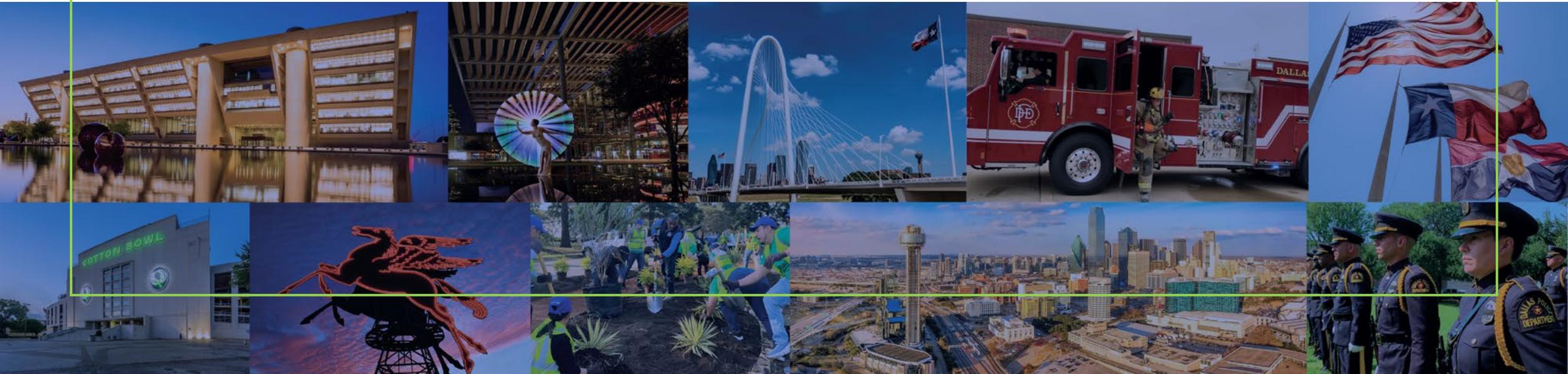

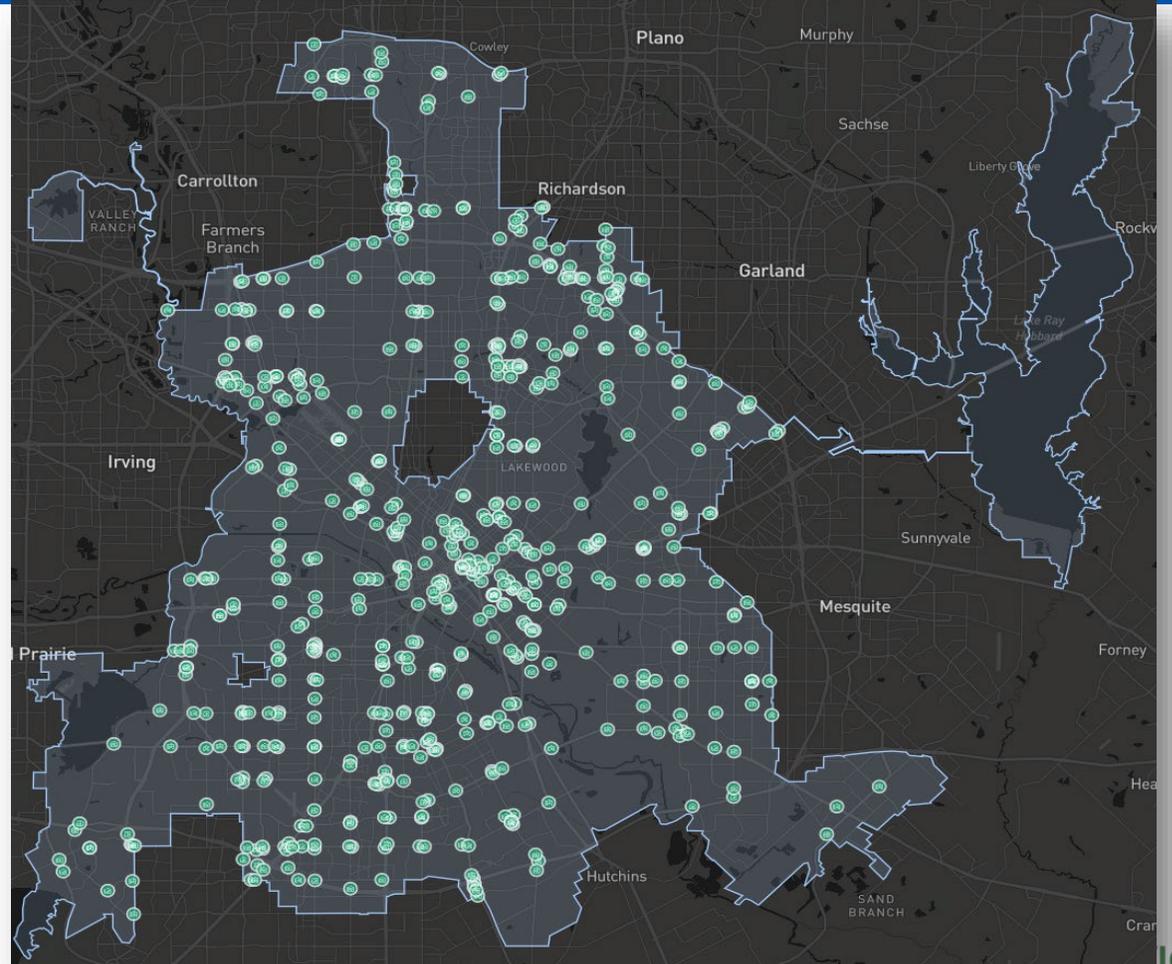

# Overview: *Summary of System*

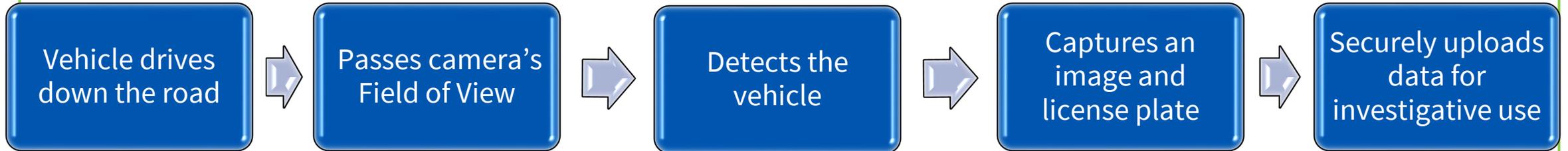
- Captures license plates and vehicle characteristics — not names, faces, or driver images.
- Cameras face only public rights-of-way, never private residences or property.
- Data is automatically purged after the retention period unless associated with an active investigation.

# Overview: *Summary of System*

- Locations are based on crime patterns and investigative value
- Priority placement along high-crime corridors and areas with repeat offender activity
- Supports deterrence, investigations, and rapid identification of vehicles tied to criminal activity.

# Program Objectives: *Real-time alerts*



## Real Time Alerts

Provide real-time alerts for vehicles linked to wanted persons, stolen property, or violent crimes.



## Aid Investigations

Enhance investigative efficiency by quickly identifying suspects and linked offenses.



## Increase Case Integrity

Increase case integrity with objective evidence

# Crime Impact: *System at work*

- I-75 and Walnut Hill Ln.
- DPD received a Flock ALPR alert for a stolen vehicle
- Officers located the stolen red GMC pickup parked within a nearby apartment complex.
- Four Individuals sitting in the GMC with facial coverings & gloves in 90°F heat
- Four modified firearms.
- One suspect wanted for Capital Murder (double homicide, March 2024)
