The following agenda item is scheduled to go before Council on April 22, 2026.

DRAFT AGENDA ITEM #26-1215A

Authorize an amendment to Resolution No. 24-1784, approved on December 11, 2024 for the grant from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Federal Emergency Management Agency passed through the Texas Office of the Governor Homeland Security Grants Division (HSGD) for the FY 2024 Homeland Security Grant Program which includes the Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) (Federal / State Award ID No. EMW-2024-SS-05096 in an amount not to exceed \$5,842,198.40 to: (1) add Grant No. 5853501 for additional activities related to enhancing preparedness and building capacity to prepare for, prevent, and respond to terrorist attacks; (2) extend the term of the agreement from August 31, 2026 to November 30, 2026; (3) reallocate funds within the existing budget to add Grant No. 5853501; and (4) execution of the amended grant agreement with HSGD and all terms, conditions, and documents required by the amended agreement – Financing: No cost consideration to the City

BACKGROUND

The DHS was created in 2002 and began releasing funds to state and local governments through grant programs. Since 2003, the City of Dallas has received over \$130 million in grant funds under the initiatives that make up the Homeland Security Grant Program. In order to facilitate the distribution of these federal funds, each State is required to establish a State Administrative Agency (SAA) to administer and distribute the grant funding to local governments. In Texas, the SAA has been established within the Texas Office of the Governor.

These initiatives provide funding for equipment acquisition and planning and training activities to increase the ability of the City of Dallas to prevent, protect against, respond to, and recover from natural and man-made disasters all linked to a terrorism nexus. Some of the activities that these funds support include planning and training for first

responders and departmental staff, as well as for citizens participating in the Citizen Emergency Response Team and a public awareness campaign.

Additionally, these funds are also used to assist departments with meeting national, state and regional preparedness goals through the procurement of equipment for various initiatives such as increasing interoperability during incidents.

Each initiative focuses on a component of the overall needs of Dallas to respond in conjunction with state and federal agencies during times of natural and man-made disasters. UASI focuses on the unique planning, equipment, training, and exercise needs of high-threat, high-density urban areas, with specific carve outs for Law Enforcement (LE) activities and Management and Administration (M&A) of the grant.

Previous funding from the Homeland Security Grant Program has been used for equipment and programs to support public safety and homeland security initiatives.
