



Overarching Themes





Maintain local control and preserve tools to respond to the specific needs of the Dallas community; harmonize responsibilities and resources



Promote a business-friendly environment to attract economic development and talent



Pursue funding for public safety, critical infrastructure, and natural resources



Support vulnerable populations and oppose any legislation that would erode existing protections

Parks, Trails and the Environment



Support legislation that focuses on resource sustainability, conservation, climate change, and environmental justice to build a more resilient city.

Infrastructure Investment & Jobs Act (IIJA) Overview





Five-year Surface Transportation Reauthorization (2021-2026)

- IIJA/Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL)
 Signed into Law November 15, 2021
- \$1.2 Trillion Total, Fiscal Years 2022-2026
- Baseline Transportation Funding of \$293.5B +
 New IIJA Spending of \$274B = \$567.5Billion
 - Increases funding, expands and creates new programs
 - New elements: equity, climate, resiliency, electric vehicles, grants

Other Infrastructure Spending

\$550 Billion for Water, Broadband,
 Cybersecurity, Energy




Nationwide IIJA Projects By Type In Billions,

IIJA Implementation



Roads and Bridges

- Texas to receive approximately \$27.5
 billion over five years in federal funding for highways and bridges
- 699 specific projects identified for funding

Transit

- IIJA made the largest investment in public transit in history
- Texas to receive approximately \$3.4 billion over five years to improve public transit across the state
