Background

City of Dallas Leadership & Implementation: The City of Dallas has been working with the Visit Dallas Sports Commission, the region, and partners for over three years to bring FIFA to Dallas in a significant way. As this briefing outlines, the city will be a central hub for the International Broadcast Center, Volunteer Center, FIFA Fan Festival, and the largest number of matches in the world.

While the FIFA World Cup 2026 will benefit the entire region, the City of Dallas appreciates playing a central implementation role, with multiple City departments and city partners actively participating in regional committees to ensure coordinated execution and successful delivery of World Cup activities within Dallas. Staff understands that FIFA offers:

- **Global Significance:** The FIFA World Cup 2026 represents a once-in-a-generation opportunity to showcase Dallas and the North Texas region on the world's largest sporting stage, reaching billions of viewers worldwide.
- **Comprehensive Planning Effort:** The City of Dallas, in coordination with the North Texas FWC Organizing Committee, is advancing detailed planning across all major functional areas—including safety, transportation, infrastructure, operations, and community engagement—to ensure a successful and seamless event.

The Biggest Global Event is Coming to Dallas

The FIFA World Cup 2026 is returning to North Texas for a global moment of historic scale. Dallas previously hosted World Cup matches in 1994 at the Cotton Bowl Stadium, drawing record-breaking crowds for the tournament. The 2026 event will feature 48 teams and nine matches in North Texas, **including a semifinal at Dallas Stadium.**

International Broadcast Center (IBC)



The IBC at the Kay Bailey Hutchison Convention Center Dallas is a tremendous moment for the city and a point of pride.

The IBC will function as the **global hub** for television, radio, and digital coverage of the World Cup, welcoming **thousands of international broadcasters and media professionals** from around the world. Dallas will be at the heart of one of the most watched sporting events on the planet, with broadcasts reaching billions of fans across **more than 200 countries**.

An estimated **3,500+ broadcasters, media, and staff** are expected to make Dallas their home away from home starting in January 2026 and continuing throughout the tournament. The NTFWCOC will operate a Media Center at the KBHCCD for the entire duration of the tournament for those media that are not credentialed for the IBC.

IBC Operations Timeline & Facility Investments

- Started conducting Virtual Tryouts for domestic applicants who live more than 300 miles away

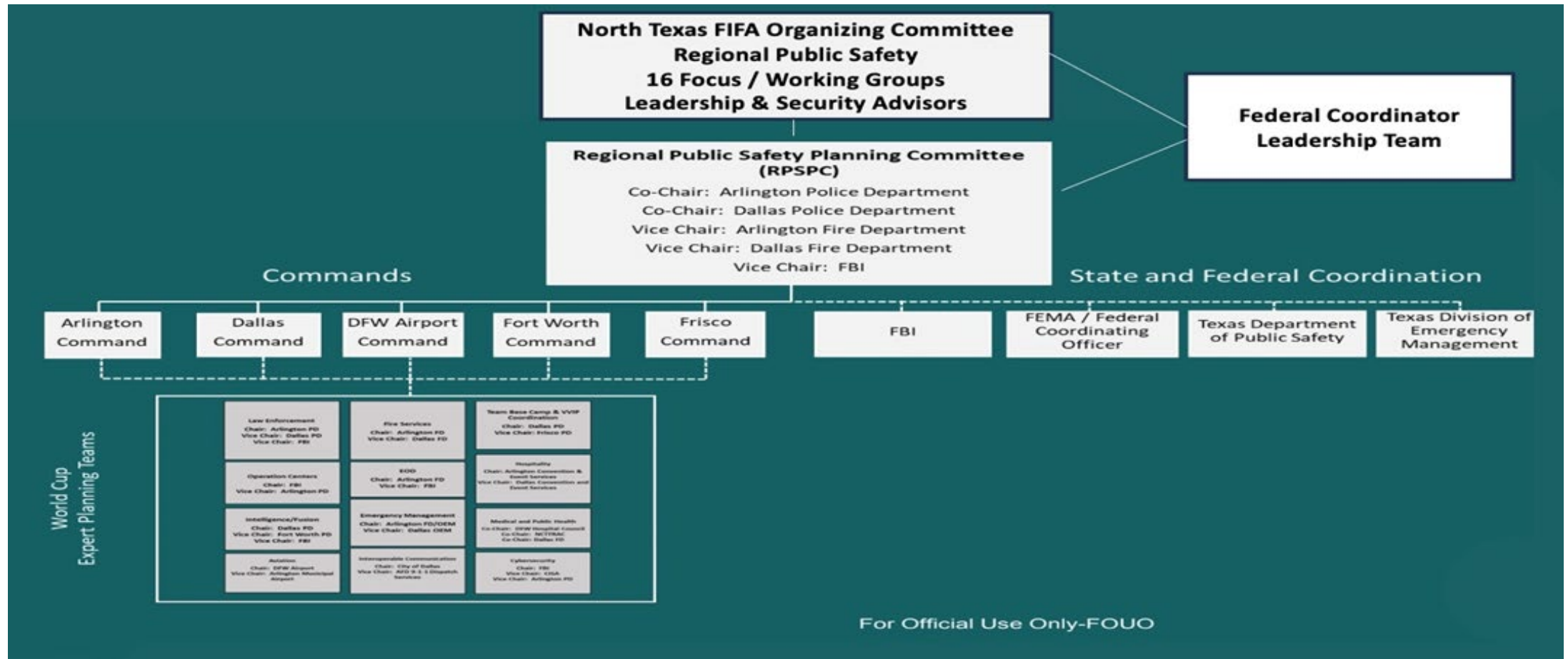

Safety & Security



Dallas and Regional Transportation and Mobility

Dallas

- **Dallas-Based Testing & Readiness:** Several elements of the transportation system were tested locally during the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic on December 31 to evaluate traffic flow, transit utilization, and operational coordination.
- **Fan Festival & Event Operations:** Coordinating with Dallas Police Department to plan vehicle access, pedestrian routing, and traffic management for Fan Festival activities and other Dallas-based events.
- **Wayfinding & Signage:** Developing consistent wayfinding and signage across key Dallas transportation hubs, venues, and activity areas to support visitors and residents.

Regional

- **Regional Transportation Planning:** Final regional transportation plan, inclusive of City of Dallas operations and event impacts, due to FIFA by the end of March
- **Scenario Planning & Exercises:** NCTCOG will conduct additional tabletop exercises through May, with City of Dallas departments actively participating to refine local response and coordination.
- **Transit Coordination:** Working with DART, Trinity Metro, and TRE on the use of CentrePort Station, bus services, and rail passes to support match-day ticket holders, broadcasters, media, and volunteers traveling to and from Dallas venues and events.
- **Full System Pilot:** A comprehensive pilot test of the transportation system, including Dallas-specific routes and operations, is scheduled for late April/May

Human Rights

Version 1 of the Human Rights Plan will be released on February 16. The final version is expected to be available in May, pending FIFA approvals.

Additionally, training materials on human trafficking and accessibility, as well as free speech toolkits, will also be available for download on the Host Committee website starting February 16, alongside Version 1 of the Plan.

Action Plan Items:

- Automated Responsible Contracting Policy through a Bid Management System for registrants of North Texas Business Connect.
- Establishing a worker center in FIFA Fan Festival for grievance redress and upskilling opportunities
- Human Trafficking and Accessibility Trainings have been rolled out through North Central Council of Governments throughout the region
- Free speech toolkits have been developed for the region, including guidance on the verification and management of designated free speech zones
- The City is coordinating with regional homeless response coalitions to ensure humane, compassionate, and lawful actions in the event of any intersection with the FIFA Dallas footprint
- Social media and other media platforms are being utilized to highlight and address multiple human rights initiatives and public awareness efforts tied to the World Cup

Dallas Sustainability and Community Impact Initiatives

The 2026 FIFA World Cup is more than just a sporting event—it's an opportunity for Dallas to lead by example in the global movement for environmental stewardship and social responsibility. Through collaboration with FIFA, local authorities, and the community, the FIFA World Cup 26 Dallas will set a new standard for sustainability in major international events. Together, we can make the FIFA World Cup 26 not only a historic moment in sport but also a pivotal milestone for a sustainable future.

- **Improve Air Quality & Urban Canopy:** Tree planting and air quality initiatives in Dallas neighborhoods
- **Create Green Youth Ambassadors:** Community education and Green Ambassador certifications with local schools
- **Divert and Manage Waste:** Improved recycling, composting, and waste strategies at events and facilities
- **Reduce Food Waste and Recover Food:** Collaboration with nonprofits to minimize food waste in Dallas
- **Activate Community Clean Ups & Nature Challenges:** City-led clean-ups and environmental challenges in parks and neighborhoods
- **Engage with Youth & Volunteers:** Programs and volunteer opportunities for youth in Dallas communities
- **Conserve Water Conservation:** Promoting water-efficient practices aligned with Dallas sustainability goals

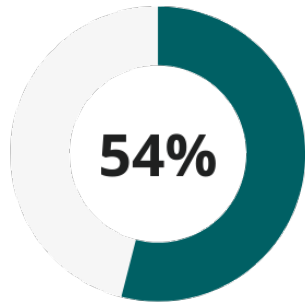

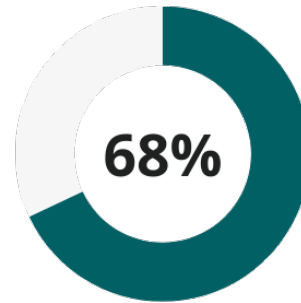
FIFA Dallas Visitor Demographics



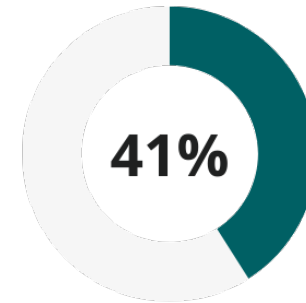
INTERNATIONAL VISITORS
INCL. NON-TICKET HOLDERS



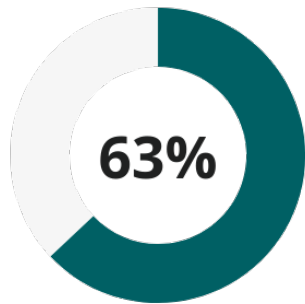
DAYS ON AVG INTERNATIONAL
VISITOR STAYS IN USA



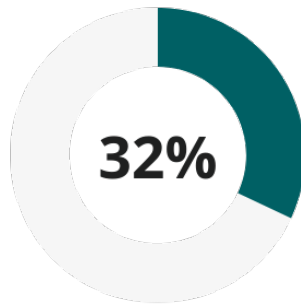
VISITORS OWNING A
CREDIT OR DEBIT CARD



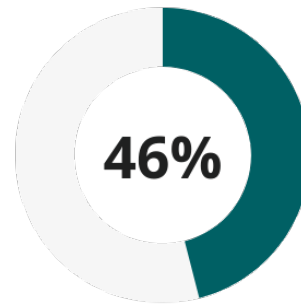
OF INTERNATIONAL

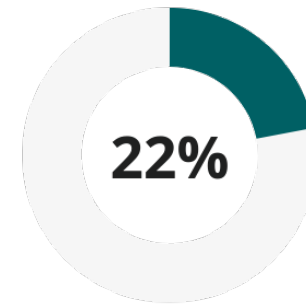
OF VISITORS ARE MALE

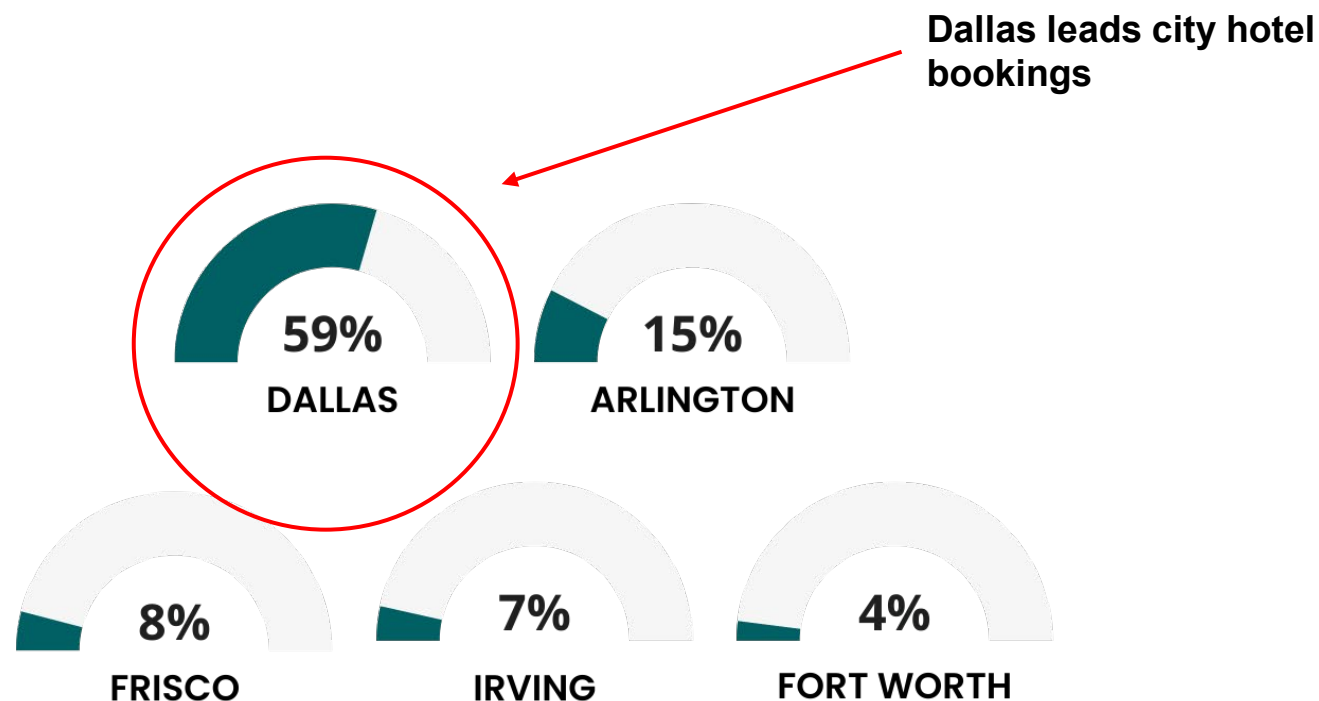

North Texas Accommodation Numbers

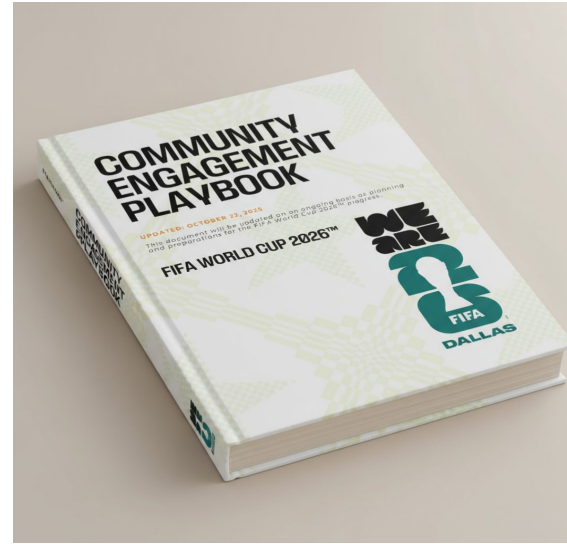
During the primary reservation period of May 15 - June 19, 2026, over 7,500 rooms have been reserved in the FIFA blocks. 60 hotels contracted in North Texas and **30 hotels within the city of Dallas**. *This does not include additional spectator or ancillary blocks.*
