas. Director Andre shared that OCPO is exploring hosting NACOLE in Dallas for 2027, noting it was previously held in Fort Worth. Jennifer King (D10) expressed interest in helping host if it comes to Dallas.

Perez stated she could not recall the upcoming location, and Director Andre confirmed it will be in Kentucky next year.

Chairman Davidson thanked Perez and expressed enthusiasm for future NACOLE conferences.

**X. Community Police Oversight Board Reports/ Briefings**

**a. Chairman's Report**

**(Chairman John Mark Davidson)**

- i. The Chair provides an overview of meeting protocols, including the use of district identifiers and microphones for recording meeting minutes. Reminder for the board to sign their appointments so subcommittees can begin forming.

**Chairman Davidson** provided three key updates:

**Meeting Procedures:**

- Board members were reminded to speak directly into microphones, so comments are clearly heard and recorded.
- Members should state their name and district before speaking to ensure accurate attribution in the meeting minutes and audio transcript.

**Subcommittee Reappointments:**

- Several subcommittee seats are now vacant due to expired board appointments.
- The Board will begin the process of reappointing members and completing subcommittee assignments.

**Overview of the Four Subcommittees (all currently with vacancies):**

- Policy Subcommittee: Reviews DPD and City policies; recommend policy changes to City Council.
- Rules Subcommittee: Focuses on improving board meeting procedures and efficiency.
- Outreach Subcommittee: Works with Senior Outreach Specialist Alma Perez on community engagement initiatives.
- Training Subcommittee: Ensures Board Members remain informed and up to date on required trainings.
- Members interested in joining a subcommittee should notify the Chair or the Director.

**Pending Official Appointments**

- Several Board Members—including the Chair—are still **awaiting official confirmation** from their City Council representative or the Mayor.

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- Members currently shown with a **red “H”** in recent communications are serving as Holdovers until a formal appointment is made.

### **Upcoming Board Retreat / Training**

- The OCPO plans to hold the annual CPOB **retreat in January**, pending completion of all reappointments and vacant seat filings.
- The Chair clarified that the “retreat” is a **full-board training session**, not a leisure event.

*Board members gave some suggestions regarding the retreat. Chairman Davidson went on to the next agenda item, reviewing the next meeting dates.*

### **b. Upcoming CPOB Meetings**

SUBJECT **Dallas Police Department Priority Call Response Time Data**

During the November 10, 2025, meeting, several members requested additional information following the presentation from the Dallas Police Department (DPD) 911 Emergency Communications Center. The Board asked that call data be broken down by council district and/or patrol division, including total call volume and priority level. This memo provides the requested information and offers additional context to support the Board's ongoing evaluation of the DPD's emergency response operations.

The data provided by the 911 Emergency Communications Center summarizes DPD Patrol Division Response times for Fiscal Years (FY) 2023 through 2025. The tables below highlight the highest-volume call priority in each patrol division, along with the corresponding average response times. These figures reflect initial officer dispatch and arrival on scene for Priority 1 (emergency) and Priority 2 (urgent) calls.

# Automated License Plate Recognition Program

## Overview



- Captures license plates and vehicle characteristics — not names, faces, or driver images.
- Cameras face only public rights-of-way, never private residences or property.
- System retains anonymized vehicle data — plate number, time, date, location, and camera ID only.
- Data is automatically purged after the retention period unless associated with an active investigation.



# Automated License Plate Recognition Program Overview



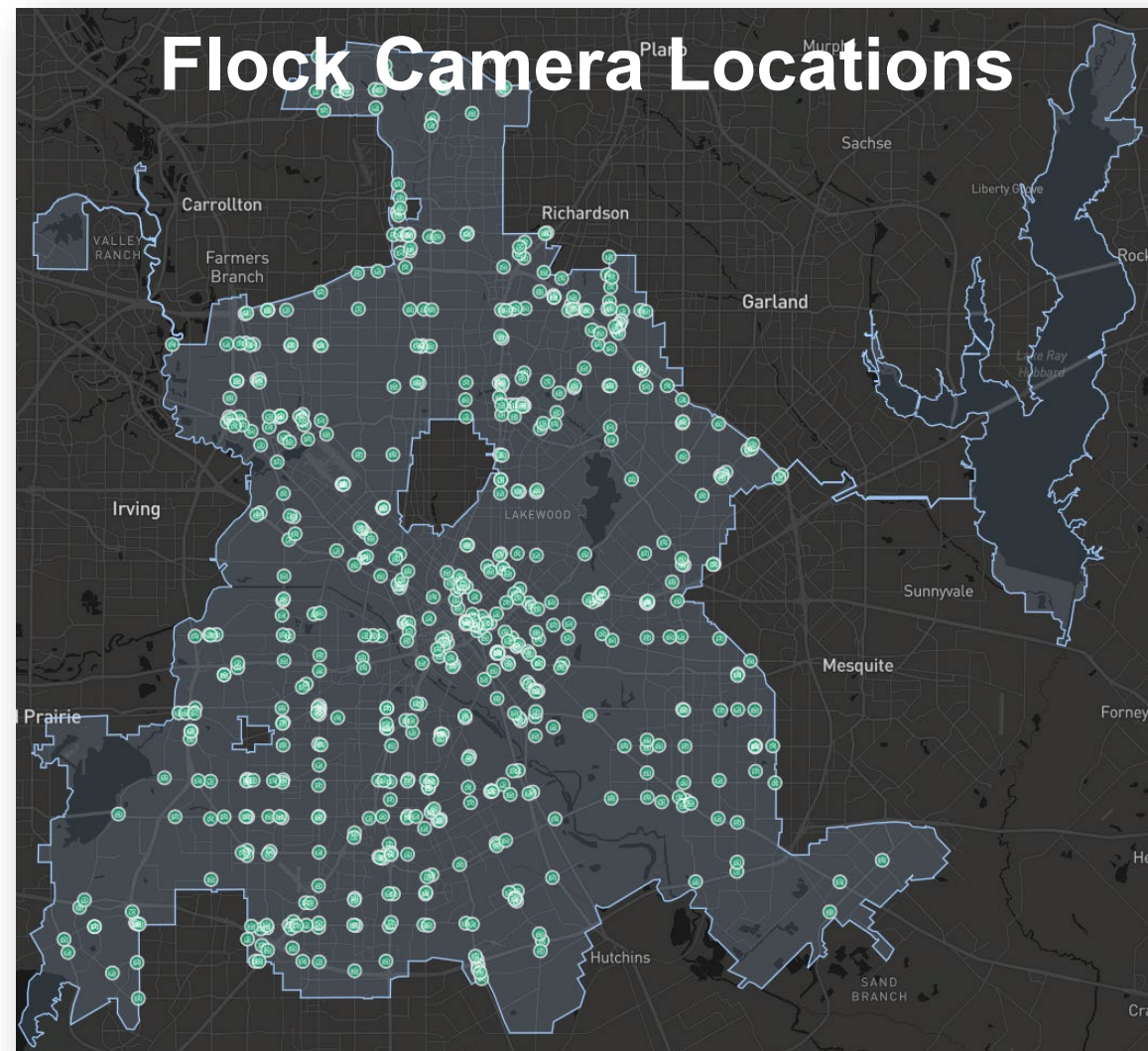
- Only trained and authorized personnel may access ALPR data.
- Data is never sold or shared with private entities; access is limited to ONLY authorized law-enforcement partners.
  - US Postal Service Inspector
- Every search requires a reason for search and case number.
- All user actions are logged and reviewable for compliance with department policy, state and federal laws.
- Policy reviews ensure compliance with local ordinances, state law, and federal standards.



# Automated License Plate Recognition Program Overview



- Locations are based on crime patterns and investigative value
- Priority placement along high-crime corridors and areas with repeat offender activity
- Supports deterrence, investigations, and rapid identification of vehicles tied to criminal activity.

- Enhance investigative efficiency by quickly identifying suspects and linked offenses.

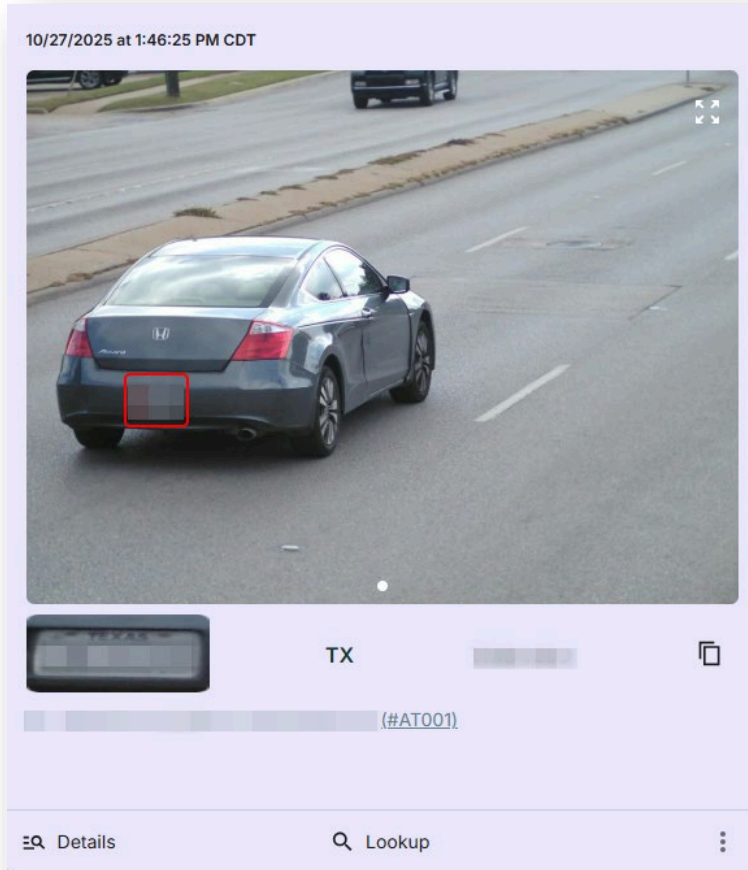

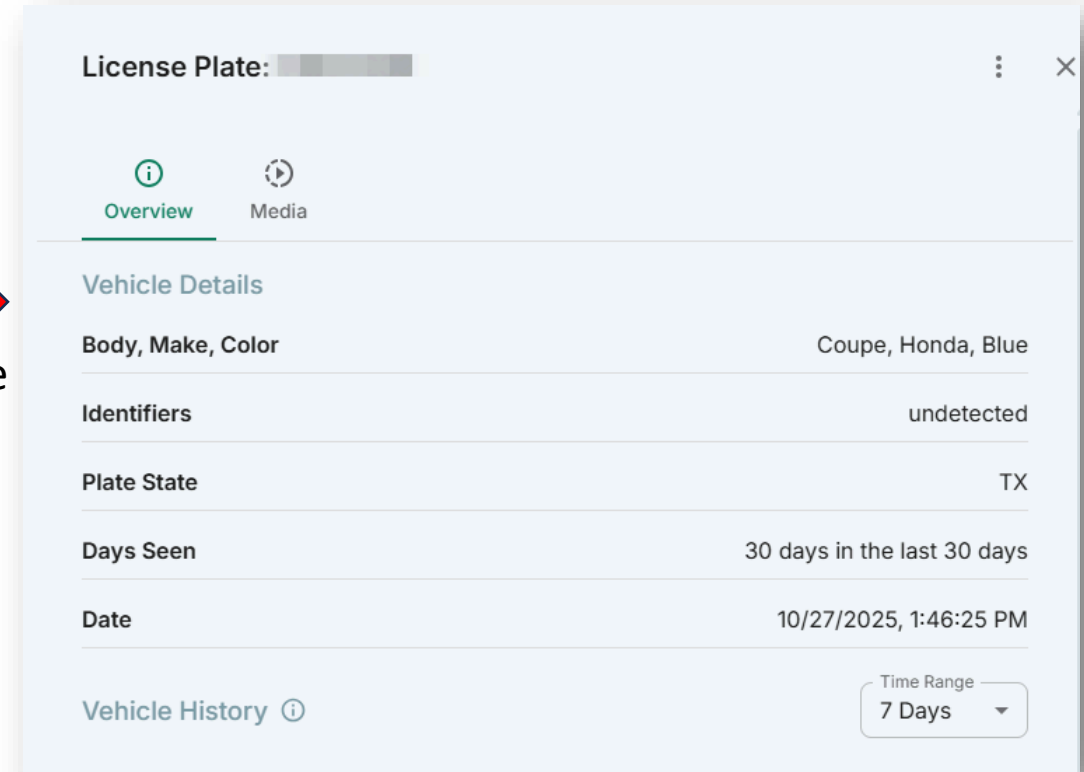

- NCIC HOTLIST: A National database maintained by FBI and Texas DPS
- CUSTOM HOTLIST: Internal platform database maintained by DPD for investigative purposes
- RETENTION:
  - Reads = 365 days
  - Hits = 365 days
  - \*Data automatically purged after retention period
- Reads = 1,491,728,786
- This represents only a fraction of vehicles, approximately 8%, that pass an ALPR camera within the City of Dallas.
- Hotlist Reads = 869,975



# How ALPR Helps Prevent Violent Crime – Overview



- **July 25, 2024**
  - I-75 and Walnut Hill Ln.
  - DPD received a Flock ALPR alert for a stolen vehicle
  - Officers located the stolen red GMC pickup parked within a nearby apartment complex.
  - Four Individuals sitting in the GMC
  - When contacted, the driver intentionally rammed two police vehicles





# How ALPR Helps Prevent Violent Crime – Indicators of Criminal Preparation



- **Stolen Vehicle** – frequently utilized by offenders to avoid identification
- **Backed-in stolen vehicle** — consistent with offenders positioning for quick escape after a crime.
- **Facial coverings & gloves in 90°F heat** — conceal identity and prevent evidence transfer.
- **Four modified firearms recovered** — shows intent to use or readiness for violent confrontation.
- **One suspect wanted for Capital Murder** (double homicide, March 2024) — presence of a high-risk, violent offender within the group.



# How ALPR Helps Prevent Violent Crime – Analytical Assessment



- The suspects' actions mirrored known pre-offense behaviors commonly associated with robbery and home-invasion offenses.
- The totality of the circumstances aligned with historical crime behavior patterns for violent offenses, indicating active preparation rather than incidental activity.



# How ALPR Helps Prevent Violent Crime – Analytical Determination



- A real-time ALPR alert for “only” a routine stolen vehicle prompted an immediate police response.
- While law enforcement cannot predict crimes before they occur, evidence indicates officers intervened and prevented a violent offense from taking place.

# UAS Defined



- An Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS), commonly known as a drone, is a classification of aircraft designated by the Federal Aviation Administration
- Generally, the system includes a fixed or rotary-wing aircraft and a Ground Control Station (GCS)
- The system must be operated in compliance with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regulation and statutory requirements

# Operational Requirements



- FAA Operational Requirement
  - Below 400 feet outside flight requirement
  - Line of sight maintained by a Visual Observer
    - Indoor flights are not subject to these restrictions.
- Monthly reporting of “Certificate of Authorization” flights within restricted airspace
- Post a report every 2 years regarding the agency's use or operation of unmanned aircraft on the agency's publicly accessible Internet website or, if the agency does not have a publicly accessible Internet website, otherwise make the report available to the public. The report will include the following.
  - Date, Time, Operational Purpose, Timeframe, Location

# Privacy Concerns



- Texas Privacy Act, Government Code 423 is the baseline for departmental policy
  - Requires that video or images will only be recorded if one of the following criteria are met:
    - Felony
    - Life or Death Circumstances
    - Warrant Executions
    - Consent
- Citizen privacy is protected through data retention and warrant requirements prior to private property operations.



# Next Steps



- Initial deployment of the Tethered UAS for the rapid visual access needs of special events and critical incidents.
- Drones as a First Responder (DFR) plans are being developed to supplement Air Support, etc.
- Integrate UAS into additional units to enhance public safety and transparency
- Develop annual department refresher training

# Investigative Facial Recognition Technology Overview



- Investigative facial recognition technology is a means of ascertaining and confirming an individual's identity
- Utilizes open-source information as comparison images
  - Historically used sketches then pictures on news outlets
- Employs artificial intelligence to identify/compare millions of images
- Used by police agencies across the country

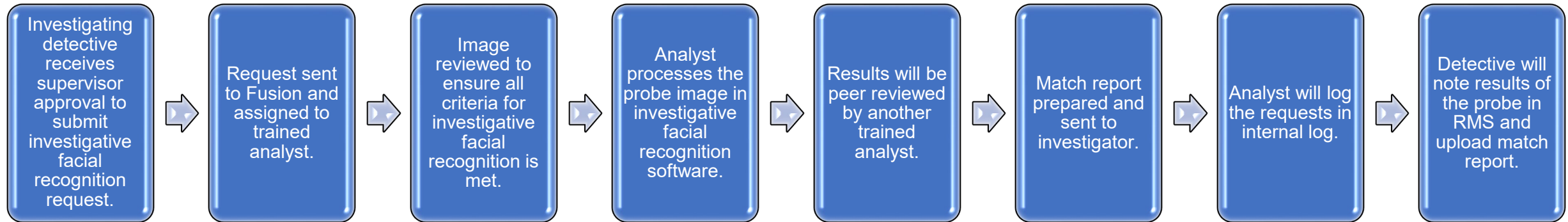

# Overcoming Concerns



Concerns about inconsistencies in identification:

- investigative facial recognition technology will not be used as a positive identification or as probable cause for arrest without additional corroboration/investigation
- extensive 32-hour training of all analysts, with components around implicit bias and how to avoid misidentification.
- peer review of all results is required.





# Overcoming Concerns



Privacy concerns, data collection, and retention

- Data collection is governed by 28 CFR Part 23 and program manager will oversee compliance
- Retention policy follows the submitting investigative unit's S.O.P., per Texas CCP, Art 39.14 and State of Texas retention schedule for records of public safety agencies.



# Overcoming Concerns



Implications related to free speech, freedom of assembly, freedom of religion

- general order forbids use of investigative facial recognition technology for First Amendment activities; criminal predicate or public safety threat is required for all use
- investigative facial recognition technology will not be leveraged to identify individuals on live feeds or during live-streamed events



# Overcoming Concerns



Unintended consequences, including concerns that there will be an overreliance on video evidence

- the general order makes clear that investigative facial recognition technology is only one element of investigative support that must be used in conjunction with additional corroboration and investigation



# Overcoming Concerns



To ensure clear data on clearance rates and investigative facial recognition technology efficacy

An ordinance amending Chapter 2, "Administration"; Chapter 12A, "Code of Ethics" Chapter 13, "Courts, Fines, and Imprisonments"; Chapter 15B, "Equal Employment Opportunity Contract Compliance"; Chapter 34, "Personnel Rules"; Chapter 37, "Police"; Chapter 43, "Streets and Sidewalks"; Chapter 46, "Unlawful Discriminatory Practices Relating to Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity and Expression"; and Chapter 51A, "Dallas Development Code: Ordinance No. 19455, as amended," of the Dallas City Code by amending Sections 2-121, 2-152.4, 2-163, 2-164, 12A-5, 13-5.1, 13-5.2, 15B-1, 15B-3, 34-35, 37-31, 37-36, 43-172, 46-1, 51A-3.102, and 51A-3.103; providing updated definitions; providing that appointees to boards and commissions must reflect the community served by the city; providing that nominees to the technical resource panel are recommended by the Office of Housing and Community Empowerment; providing for the use of vehicle fees and ride fees under the shared dockless vehicle program; providing an updated declaration of policy relating to unlawful discriminatory practices; providing a penalty not to exceed \$2,000; providing a saving clause; providing a severability clause; and providing an effective date. Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DALLAS:

SECTION 1. That Subsection (b) of Section 2-121, "Technical Resource Panel," of Article XII, "Environmental Commission," of Chapter 2, "Administration," of the Dallas City Code is amended to read as follows:

"(b) Each member of the technical resource panel must have at least four years of experience in one of the eight sectors of the CECAP, causing each sector to be represented on the panel. Additionally, appointments to the panel must, to the extent possible, be representative of the community served by [~~ethnic diversity of~~] the city."



SECTION 2. That Subsection (a) of Section 2-152.4, "Technical Resource Panel," of Article XXI-a, "Commission on Disabilities," of Chapter 2, "Administration," of the Dallas City Code is amended to read as follows:

"(a) There is hereby created a technical resource panel to be comprised of eight members appointed by the city council to serve as non-voting technical members of the commission on disabilities.

(1) The technical resource panel is not a board or commission subject to Chapter 8 of this code or Chapter XXIV, Section 13 of the city charter.

(2) The city manager may nominate members of the first technical resource panel, as recommended by the Office of Housing and Community Empowerment [~~Equity and Inclusion~~] for approval by the full council.

(3) Following the initial appointments, future technical resource panel members may be nominated by the city manager, as recommended by the Office of Housing and Community Empowerment [~~Equity and Inclusion~~], through consultation with the commission on disabilities, for approval by the full council."

SECTION 3. That Subsection (b) of Section 2-152.4, "Technical Resource Panel," of Article XXI-a, "Commission on Disabilities," of Chapter 2, "Administration," of the Dallas City Code is amended to read as follows:

"(b) Each member of the technical resource panel shall be an individual with at least four years of experience in disability matters and shall share a commitment to the goals of the commission on disabilities. Additionally, appointments to the panel must, to the extent possible, be representative of the community served by [~~ethnic diversity of~~] the city."

SECTION 4. That Subsection (c) of Section 2-163, "Special Qualifications for Adjunct Members of the Civil Service Board," of Article XXVIII, "Civil Service Board; Adjunct Members; Administrative Law Judges," of Chapter 2, "Administration," of the Dallas City Code is amended to read as follows:

"(c) The city council shall, as nearly as may be practicable, appoint adjunct members of the civil service board that reflect the community served by the city [~~are representative of the racial, ethnic, and gender makeup of the city's population~~]."

SECTION 5. That Subsection (b) of Section 2-164, "Administrative Law Judges: Appointment; Qualifications; Termination of Contract," of Article XXVIII, "Civil Service Board; Adjunct Members; Administrative Law Judges," of Chapter 2, "Administration," of the Dallas City Code is amended to read as follows:

"(b) The judicial nominating commission shall recommend as administrative law judges persons selected from applicants responding to an open, public request for proposals for professional services. The judicial nominating commission shall review the applications and resumes, research applicant qualifications, and interview the applicants. If a vacancy occurs within 120 days after the appointment of any administrative law judge, for which the commission conducted interviews, the commission is not required to conduct additional interviews but may, in its discretion, recommend nominees to fill the new vacancy from applicants who were interviewed for any administrative law judge position that was filled within the preceding 120 days. The judicial nominating commission shall, as nearly as may be practicable, recruit and recommend as administrative law judges persons who reflect the community served by the city [~~are representative of the racial, ethnic, and gender makeup of the city's population~~]."

SECTION 6. That Section 12A-5, "Anti-Discrimination," of Division 1, "Code of Conduct," of Article II, "Code of Conduct; Actions of Others; and Ethics Commitments," of Chapter 12A, "Code of Ethics," of the Dallas City Code is amended to read as follows:

**"SEC. 12A-5. ANTI-DISCRIMINATION.**

Excluding anyone from our community based on their race, ethnicity, color, age, religion, marital or parental status, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, genetic characteristics, national origin, disability, military or veteran status, political opinions or affiliations, or any other legally protected characteristic or status diminishes us and compromises our ability to fulfill our mission. Discrimination against others based on [~~any of these factors, or any other~~] legally protected classifications[~~;~~] is prohibited. Discriminatory harassment and other offensive acts include any conduct, whether verbal, visual, or physical, that creates an abusive and hostile work environment, or that has the purpose or effect of interfering with an employee's work performance or development."

SECTION 7. That Subsection (d) of Section 13-5.1, "Judicial Nominating Commission Created," of Article II, "Municipal Court of Record," of Chapter 13, "Courts, Fines, and Imprisonments," of the Dallas City Code is amended to read as follows:

"(d) The commission must reflect, as nearly as practicable, the community served by the city [~~racial, ethnic, and gender makeup of the city's population~~]."

SECTION 8. That Subsection (b) of Section 13-5.2, "Judicial Nominating Commission Duties and Responsibilities; Selection of Municipal Judges," of Article II, "Municipal Court of Record," of Chapter 13, "Courts, Fines, and Imprisonments," of the Dallas City Code is amended to read as follows:

"(b) The ad hoc judicial nominations committee of the city council shall provide to the judicial nominating commission minimum qualifications and evaluation guidelines for assessing applicants for a vacancy in the office of municipal judge and a time schedule for recommending nominees. The guidelines must include appropriate goals for achieving a reflection of the community served by the city ~~[sufficient racial, ethnic, and gender diversity]~~ within the municipal court of record. Each associate and full-time municipal judge, including the administrative municipal judge, shall reside in the city of Dallas within four months after the date of appointment and throughout his or her term as a municipal judge for the city of Dallas."

SECTION 9. That Section 15B-1, "Definitions," of Chapter 15B, "Equal Employment Opportunity Compliance," of the Dallas City Code is amended to read as follows:

**"SEC. 15B-1. DEFINITIONS.**

In this chapter:

(1) ~~[AFFIRMATIVE ACTION means the positive steps taken to ensure compliance with the equal employment opportunity clause described in Section 15B-3 of this chapter.~~

(2) BIDDER means any person, partnership, corporation, association, or joint venture seeking to be awarded a contract.

(2[3]) CITY MANAGER means the city manager of the city of Dallas or the city manager's designated representative.

(3[4]) CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT means any public contract for the construction, rehabilitation, alteration, conversion, extension, or repair of city facilities.

(4[5]) CONTRACTOR means any person, partnership, corporation, association, or joint venture that has been awarded a contract by the city.

(5[6]) DISCRIMINATE, DISCRIMINATES, OR DISCRIMINATION means to distinguish, differentiate, separate, or segregate solely on the basis of race, color, age, religion, marital status, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, genetic characteristics, national origin, disability, military or veteran status, sex, political opinions or affiliations in a manner inconsistent with federal law.

(6[7]) SEXUAL ORIENTATION has the meaning assigned to it in Chapter 34 of the Dallas City Code, as amended.”

SECTION 10. That Section 15B-3, “Equal Employment Opportunity Clause,” of Chapter 15B, “Equal Employment Opportunity Compliance,” of the Dallas City Code is amended to read as follows:

**“SEC. 15B-3. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY CLAUSE.**

(a) All construction contracts entered into by the city involving the expenditure of more than \$10,000 of city funds and all competitively bid contracts for the procurement of goods and services involving an expenditure of more than \$50,000 of city funds must incorporate an equal employment opportunity clause, which reads as follows:

(1[+]) The contractor shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, age, religion, marital status, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, genetic characteristics, national origin, disability, military or veteran status, sex, political opinions or affiliation, consistent with applicable laws. The contractor shall prohibit discrimination regarding, ~~[take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to race, age, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, or national origin. This action shall include,]~~ but not [be] limited to, the following:

- (1[A]) employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer;
- (2[B]) recruitment or recruitment advertising;
- (3[C]) layoff or termination;
- (4[D]) rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and
- (5[E]) selection for training, including apprenticeship.

(b[2]) The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants, notices to be provided by the city setting forth the provisions of the nondiscrimination clause described in Subsection (a[1]) of this section. The city will provide notices setting forth the provisions of the nondiscrimination clause described in Subsection (a) for contractors to post in conspicuous places.

(c[3]) The contractor shall in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor state that every qualified applicant will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, age, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, or national origin.

(d[4]) The contractor shall furnish all information and reports required by the city manager and shall permit the city manager to investigate the contractor's payrolls and personnel records that pertain to current contracts with the city for purposes of ascertaining compliance with this equal employment opportunity clause.

(e[5]) The contractor shall file compliance reports with the city as may be required by the city manager. Compliance reports must:

(1[A]) be filed within the required time period;

(2[B]) contain information as to the employment practices, policies, programs, and statistics of the contractor; and

(3[C]) be in the form that the city manager prescribes.

(f[6]) If the contractor fails to comply with this equal employment opportunity clause, it is agreed that the city, at its option, may do either or both of the following:

(1[A]) Cancel, terminate, or suspend the contract in whole or in part.

(2[B]) Declare the contractor ineligible for further city contracts until the contractor is determined to be in compliance.

(g[7]) Nothing in the ~~[this]~~ equal opportunity clause requires that employee benefits be provided to an employee for the benefit of the employee's domestic partner."

SECTION 11. That Section 34-35, "Fair Employment Practices," of Article V, "Rules of Conduct," of Chapter 34, "Personnel Rules," of the Dallas City Code is amended to read as follows:

**"SEC. 34-35. FAIR EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES.**

(a) City management may not discharge an individual, fail or refuse to hire an individual, or otherwise discriminate against an individual with respect to compensation, terms, conditions, or privileges of employment because of the individual's race, color, age, religion, sex, marital status, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, genetic characteristics, national origin, disability, military or veteran status, political opinions, or affiliations, nor shall city management take retaliatory action against an employee who makes a protected complaint of discrimination based on these categories, consistent with applicable laws. Nothing in this subsection extends any employee benefits, including but not limited to paid or unpaid leave, medical benefits, or pension benefits, to any individual who is ineligible for those benefits under any other provision of this chapter, the city's master health plan, the employees' retirement fund program, or the police and fire pension system or under any other city ordinance or resolution or state or federal law.

(b) City management may not limit, segregate, or classify employees or applicants for employment in a way that would deprive or tend to deprive an individual of employment opportunities or otherwise adversely affect an employee's status because of the individual's race, color, age, religion, sex, marital status, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, genetic characteristics, national origin, disability, military or veteran status, political opinions, or affiliations consistent with applicable laws."

SECTION 12. That Subsection (a) of Section 37-31, "Board Created; Appointment; Term; Meetings," of Article III, "Community Police Oversight Board," of Chapter 37, "Police," of the Dallas City Code is amended to read as follows:

"(a) There is hereby created the community police oversight board (the "board") to be composed of 15 members. Each city council member shall appoint one member to the board. It is the intent of the city council that the membership of the board be representative of the community served by ~~[diversity of]~~ the city."

SECTION 13. That Subsection (b) of Section 37-36, "Technical Resource Panel," of Article III, "Community Police Oversight Board," of Chapter 37, "Police," of the Dallas City Code is amended to read as follows:

"(b) Each member of the technical resource panel shall be an individual with at least 10 years of law enforcement experience in a recognized local, county, state, or federal law enforcement agency and, to the extent possible, appointments to the technical resource panel will be representative of the community served by ~~[ethnic diversity of]~~ the city and will include individuals with substantial patrol officer experience."

SECTION 14. That Section 43-172, "Vehicle Fee and Ride Fee," of Article X, "Shared Dockless Vehicle Operating Permit," of Chapter 43, "Streets and Sidewalks," of the Dallas City Code is amended to read as follows:

**"SEC. 43-172. VEHICLE FEE AND RIDE FEE.**

(a) An operator shall pay an annual vehicle fee of \$35 for each permitted shared dockless vehicle ~~[with \$5 from the annual vehicle fee dedicated to equity programs]~~.

(b) An operator shall pay a right-of-way rental fee of \$0.20 for each ride a customer takes on a shared dockless vehicle.

(c) The director may establish a program, subject to city council approval, to rebate or waive fees under this section in order to encourage ~~[equity in the]~~ distribution of shared dockless vehicles throughout the city.

(d) City council must review the fees in this article by June 22, 2024."

SECTION 15. That Section 46-1, "Declaration of Policy," of Article I, "General," of Chapter 46, "Unlawful Discriminatory Practices Relating to Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity and Expression," of the Dallas City Code is amended to read as follows:

**"SEC. 46-1. DECLARATION OF POLICY.**

(a) It is the policy of the city of Dallas to bring about through fair, orderly, and lawful procedures the opportunity for every person to obtain employment, access to all places of public accommodation, and housing, without regard to sexual orientation or gender identity and expression, consistent with all applicable laws. The city of Dallas is proud of the diversity of its employees, as reflected in Section 34-35 of this Code, and is proud of the diversity of its citizens. The city strongly encourages all entities within the city, including those who are excepted from the requirements of this chapter, to recognize the rights of every individual to work and earn wages through gainful employment, to obtain and enjoy goods, services, facilities, privileges, advantages, and accommodations in all places of public accommodation, and to obtain housing.

(b) The denial or deprivation of these rights because of a person's actual or perceived sexual orientation or gender identity and expression is detrimental to the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Dallas and is within the power and responsibility of the city to prevent consistent with all applicable laws."

SECTION 16. That Subsection (a), "Creation; Membership; Appointment," of Section 51A-3.102, "Board of Adjustment," of Article III, "Administrative and Decisionmaking Bodies," of Chapter 51A, "Dallas Development Code: Ordinance No. 19455, as amended," of the Dallas City Code is amended to read as follows:

"(a) Creation; membership; appointment. There is hereby created the board of adjustment which shall consist of 15 members who are residents of the city. Each city council member shall appoint one member to the board. The chair and two vice-chairs shall be appointed by the mayor from among the board members. The city secretary shall divide the board into panels of five members each. A board member may serve only on the panel to which he or she is assigned. To the greatest extent practicable, the panels must reflect the community served by ~~[geographic and ethnic diversity of]~~ the city. The chair and vice-chairs shall act as presiding officers of the panels. Members serve for two-year terms beginning on October 1 of odd-numbered years and shall serve until their successors are appointed and qualified. A vacancy for the unexpired term of any member will be filled in the same manner as the original appointment was made. The city council may appoint six alternate members to the board who serve in the absence of one or more regular members when requested to do so by the board chair, the presiding officer of a board panel, or by the city manager. The alternate members serve for the same period and are subject to removal the same as regular members. The city council shall fill vacancies occurring in the alternate membership the same as in the regular membership.

SECTION 17. That Paragraph (2) of Subsection (a), “Creation; Membership; Appointment,” of Section 51A-3.103, “Landmark Commission,” of Article III, “Administrative and Decisionmaking Bodies,” of Chapter 51A, “Dallas Development Code: Ordinance No. 19455, as amended,” of the Dallas City Code is amended to read as follows:

“(2) The city council shall solicit for consideration nominees for appointment to the landmark commission from, but not limited to: the Dallas County Historical Commission; the Dallas County Heritage Society; the Dallas chapter of the American Institute of Architects; the Dallas Historical Society; the Dallas chapter of the American Planning Association; the Dallas chapter of the American Society of Landscape Architects; the Dallas Bar Association; the North Texas Chapter of the Appraisal Institute; the city plan commission; Preservation Dallas; Black Dallas Remembered; the African-American Museum; ACAL de Mexico; the Dallas Black Chamber of Commerce; the Dallas Hispanic Chamber of Commerce; the Greater Dallas Asian American Chamber of Commerce; the local Urban Land Institute Section; the Dallas Real Estate Council; the CCIM Commercial Real Estate Network; the Board of Realtors; and such other individuals and organizations experienced in historic preservation. The membership of the landmark commission must, as nearly as may be practicable, reflect the community served by ~~[racial and ethnic makeup of]~~ the city~~’s population~~.”

SECTION 18. That Chapters 2, 12A, 13, 15B, 34, 37, 43, 46, and 51A of the Dallas City Code shall remain in full force and effect, save and except as amended by this ordinance.

SECTION 19. That any act done or right vested or accrued, or any proceeding, suit, or prosecution had or commenced in any action before the amendment or repeal of any ordinance, or part thereof, shall not be affected or impaired by amendment or repeal of any ordinance, or part thereof, and shall be treated as still remaining in full force and effect for all intents and purposes as if the amended or repealed ordinance, or part thereof, had remained in force.

SECTION 20. That the terms and provisions of this ordinance are severable and are governed by Section 1-4 of Chapter 1 of the Dallas City Code, as amended.



SECTION 21. That this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the City of Dallas, and it is accordingly so ordained.

SUBJECT November 24, 2025, Officer Involved Shooting – Critical Incident #2025-010

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On November 24, 2025, at approximately 1:55 am, large crowds gathered in the parking lot of Hyde and Seek located at 2026 Commerce Street. At approximately 2:01 am, 31-year-old Kedric McDonald produced a handgun and fired multiple rounds at 27-year-old Zemeid Cox, seated in his vehicle in the parking lot of the club. McDonald fired several more rounds in the parking lot, striking three other people.

McDonald then turned with the gun and ran towards Officers C. Boyd #7912, H. Oquedo #12702, and J. Winn #9245. Officers gave commands to McDonald to drop his weapon, but he did not comply. Officers Boyd and Oquedo fired several rounds, striking McDonald.

Dallas Fire Rescue (DFR) arrived on the scene and provided medical assistance to all five shooting victims. Subject McDonald and complainant Cox were pronounced deceased at the scene by DFR. DFR transported the other three shooting victims to the hospital.

The Dallas County District Attorney's Office is conducting an independent investigation into the incident. Dallas Police Department notified and briefed the Office of Community Police Oversight on the incident.

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## Executive Summary

### I. Background

On July 11, 2025, Nora Jandres submitted a complaint to the Office of Community Police Oversight (OCPO) regarding an April 2025 incident in which Jandres was assaulted in a pizza restaurant by an unknown patron.

Jandres made the following allegations:

1. **Official Oppression** – Responding officers (Ofc. Cortinas and Sgt. Barrett) threatened to arrest him without cause when he asked for their identification. He further alleged that the officers fabricated claims of intoxication, falsely accused him of initiating the assault, and refused to honor his accommodation requests.
2. **Fail to Investigate** – The assigned detective, Detective Bui, failed to conduct a proper investigation. The detective did not contact key witnesses or thoroughly review the materials provided by Jandres. Detective Bui characterized Jandres as the aggressor, despite digital evidence and third-party witness statements contradicting this claim.
3. **ADA Violations** – After filing the report, Jandres began medical leave and formally requested that all communication be conducted via email as a reasonable accommodation under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

### II. Investigation Scope

The OCPO reviewed the initial complaint, which was filed under case number EC2025-0743. The Dallas Police Department (DPD)'s Internal Affairs Division referred this complaint to the Patrol Division to investigate under Division Referral number DR2025-083. The police report was obtained, along with follow-up work completed on the case. Body-Worn Camera (BWC) was reviewed regarding the initial contact between Jandres and officers immediately following the assault.

### III. Investigation Findings

## **II. Investigation**

### **Dallas Police Internal Affairs Investigation**

The Internal Affairs Division referred this complaint to the Patrol Division to investigate. Lt. Delahoussaye conducted the investigation. Lt. Delahoussaye reviewed the BWC and found that the allegations of officers threatening to arrest Jandres when he asked for their identification did not occur. Lt. Delahoussaye made the finding of **UNFOUNDED** for both Officer Cortinas and Sgt. Barrett. Lt. Delahoussaye only investigated the allegations involving the two patrol officers and did not investigate the allegations against Detective Bui.

On September 3, 2025, Nora Jandres wrote a response to the Lt. Delahoussaye investigation. In the response, Jandres reiterated that he was threatened with arrest, the officers failed to investigate the incident, the officers fabricated intoxication allegations, and Sgt. Barrett did not have his BWC on, officers characterized him as confrontational, officers failed to accommodate his disability, and Lt. Delahoussaye covered up the incident.

### **OCPO Independent Review Request**

On September 23, 2025, Jandres requested an independent review of his complaint from the OCPO. On October 14, 2025, at the Community Police Oversight Board (CPOB or Board) meeting, the Board voted for an Independent Investigation with a focus on the allegation that Sgt. Barrett did not have his BWC on.

### **Police Report 058376-2025**

The police report was filed on April 25, 2025, at 11:49 pm, with the time of occurrence listed as April 25, 2025, from 11:30 to 11:49 pm. The report was for an "Assault – Preliminary Investigation". Nora Jandres is listed as the victim, and there is no suspect listed. The narrative details Jandres' statement, in which he stated that he was at a pizza restaurant when an unknown male began touching some of Jandres' friends. Jandres confronted the unknown male, who then slapped Jandres in the face. The report documented that Jandres had a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath.

### **Body Worn Camera Video Review: Officer Cortinas**

**23:52:21** Nora Jandres approaches Officer (Ofc.) Cortinas reports the assault. Ofc. Cortinas takes the report and provides Jandres with a report number.

**00:02:28** Jandres requests a card from Ofc. Cortinas. Ofc. Cortinas advises that he doesn't have a card, but his information will be included in the report. Jandres



then states that he will take a picture of Ofc. Cortinas, but the officer tells him he is not going to take a picture. Ofc. Cortinas proceeds to tell Jandres his name and badge number.

**00:02:47** Ofc. Cortinas asks Jandres if he has been drinking, to which Jandres replies that he has not.

**00:02:59** Ofc. Cortinas repeats his name and badge number for Jandres.

**00:03:49** Sgt. Barrett advises Jandres and friends (while they are standing in the street) that they need to leave, and if they don't go, he will take them to jail.

**00:04:20** Jandres and the friends leave the area.

### **Body Worn Camera Review: Sgt. Barrett**

There was no BWC recording for Sgt. Barrett. In police report 058376-2025, it lists that the BWC for Sgt. Barrett was not activated at the time of the incident. No reason was given for the failed activation.

An interview was requested with Sgt. Barrett to address the allegation regarding the absence of BWC during the incident. Sgt. Barrett did not respond to the request.

### **Detective Bui's Investigation Steps**

1. On April 29, 2025, Detective Bui sent Jandres an email advising him that he is the detective assigned to this assault case. The email requested a statement and for Jandres to provide any evidence that he had. Jandres provided a formal written statement, which included a description of the injuries he received from the assault.
2. Detective Bui interviewed three witnesses from the pizza restaurant.
3. On June 23, 2025, Detective Bui sent Jandres an email stating that he was unable to identify the suspect. Detective Bui also advised that, based on witness statements, Jandres was the aggressor and pushed the suspect prior to being slapped.

### **Americans with Disabilities Act Complaint**

Jandres filed an ADA complaint with the City of Dallas, alleging a violation of their ADA rights were during an investigation. After reviewing the information provided, the Office of Equity and Inclusion found no evidence of an ADA violation, noting that the officer explained conducting the investigation via email would be impractical and offered to schedule an interview at a convenient time. Additionally, the complainant was directed to the open records process for access to case details, which is considered an equally effective method under the ADA. These findings were communicated to the complainant. However, due to continued concerns, particularly related to delays or denials concerning records, on July 18, 2025, ADA Compliance Manager Gary Copeland of the Office of Equity and Inclusion emailed the OCPO to request whether a member of our team or DPD could review the case again to ensure that no other rights or procedures were affected.

### III. Findings

The OCPO reached its conclusions after a thorough review of all available evidence, including video footage, factual records, statements from the involved parties, and official reports. In making its decision, the OCPO carefully considered the precise language of all relevant policies and laws to ensure a well-reasoned and informed outcome.

1. The allegation of Official Oppression against both Officer Cortinas and Sgt. Barrett, in regard to their threatening to arrest Jandres when he asked for their identification. A review of the BWC showed that this did not occur. The BWC shows Jandres asking Ofc. Cortinas for his card. Ofc. Cortinas replies that he does not have a card, but his name will be on the police report. Jandres said he will take a picture of Ofc. Cortinas, at which time the officer provides his name and badge number. We found no evidence that Ofc. Cortinas never threatened to arrest Jandres. Jandres had complained that officers fabricated claims that Jandres was intoxicated. Ofc. Cortinas asked if Jandres had been drinking alcohol, to which Jandres denied drinking. Nothing further developed from this questioning. At the end of the interaction, Sgt. Barrett approached Jandres (and his friends, who were all standing in the street) and stated that they needed to leave; if they didn't, he would take them to jail. The finding for this allegation of Official Oppression is **UNFOUNDED** - the acts alleged in the complaint did not occur.
2. **The allegation of Failure to Investigate** against Senior Corporal Bui regarding his failure to investigate the assault case in which Jandres was the victim. Senior Corporal Bui interviewed three witnesses and was unable to identify the suspect through a photo. Senior Corporal Bui informed with Jandres that he could not to identify the suspect and that the witnesses had contradicted Jandres' statement. Based on this information, it is reasonable to conclude that the investigation would not proceed any further. The finding for this allegation of Failure to Investigate is **UNFOUNDED** for Senior Corporal Bui.
3. **The allegation of a violation of the ADA regarding** Jandres' request to have all communication with Detective Bui conducted via email. Jandres had advised that the injuries prevented him from communicating by phone. Detective Bui did communicate with Jandres by email, but explained that an interview with him could not be done by email and had to be done in person or by phone. This complaint was reviewed by ADA Compliance Manager Gary Copeland, who did not find any ADA violations. The finding for this allegation of ADA is **UNFOUNDED**.
4. **The allegation of Sgt. Barret not recording with his BWC regarding** his interaction with Jandres. A review of Evidence.com showed that Sgt. Barrett did not record his interaction with Jandres. General Order (GO) 332.04(A) *Personnel will utilize the BWC in the following circumstances:*
  1. *Personnel shall record with their body-worn camera all incidents that are conducted within the scope of an official law enforcement capacity and, while actively participating in an investigation, keep the camera activated for the entirety of the personnel's active participation in the investigation.*

It was documented in police report 058376-2025 that Sgt. Barrett did not have his BWC on during the interaction. However, no reason was stated for

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the failure to use BWC as stated in GO 332.04(D). *In accordance, if personnel fail to activate the BWC or fail to record the entire contact, personnel shall document the reasons in a MIR or offense supplement report by the end of their tour of duty.* The finding of a violation of GO 334.04(A) is **SUSTAINED** - there is a preponderance of evidence in support of the allegations made in the complaint.

#### **IV. Recommendation(s) for Policy and/or Discipline (if any)**

The OCPO does not have any policy recommendations at this time.

#### **V. Conclusion**

The OCPO reviewed all available evidence, including video footage, established facts, statements from involved parties, and official reports. Additionally, each conclusion is based on a careful application of the specific language in all relevant policies and laws. The OCPO found no violations of departmental policies or procedures during this investigation as it pertained to Jandres' original complaint. However, the OCPO did discover BWC policy violations by Sgt. Barrett during this investigation.

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## Executive Summary

### I. Background

On August 20, 2025, Billy Robertson submitted a complaint to the Dallas Police Department. Robertson had previously reported two burglaries to his storage unit and has since provided information that the manager of the storage unit was involved in the burglaries. Robertson made the following allegation in his complaint.

- Detective Janse failed to conduct a follow-up on his case.

### II. Investigation Scope

The Office of Community Police Oversight (OCPO) reviewed the initial complaint, which was filed under case number EC2025-0885. The police report was obtained along with body-worn camera (BWC) footage. The Internal Affairs Division declined to investigate this complaint and closed out the complaint with case number NI2025-0704.

### III. Investigation Findings

#### Finding

1. **Senior Corporal Kevin Janse #6679**
  - **Allegation (I): Failure to Investigate – UNFOUNDED**

### II. Investigation

#### Dallas Police Internal Affairs Investigation

The Internal Affairs Division conducted a preliminary review and sent a letter to Billy Robertson dated September 19, 2025. The letter stated in part:

*We determined that there was no violation of departmental policies or procedures, and no investigation is warranted.*

#### OCPO Independent Review Request

On October 9, 2025, Robertson requested an independent review of his complaint from the OCPO. On November 10, 2025, at the Community Police Oversight Board (CPOB or Board) meeting, the Board voted for an Independent Investigation into Robertson's complaint.

#### **Police Report 084643-2025 6.15.25**

Robertson reported a burglary of his storage unit on June 15, 2025. No evidence of forced entry was found. A shower heater, an AC to DC converter, Ryobi power tools, and a charger were reported stolen. There was no suspect information reported.

#### **Police Report 089183-2025 6.23.25**

Robertson reported a burglary of his storage unit on June 23, 2025. No evidence of forced entry was found. A toolbox and miscellaneous tools were reported stolen. There was no suspect information reported.

#### **Police Incident Response 25-1248801 7.15.25**

On July 15, 2025, Robertson called the police back out to the storage units. Robertson stated he found one of his bank statements on the third-floor walkway of the storage unit complex (Robertson's burglarized units were located on the second floor).

#### **Body Worn Camera Video Review**

Body-worn camera was reviewed for each of the above incidents. For each of the above incidents, Robertson explains different theories of how the burglaries occurred but does not provide any firsthand evidence.

During the June 23, 2025, police response, it was discussed that the cameras at the storage unit were not working. The officers then discussed with Robertson the security measures to consider, including cameras, in the event he decides to switch storage units.

During the July 15, 2025, police response, Robertson stated he suspects the person who rented unit 13017 is the one who burglarized his units because he found his bank statement in front of that unit, and he had seen black and yellow Home Depot totes in the storage unit that were similar to his totes. The unknown person who rented 13017 has since moved out of the storage unit using a "Honda Prius". The officer told Robertson that his information is only a "hunch" and that the detectives will need to prove it.

#### **Complainant Billy Robertson Interview**

On November 18, 2025, Investigator Huff interviewed Billy Robertson by phone. Robertson stated that he did speak to Detective Janse by phone. Robertson said it was a short conversation, and when he tried to explain his theory for how the burglaries happened, Detective Janse said that, in his 34 years of experience, it is normally people from out of town who are breaking into the storage units.

Robertson believed that someone had entered an adjacent storage unit and then climbed



over the wall from that unit into his own. He felt management may be involved because the adjacent unit had a management lock on it.

#### **Detective Janse Interview**

Detective Janse did not respond to a request for an interview.

### **III. Findings**

The OCPO reached its conclusions after a thorough review of all available evidence, including video footage, factual records, statements from the involved parties, and official reports. In making its decision, the OCPO carefully considered the precise language of all relevant policies and laws to ensure a well-reasoned and informed outcome.

- 1. Code of Conduct, Section 5.3 - Elements will investigate those incidents assigned or which come to their attention to the fullest extent within their assigned responsibilities.**

Based on the information in the police reports, which were obtained by patrol officers, there was no specific suspect information for Detective Janse to follow up on. Robertson provided possible theories for how the crime may have occurred and who may have been responsible. There were no investigative leads that Detective Janse would have been expected to conduct further investigation on. The finding for this allegation of Failure to Investigate (i.e., Code of Conduct, Section 5.3) is **UNFOUNDED** – the acts alleged in the complaint did not occur.

### **IV. Recommendation(s) for Policy and/or Discipline (if any)**

The OCPO does not have any policy recommendations at this time.

### **V. Conclusion**

The OCPO reviewed all available evidence, including video footage, established facts, statements from involved parties, and official reports. Additionally, each conclusion is based on a careful application of the specific language in all relevant policies and laws. The OCPO found no violations of departmental policies or procedures during this investigation as it pertained to Robertson's original complaint.

### **Complaint**

On July 15, 2025, Wesley Thomas submitted a complaint to the Dallas Police Department and made the following allegations:

- Police responded to a civil matter at Mr. Thomas' residence. After it was determined that no crime had been committed, Mr. Thomas instructed Sgt. Ponce to leave his property. Mr. Thomas claim that Sgt. Ponce remained on the property for 30 minutes after being told to leave.
- Sgt. Ponce used foul language when he finally left the property.

### **Incident Report 25-1239971**

A caller reported that she was at the location (7200 block S. Lancaster Rd) to pick up her child when the child's father (Wesley Thomas) pulled a gun on her. Police responded and learned that there was no custody agreement between the two parties. The police learned after they arrived that Thomas did not point the weapon at the caller. The police attempted

to resolve the issue between the two parties; however, Thomas was unwilling to cooperate.

### **Internal Affairs Division**

The Internal Affairs Division did not investigate this complaint. Instead, the complaint was forwarded to the relevant Patrol Division for investigation. The complaint was assigned Division Referral number DR2025-091. Lt. Sanderlin was assigned to this investigation.

Lt. Sanderlin wrote in his report that officers were at the property for a disturbance, which involved Mr. Thomas having a firearm. Officers were at the property for approximately 15 minutes, but they remained outside of his driveway gate and fence line.

The investigation revealed that when Mr. Thomas was yelling profanities at Sgt. Ponce to get off his property, Sgt. Ponce responded with, "That's what I'm fucking doing." Mr. Thomas yelled something else at Sgt. Ponce responded with, "No shit."

Lt. Sanderlin concluded that the allegation of profanity was **EXONERATED**. Lt. Sanderlin wrote that Sgt. Ponce's response to the hostile language was justified, but he discussed it with Sgt. Ponce other verbal tactics that can prove equally effective.

There was no finding listed for the trespass allegation.

### **OCPO Preliminary Review**

On November 14, 2025, Mr. Thomas submitted a request for an independent review of his complaint. If a complainant is dissatisfied with the findings of the Internal Affairs investigation, they may request an independent review by the Office of Community Police Oversight (OCPO). Mr. Thomas wrote that the Internal Affairs investigation was not objective, thorough, or in compliance with DPD policy. The OCPO conducted a preliminary review of Mr. Thomas' complaint and found a possible violation of the policy prohibiting the use of profane language. The OCPO also acknowledges that no finding was listed for the trespass complaint.

This memo constitutes a preliminary review of the complaint for consideration of the Community Police Oversight Board and to determine whether OCPO should conduct an independent investigation. This review does not constitute an official determination or finding by OCPO, as no independent investigation was conducted.

### **Complaint**

On September 11, 2025, Margaret Martinez submitted a complaint to the Dallas Police Department and made the following allegations regarding the handling of her 15-year-old son's murder investigation:

- Alleging that officers did not follow proper procedures for interviewing a murder suspect, and the improper interview allowed the suspect to take a plea bargain and be sentenced to only 20 years in prison.
- Ms. Martinez claimed that the District Attorney informed the complainant that police negligence had prevented the case from going to trial.

### **Police Report 232643-2023**

On December 30, 2023, a double homicide occurred in the City of Dallas. The driver suspect Perez and his friend, suspect Elijah Martinez, were in a vehicle, and they picked up a third person, victim Angel Solis. Martinez was seated in the front passenger seat, and Solis was seated in the back seat behind the driver. Solis was planning on selling an

AR-15 rifle to Martinez; however, Martinez was planning on robbing Solis. During the transaction, an exchange of gunfire occurred between Solis and Martinez, resulting in their deaths.

The driver, Perez, was initially interviewed that night as a witness, and he stated that Martinez was going to purchase a gun from Solis. Later that same night, Perez admitted to knowing that Martinez was going to rob Solis.

The police report indicated that once Perez admitted to his involvement in the robbery, no further questions were asked of him since he had not been Mirandized. Perez went home, and a warrant was obtained for his arrest, which occurred almost 2 weeks later.

### **Internal Affairs Division Preliminary Review**

On September 11, 2025, Margaret Martinez filed a complaint with the Dallas Police Department regarding the incident. The Internal Affairs Division (IAD) conducted a preliminary review and sent a letter to Ms. Martinez dated October 8, 2025. The letter stated in part:

*We determined that there was no violation of departmental policies or procedures, and no investigation is warranted.*

There was no investigation conducted by the Internal Affairs Division.

### **OCPO Preliminary Review**

On November 7, 2025, Margaret Martinez submitted a request for an independent review of her complaint. If a complainant is dissatisfied with the findings of the Internal Affairs investigation, they may request an independent review by the Office of Community Police Oversight (OCPO); Independent Review Requests must be submitted within 30 days of receiving the IAD decision. Ms. Martinez wrote that she was unsatisfied with the Internal Affairs Division review. She is requesting a more thorough independent review. The OCPO conducted a preliminary review and found no evidence of a violation of departmental policies or procedures. The OCPO concurs with the IAD's review.

This memo constitutes a preliminary review of the complaint for consideration of the Community Police Oversight Board and to determine whether OCPO should conduct an independent investigation. This review does not constitute an official determination or finding by OCPO, as no independent investigation was conducted.

The Dallas Community Police Oversight Board (CPOB), formerly known as the Civilian Review Board, operates as an essential advisory entity for the Chief of Police, the City Manager, and the City Council. This Board was established through an ordinance and is codified in Dallas City Code, Chapter 37, Article III, Section 37-31. Its primary mission is to cultivate public confidence in law enforcement by ensuring that all complaints related to police misconduct are investigated in a manner that is fair, thorough, and transparent. To further this goal, the Office of Community Police Oversight (OCPO) provides comprehensive functional support and technical assistance to the CPOB.

Pursuant to its mandate, the OCPO conducted an **Independent Investigation** concerning a complaint categorized under Internal Affairs Division **Case No. NI2025-0128**. The complaint involved potential violations of Dallas Police Department policies, particularly in relation to the handling and documentation of incidents involving family violence.

The investigation focused on potential breaches of the following policies:

1. **DPD General Orders, Section 307.01(D)(2):** *Officers having reason to believe that an offense involving family violence has occurred will submit an offense report and include the following information.*
  - i. *A description of the injuries.*

2. **DPD Code of Conduct, Section 5.3:** *Elements will investigate those incidents assigned or which come to their attention to the fullest extent within their assigned responsibilities.*

**Findings:**

- **Allegation:** Failure to Describe Injuries  
**Finding:** Sustained  
Officers **Cameron Molencupp (#12413)**, **Roberto Zayas-Vega (#12468)**, and **Chandler Zierfuss (#12466)** were found to have submitted insufficient reports lacking the required descriptions of injuries.
- **Allegation:** Failure to Investigate  
**Finding:** Sustained  
Officer **Cameron Molencupp (#12413)** was found to have failed to adequately investigate the incident in accordance with departmental standards.

The Community Police Oversight Board has reviewed both the investigation process and the resulting findings and concurs with the conclusions reached by the OCPO.

Enclosed is a detailed case narrative providing further context and supporting documentation. Please take a moment to review the documentation and take any actions you find appropriate.

### **Complaint Summary**

On January 29, 2025, Tiffanie Zaharko-Guanajuato submitted a complaint to the Dallas Police Department regarding a domestic violence incident that occurred on June 13, 2024, involving her boyfriend, John Crenshaw, for which she was arrested (**Attachment B**). Zaharko-Guanajuato delayed submitting the complaint until the charges against her were dismissed on January 9, 2025.

The complaint included medical records indicating that she had a bite mark on her abdomen, a scratch on her neck, and it was unclear whether strangulation had occurred. The records also noted a laceration on her forearm, which she indicated was self-inflicted as a way to get away from her boyfriend.

Zaharko-Guanajuato summed up her complaint by stating, "The officers failed to conduct an impartial investigation, ignored crucial evidence, neglected to document my injuries properly....." Zaharko-Guanajuato then listed the below points in her complaint:

- Officers ignored signs that Zaharko-Guanajuato was a victim.
- John Crenshaw advised that Zaharko-Guanajuato was on top of him with a knife. Zaharko-Guanajuato complained that if this was true, he would have been covered in blood from her cuts.
- Crenshaw's visible injuries were not consistent with Zaharko-Guanajuato being right-handed.
- Excessive police response. Nine or more officers arrived for a domestic dispute, which Zaharko-Guanajuato categorized as not an active threat.
- Police ignored medical evidence of Zaharko-Guanajuato being strangled and bitten.
- Officers allowed Crenshaw to control the narrative without being questioned about his inconsistencies.
- Crenshaw provided a video which he claimed showed the assault, but the officers never obtained the full unedited version.
- Officers ignored Zaharko-Guanajuato's efforts to stay away from Crenshaw.
- Crenshaw lied about their relationship status and officers never questioned it.
- Officers ignored Crenshaw's inconsistent statements about the 911 call.
- Officers allowed Crenshaw to mislead them about the gun.
- Zaharko-Guanajuato was humiliated when she had to use a restroom barefoot that had urine all over the floor.

### **Police Report**

Police Report Number 091088-2024: - Authored by Officer Molencupp (**Attachment C**)  
On June 13, 2024, John Crenshaw called the police and advised that his girlfriend, Tiffanie Zaharko-Guanajuato was cutting herself with a knife. When police arrived, they contacted Crenshaw, who advised he had been assaulted, and he showed officers a video of the assault. Officers contacted Zaharko-Guanajuato at the residence and arrested her for assault (PC 22.01(a)(1)). The police report contained a statement from Crenshaw and a description of his injuries. The police report did not contain a statement from Zaharko-Guanajuato. The officer noted that he observed fresh cuts on Zaharko-Guanajuato's forearms. No other injuries were noted for Zaharko-Guanajuato.

Police Report Number 029467-2025: - Authored by Officer Wendy Lary (**Attachment D**)

On March 3, 2025, Zaharko-Guanajuato reported to the Dallas Police that she had documented proof that she was choked by John Crenshaw. Zaharko-Guanajuato described what occurred on June 13, 2024, prior to her getting arrested. Zaharko-Guanajuato advised that when she came home at 12:45 am, John Crenshaw was upset with her. They began arguing, and then Crenshaw grabbed Zaharko-Guanajuato by the neck with one hand and squeezed. She was choked twice more by Crenshaw and then thrown to the ground. Crenshaw grabbed Zaharko-Guanajuato's phone and locked himself in the bedroom, which prevented Zaharko-Guanajuato from calling the police. Crenshaw called the police, and when they arrived, they did not take her statement but did arrest her.

### **Body Worn Camera (BWC) and Dash Cam Review**

#### **Officer Molencupp #1 (Attachment E1)**

- 00:58:32** Officer Molencupp makes contact with John Crenshaw outside the residence and takes his statement.
- 01:07:27** Officers make contact with Zaharko-Guanajuato inside her residence.
- 01:10:30** John Crenshaw gives Officer Molencupp his phone to watch a video of Crenshaw being assaulted by Zaharko-Guanajuato. This video is not recorded by the BWC.
- 01:12:57** Officer Molencupp discusses criminal charges for Zaharko-Guanajuato with Sgt. Salone.
- 01:22:26** Officer Molencupp watches the video of the assault again and records it with his BWC.

#### **Officer Molencupp #2 (Attachment E2)**

- 01:32:19** This video consists of Officer Molencupp continuing to interview John Crenshaw. The video lasts for 4 minutes and 45 seconds.

#### **Officer Bowman #1 (Attachment E3)**

- 01:10:13** Tiffanie Zaharko-Guanajuato is brought outside of her residence in handcuffs where she is treated by the Dallas Fire Department. Officer Bowman stands behind Zaharko-Guanajuato while she is being treated.
- 01:26:55** Zaharko-Guanajuato is placed on the ambulance gurney.

#### **Officer Johnson (Attachment E4)**

- 01:29:50** While in the back of the ambulance, Officer Johnson asks Zaharko-Guanajuato, "Do you want to talk about what happened". A conversation ensues in which Zaharko-Guanajuato said that Crenshaw would not leave her alone and describes them arguing over Crenshaw texting an ex-girlfriend. There were no specific questions asked reference anyone being assaulted.
- 01:38:27** Zaharko-Guanajuato arrives at the hospital.

#### **Officer Zierfuss (Attachment E5)**

- 02:51:02** Zaharko-Guanajuato is moved to an imaging room in the hospital.
- 02:56:16** Medical Staff asks Officer Zierfuss and Officer Vega what Zaharko-Guanajuato is under arrest for. Ofc. Zierfuss explains that it is for family violence and her wounds are self-inflicted. The Medical Staff then asks if the strangulation marks were his self-defense or if those were self-inflicted. Officer Zierfuss states that he has not taken any pictures of Zaharko-Guanajuato but says he will take pictures.

#### **Officer Ramirez (Attachment E6)**

- 05:18:45** An unknown hospital employee (wearing scrubs) can be seen leaving the restroom.
- 05:19:04** Officer Ramirez takes Zaharko-Guanajuato to the restroom.
- 05:20:20** Zaharko-Guanajuato states, "Awesome, he pissed all over the seat".

#### **Photographs:**

Evidence.com is the storage system the Department uses for digital media such as body worn camera videos and photographs. There are 18 photographs stored under this incident number. Nine of those photographs are of John Crenshaw (**Attachments F1-F9**), and nine are of blood inside the apartment (**Attachments G1-G9**). There are zero photographs of Zaharko-Guanajuato.

#### **Dallas Police Internal Affairs Preliminary Review:**



The Internal Affairs Division did not open an investigation on Zaharko-Guanajuato's complaint. On March 19, 2025, the Internal Affairs Division sent Zaharko-Guanajuato a letter stating (**Attachment H**):

*In accordance with our policy, the Internal Affairs Division does not investigate complaints related to the proposed guilt or innocence of a case, including disputes regarding an arrest or citation. Such matters should be addressed through the judicial system.*

On March 12, 2025, Zaharko-Guanajuato submitted a request to the Office of Community Police Oversight for an Independent Review of her complaint (**Attachment I**). The Community Police Oversight Board voted on April 8, 2025, to have the OCPO conduct an independent investigation into this complaint.

### **Investigation:**

Zaharko-Guanajuato had complained that the Dallas Police Department failed to conduct an impartial investigation and ignored crucial evidence.

A review of the original police report (091088-2024) written by Officer Molencupp did not contain a statement from Zaharko-Guanajuato. The report contained a statement from John Crenshaw and described his injuries.

Officer Molencupp wrote that he spoke to Zaharko-Guanajuato over the phone to get her to open the door to the residence. He also wrote that he observed fresh cuts on her forearms. However, nothing in the report references questioning Zaharko-Guanajuato about what happened.

A review of the Body worn camera (BWC) showed that no officers at the scene of the family violence questioned Zaharko-Guanajuato about what happened between her and Crenshaw. When Zaharko-Guanajuato was being transported by ambulance to the hospital, Officer Johnson, who was riding in the back of the ambulance, started a conversation with Zaharko-Guanajuato. Officer Johnson asked if she wanted to talk about what happened, and a conversation ensued about Zaharko-Guanajuato wanting to avoid Crenshaw, but there were no questions regarding either one of them assaulting the other. This conversation took place while Zaharko-Guanajuato was in handcuffs and had been told she was arrested. This occurred without any Miranda waiver and was not documented in a report.

At the hospital, Zaharko-Guanajuato was being watched by Officer Vega and Officer Zierfuss. At one point, Zaharko-Guanajuato is wheeled by gurney to an imaging room, and a medical staff employee asks both officers what she is being arrested for. After it is explained to the medical staff that she was arrested for family violence, the medical staff asked if the possible strangulation marks on Zaharko-Guanajuato were caused by self-defense from the other party. Officer Zierfuss said he hasn't taken photos but will take

some. There were no police reports or photographs found of possible strangulation marks on Zaharko-Guanajuato.

Zaharko-Guanajuato complained that when a female officer was going to take her to the restroom, a male officer stopped her and stated that he needed to go first. Zaharko-Guanajuato explained that this male officer was not one of the officers who had been watching her at the hospital that night. Zaharko-Guanajuato then used the restroom and afterwards she said there was urine on the floor and toilet seat. A review of BWC from Officer Ramirez (the female officer who escorted her to the restroom) showed an unknown male hospital employee (wearing scrubs and an ID card) leave the restroom just prior to Zaharko-Guanajuato entering. There was not a Dallas Police Officer who entered the restroom just prior to Zaharko-Guanajuato

Zaharko-Guanajuato submitted medical documentation from Baylor University Medical Center for June 13, 2024 (**Attachment J**). The documentation said, per the EMS report, the patient was assaulted by her boyfriend. The patient was noted to have a bite mark over her anterior abdomen. The patient stated her boyfriend had scratched her neck, but she was unsure if she had been strangled. None of this information was in the police report.

On April 9, 2025, OCPO Investigator Huff interviewed Zaharko-Guanajuato by telephone (**Attachment K**). Zaharko-Guanajuato explained that Dallas Police Detective Timothy Ross was submitting a report to the grand jury for possible charges against Crenshaw for what occurred on June 13, 2024. Zaharko-Guanajuato provided the police report number of 029467-2025.

A review of police report 029467-2025 showed that it was reported on March 3, 2025, when Zaharko-Guanajuato walked into police headquarters and made the report for what happened on June 13, 2024. The reported documented Zaharko-Guanajuato's account for what happened to include being grabbed by the neck by Crenshaw. This report referenced the original report of 091088-2024 and stated that Zaharko-Guanajuato advised that the police never took a statement from her during the night of the incident.

Zaharko-Guanajuato complained of excessive police response to this incident. The information the police had when they responded to the incident was a female cutting herself with a knife and having access to a firearm.

OCPO Investigator Huff attempted to interview Officer Molencupp, Officer Vega, and Officer Zierfuss, however all three declined to be interviewed.

### **Findings & Conclusion:**

The Office of Community Police Oversight (OCPO) reached its conclusions after a thorough review of all available evidence, including video footage, factual records, statements from the involved parties, and official reports. In making its decision, the

OCPO carefully considered the precise language of all relevant policies and laws to ensure a well-reasoned and informed outcome. Findings against Officer Molencupp are based on his police report, which did not contain injuries found on Zaharko-Guanajuato that were later discovered at the hospital. The report also did not contain a full investigation into the incident to include a statement from Zaharko-Guanajuato. This lack of investigation is supported by the Dallas police having to take a second police report in March 2025 that included a statement from Zaharko-Guanajuato.

The findings on Officer Zierfuss and Officer Vega are based on the BWC video which showed medical staff informing them of injuries to Zaharko-Guanajuato which were not photographed or documented in the report.

Regarding the complaint of urine on the floor, the person using the restroom just prior to Zaharko-Guanajuato was not a Dallas Police Officer but appeared to be a hospital employee.

Regarding the complaint of excessive police response, the OCPO did not see any policy violations in the response.

**Recommendation(s) for Policy and/or Discipline in Connection with Sustained Allegation(s) (if any):**

The Dallas Police Department General Order Section 502.00(C)(2) states:

*Complaints relative to differences of opinion between a citizen and an arresting police officer regarding the guilt or innocence of that citizen will not be investigated but will be properly disposed of within the judicial system. If a citizen can furnish sufficient evidence, however, that the arrest was malicious and/or illegal, the complaint may be investigated at the discretion of the Internal Affairs Division Commander.*

In this particular complaint, the Internal Affairs Division (IAD) initially determined that an investigation was not necessary, categorizing the complaint as a matter of guilt or innocence, in accordance with the relevant policy. However, the Office of Community Police Oversight (OCPO) asserts that the complaint brought to light potential misconduct related to the failure to accurately document the complainant's injuries and the investigation conducted by the Dallas Police Department (DPD). It should be noted that this complaint does not solely pertain to differing opinions regarding guilt or innocence surrounding the arrest.

The OCPO expresses significant concern regarding the potential implications for future complaints involving arrests or citations, particularly those relating to allegations of misconduct that may be prematurely dismissed or categorized solely as guilt or innocence, thereby resulting in a lack of thorough investigation. To mitigate this issue, the OCPO recommends that the Internal Affairs Division apply the standard outlined in the initial sentence of the policy, rather than adopting a broad interpretation that influenced the determination regarding guilt or innocence.

Furthermore, with respect to the second sentence of the policy, the OCPO advocates for collaboration with the DPD to refine the language, which suggests that even when there is substantial evidence indicating an illegal or malicious arrest, the IAD may opt not to conduct an investigation. To foster community trust and ensure accountability, the OCPO recommends revising the policy to unequivocally state that any credible evidence of illegal or malicious police conduct will prompt a formal investigation.

The Dallas Community Police Oversight Board (CPOB), formerly known as the Civilian Review Board, operates as an essential advisory entity for the Chief of Police, the City Manager, and the City Council. The investigation focused on potential breaches of the following policies:

Officer **Simon Medina-Cervantes (#12640)** and Senior Corporal **Jonathan Martinez (#11753)** were found to have failed to adequately investigate the incident in accordance with departmental standards.

### **Complaint Summary:**

On December 23, 2024, Abdul Samad filed a complaint with the Dallas Police Department (DPD) regarding an incident that occurred the previous day (**Attachment B**). Samad reported that he was involved in a vehicular collision in which the passenger of the opposing vehicle allegedly switched seats to falsely claim to be the driver. He also stated that a separate vehicle arrived at the scene, made threats, and attempted to run him over. Samad expressed frustration that the responding officers failed to take any action regarding these concerns.

### **Police Report:**

- **Crash Report (December 22, 2024) (Attachment C):** Authored by Officer Medina-Cervantes, this report lists Iris Castro as the driver of Unit #1 and Abdul Samad as the driver of Unit #2. No passengers were listed, and there was no mention of the alleged driver switch reported by Samad.
- **Miscellaneous Incident Report (December 22, 2024) (Attachment C1):** Also authored by Officer Medina-Cervantes, this report documented Samad's claim that a separate vehicle arrived at the scene and made threatening gestures.
- **Assault Report (January 13, 2025) (Attachment D):** Authored by Corporal Martinez, this report addressed the alleged attempt to assault Samad with a vehicle. Corporal Martinez stated that he had originally misunderstood Samad's claim, which led to the delayed report.

### **Body Worn Camera (BWC) Review**

#### **Officer Medina-Cervantes (Attachment E)**

- 16:04:10** Officer Medina-Cervantes arrives on scene and contacts Abdul Samad. Samad explains how the collision occurred. Samad continues to refer to the other driver as a "he" during this conversation.
- 16:24:48** Samad shows Officer Medina-Cervantes the skid marks in the parking lot caused by the vehicle that tried to back over him. Samad explains again he was almost run over by another vehicle.
- 16:27:21** Samad discusses with Officer Medina-Cervantes that the passenger of the other vehicle had switched seats and was falsely claiming to be the driver.

#### **Sgt. Emerson (Attachment E1)**

- 16:27:21** Samad discusses with Officer Medina-Cervantes that the passenger of the other vehicle had switched seats and was falsely claiming to be the driver.
- 16:27:38** Samad discusses the separate vehicle that arrived at the scene and made threatening gestures towards him.
- 16:28:27** Samad advises a male was driving the vehicle that collided with his and not the female. The female was a passenger in the vehicle.
- 16:28:50** Samad walks with Sgt. Emerson and Officer Medina-Cervantes in an attempt to identify the actual driver of the vehicle involved in the collision.
- 16:37:30** All three officers discuss the entire incident with Samad, including the separate vehicle attempting to run him over. Sgt. Emerson outlines that it will all be included in the report.

### **Corporal Martinez (Attachment E2)**

- 16:11:57** Corporal Martinez greets Sgt. Emerson when he arrives on scene. Officer Martinez informs Sgt. Emerson that Officer Medina-Cervantes is "technically in his fourth phase" (of training).
- 16:19:57** Corporal Martinez is telling Officer Medina-Cervantes what he needs to do for this collision investigation.
- 16:29:40** Corporal Martinez and Sgt Emerson discuss the alleged driver switch.

### **Dallas Police Internal Affairs Preliminary Review:**

On January 28, 2025, IAD sent a letter to Abdul Samad stating (**Attachment F**):

*Upon completion of the review, we cannot establish a violation of departmental policies or procedures. Based on the review, we have determined no investigation is warranted.*

On April 1, 2025, Abdul Samad submitted an Independent Review Request to the Office of Community Police Oversight (OCPO) (**Attachment G**). Along with his request, he included photos of tire marks, notes he had taken about the incident, and court documents related to his attempt to sue the other driver (**Attachments G1-G3**).

### **Investigation:**

A review of the BWC showed Abdul Samad clearly stating to Officer Medina-Cervantes and Corporal Martinez that the female was not the driver and the male driver had left the scene.

A review of the police reports showed no mention of a possible driver switch.

The original police report and a second police report both contained Samad's statement that another vehicle had almost struck him in the parking lot.

OCPO Investigator Huff interviewed Abdul Samad (**Attachment H**). During the interview, Samad advised that Detective Smith told him he followed up on the assault and was unable to find any available video footage at the local businesses.

OCPO Investigator Huff attempted to interview Officer Medina-Cervantes and Corporal Martinez, but both declined.

### **Findings & Conclusion**

The Office of Community Police Oversight reached its conclusions after a thorough review of all available evidence, including video footage, factual records, statements from the involved parties, and official reports. In making its decision, the OCPO carefully considered the precise language of all relevant policies and laws to ensure a well-reasoned and informed outcome. Findings are based on the following:

- BWC shows Abdul Samad reporting the driver switch to the officers.
- BWC shows Officer Medina-Cervantes and Corporal Martinez discussing the driver switch.
- BWC shows Sgt. Emerson advising Abdul Samad that the information on the driver switch will be included in the report.
- The police reports do not indicate any information of a driver switch being alleged.
- The information related to Abdul Samad almost being stuck by another vehicle on purpose while he was standing in the parking lot was included in the police report.

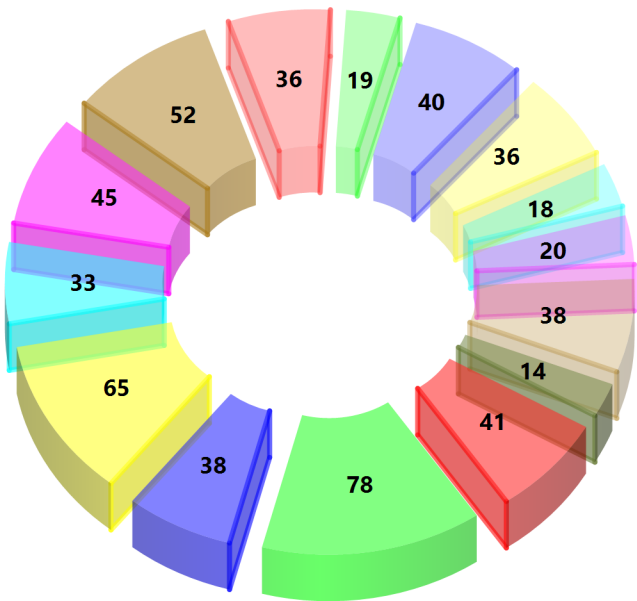

Monthly Category Arrest (Highest Charge), Arrest by Misdemeanor and Felony, and Behavior Health Incidents

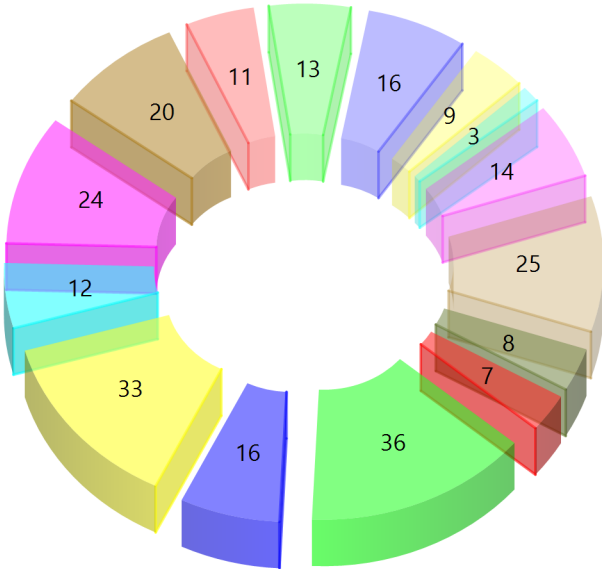

SUBJECT **Complaints Received from November 1, 2025, to November 30, 2025**

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This memorandum provides a summary of complaints received and resolved by OCPO in November 2025. From **November 1 to November 30, 2025**, the **Office of Community Police Oversight (OCPO)** received a total of **91 complaints**. Each complaint undergoes an initial review by OCPO, in collaboration with the **Dallas Police Department's Internal Affairs Division (IAD)**, to determine the appropriate type of investigation:

## Investigation Types

- **Control Number (CN):**  
For allegations that could result in a written reprimand or higher. Investigated by the Internal Affairs Division.
- **Division Referral (DR):**  
For less severe allegations that may result in corrective actions such as Advice and Instruction, Documented Counseling, or a Supervisor's Report of Correction. Investigated by the officer's division.
- **No Investigation (NI):**  
For cases that will not be investigated by IAD (e.g., allegations submitted after 60 days or failing to meet legal requirements).
- **Public Integrity (PI):**  
For allegations of criminal conduct by police officers. The Public Integrity Unit investigates these. All complaints that may rise to the level of a criminal offense, including anonymous submissions, are forwarded to this unit.
- **Administrative Inquiry Investigation:**  
Investigations into misconduct or improper police handling may be needed even without formal complaints. This includes cases involving unidentified employees, vague allegations, City Manager referrals, third-party claims, anonymous reports of criminal activity, directives from leadership, and instances where the complainant may be untruthful.

## Reasons for No Investigation (NI)

- **Does Not Meet Criteria:** Complainant refused to provide a written statement (per TX GC 614.022)

- **Duplicate Complaint:** Allegation already under review or previously addressed.
- **Failure to Articulate:** No clear allegation of misconduct was provided.
- **Guilt or Innocence:** Complaint challenges legal guilt, not officer conduct
- **Information Only:** Request for or provision of unrelated information
- **More Information Needed:** Insufficient information to proceed.
- **No Violation:** Preliminary review finds no policy violation.
- **No Violation (BWC):** Body Worn Camera review confirms no misconduct.
- **Non-Employee:** Complaint involves a non-DPD individual.
- **Sixty-Day:** Complaint received more than 60 days after the incident with no good cause.
- **Third Party:** Complainant was not a victim or witness of the incident.

### **Complaint Classification Summary**

The **91** complaints received were categorized as follows:

- **0** classified as *No Investigation (NI)*
- **0** classified as *Division Referral (DR)*
- **1** classified as *Control Number (CN)*
- **0** classified as *Public Integrity (PI)*
- **90** complaints are *pending determination*

### **Non-Pending Complaints**

The remaining complaints (those already reviewed) were further categorized:

*As of the date of this report for November, IAD has reviewed no complaints.*

### **Completed Cases**

During November 2025, **24** cases were investigated and completed.
