Statement of Request

For An Alcohol Distance Variance

to a Public School

Request is being made to allow a variance for a restaurant located within 300 feet of a DISD public school known as Hector Garcia Middle School located at 700 E 8th St, Dallas, TX 75203.

The restaurant is located across from the back side of the school at 720 E Jefferson Blvd, Dallas, TX 75203 is currently operated by Mucha Lucha, LLC dba Del Sur Tacos. (NOTE: The corporate name will be changing to La Lucha, LLC)

The history of this location has shown to have had a restaurant operation since 2003. Mr. Lopez, the current owner of the property, was once an operator at the location in 2003. He then leased the location to a Mr. Jesus Cuellar in 2009. In 2013 Mr. Lopez took over the operations at the restaurant and obtained a Private Club Permit through the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission.

The current tenants entered a seven-year lease with Mr. Lopez in 2019 and currently has 4 years remaining. Mr. Lopez had just renewed the TABC permit in December 2019 to assist the current tenant until they could do a change of officers on the Private club. In March 2020 the Covid Virus shut down occurred and put the restaurant business operations on hold. The TABC took the opportunity during this time to implement their new online system. Because of this transitioned into a new online system they were giving permit holders to the end of March 2022 to renew. Unfortunately, Mr. Lopez did not understand the new system and the private club permit lapsed.

The current tenants are requesting the approval for a variance to allow the restaurant to operate with a Mixed Beverage Permit with required Food and Beverage Certificate. During the time when they were working with Mr. Lopez and the private club permit was active, the restaurant has shown that 70% of their sales were mostly in food and only 30% in alcohol sales.

The current tenants request this variance be approved as their business has slacked as customers like to have a beer or margarita with their meal and have gone elsewhere as they do not want to do the BYOB approach.
