### Introduction




 This presentation serves to provide an update on active short-term rentals, HOT collection, Initial and ongoing annual costs, fee recovery, and staff activity during injunction.



## **Active Short-Term Rentals**



• As of September 30, 2024, we have detected a total of 3495 active short-term rental properties within the City of Dallas, via GovOS software.





## **Initial Cost**



**Initial Costs**: The program's initial cost was \$1,375,057. The following table provides a line-item breakdown of start-up costs.

## **Ongoing Annual Costs**



#### **Ongoing Annual Costs:**

The annual cost projections of running the Short-Term Rental (STR) enforcement unit year-over-year, through FY 27.

## Staff Activity During Injunction



- Nine (9) dedicated FTEs were allocated for STR enforcement
  - One (1) Supervisor
  - One (1) Administrative Specialist
  - Seven (7) Code Inspectors
- During the injunction, staff members have been fanned out across other high-priority Rental Units (e.g. Multi-Family, Single-Family, Boarding Home Facilities, and the Consumer Protection Licensing/Inspection Program).
- Collectively these individuals have conducted <u>13,575</u> inspections among them, during FY 23-24, improving the health, safety, and Quality of Life for Dallas residents.



## Fee Recovery



#### **Fee Recovery**

Registration Fees	\$248.00	The annual registration fee, which includes an initial inspection.
Re-inspection Fees	5144.00	Upon initial inspection, if the property requires a re- inspection, a \$144 fee is applied.

- The fee study initially determined the revenue of \$745K, assuming all 3,000 potential STR units register and pay a registration fee.
- However, based on the implementation of similar new programs, we have seen that only between 50% and
  42% of potential units will register during the program's initial implementation phase.
- Therefore, the revenue is adjusted to reflect that an estimated half of potential STR units will register during the first year.
- Also, the revenue can decrease depending on the month of the FY this program is launched.



## Hotel Occupancy Tax (HOT)



- Per Chapter 351 of the Texas Tax Code and Chapter 334 of the Texas Local Government Code, every person (entity) owning, operating, managing, or controlling a short-term rental (STR) in the City of Dallas (City) is required to collect Hotel Occupancy Tax (HOT) in the amount of 9% of net room receipts from their guests and report the collections and pay the HOT to the City. Guests who stay 30 or more consecutive nights are exempt from paying HOT.
- HOT collected from STRs for the periods of June 2023 through August 2024: \$4,106,348.97
- HOT collected from STRs during FY 2023: \$3,824,201.93
- HOT collected from STRs during FY 2024 YTD August: \$2,849,521.69
- Estimated total HOT revenue from STRs during FY 2024: \$3,108,569.12

• Key Challenges in Collection: The City Controller's Office (CCO) mails monthly notifications to properties identified as potential STRs. The challenge is that not all property owners/managers respond to the CCO's request to register their property to file and pay HOT.



### Conclusion



- The Dallas Short-Term Rental program is currently under legal injunction that has halted registration requirements, zoning restrictions, and penalties for noncompliance enforcement.
- We await release of injunction prohibiting enforcement.
