## TIF Increment Transfer to Housing & Community Development Department for Homeowner Stabilization Programs

On September 25, 2024, City Council will be asked to consider a resolution that authorizes the Chief Financial Officer to annually transfer a portion of tax increment funding from the Oak Cliff Gateway Tax Increment Financing ("TIF") District, Fort Worth Avenue TIF District, and Deep Ellum TIF District to the City's Department of Housing and Community Development (HOU) to be deployed in the City's homeowner stabilization, home repair, and displacement mitigation programs in transitioning neighborhoods in and adjacent to the Oak Cliff Gateway TIF District, Fort Worth Avenue TIF District, and Deep Ellum TIF District as shown in **Exhibit A**.

Over the last year, the Office of Economic Development (OED) worked in collaboration with HOU, with input from the respective TIF district boards of directors, to determine the most effective approach for the use of these funds and the specific funding area geographies.

To make these funding transfers possible, City Council authorized amendments to the Oak Cliff Gateway TIF District Project Plan and Reinvestment Zone Financing Plan on November 9, 2022 (Resolution No. 22-1719; Ordinance No. 32354), the Fort Worth Avenue TIF District Project Plan and Reinvestment Zone Financing Plan on November 8, 2023 (Resolution No. 23-1598; Ordinance No. 32602), and the Deep Ellum TIF District Project Plan and Reinvestment Zone Financing Plan on February 28, 2024 Resolution No. 24-0397; Ordinance No. 32670). Each of the authorized amendments created budget capacity in each TIF district project plan and reinvestment zone financing plan to provide funding to programs benefitting eligible homeowners and residents of neighborhoods in and adjacent to each of these three TIF districts.

For the current fiscal year, the actual transfer amounts are estimated to be:

- \$2,546,726 from Oak Cliff Gateway TIF District
- \$912,287 from Fort Worth Avenue TIF District
- \$2,875,875 from Deep Ellum TIF District

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The total estimated budget capacity dedicated to homeowner stabilization, home repair, and displacement mitigation programs over the remaining term of each TIF district is:

Oak Cliff Gateway TIF District: estimated \$10,507,096 (not to exceed \$2,958,168 NPV)

Fort Worth Avenue TIF District: estimated \$16,070,868 (not to exceed \$6,315,196 NPV)

Deep Ellum TIF District: estimated \$13,445,178 (not to exceed \$6,672,064 NPV)

The transferred TIF district funds will provide additional funding support to the City's Housing & Community Development Department for implementation of the Dallas Housing Policy 2033 (DHP33) and the Dallas Housing Resource Catalog which includes the Dallas Homebuyer Assistance Program (DHAP) and the Home Improvement and Preservation Program (HIPP) adopted by City Council on April 13, 2023.


