SUBJECT: **Ceremonial Street Topper for Max Glauben – Ross Avenue and Houston Street & Ross Avenue and Record Street**

In accordance with the provisions of Sections 51A-9.502 of the Dallas Development Code, please proceed with the process for the consideration of ceremonial street toppers for Max Glauben on Ross Avenue and Houston Street and Ross Avenue and Record Street. These sections were selected because it is near the Dallas Holocaust and Human Rights Museum which brings many visitors to learn about the lives that were lost and to view testimonies of the survivors. His holographic image is part and parcel of the DHHRM program. Mr. Glauben passed away at the age of 94 years old on April 28, 2022.

Mr. Glauben suffered tragedy at a young age, losing his mother, father, and younger brother who were murdered by the Nazis. He dedicated his life sharing his testimony. He raised awareness about the Holocaust and the tragedy that transpired in people's lives. His efforts helped him champion the Dallas Holocaust Museum. As a co-founder of the museum, he became an inspiration to others. His experiences led him to a lifetime of humanitarian work. His efforts impacted many lives and honoring him with the street toppers is a way for Max Glauben's legacy to live on.
