I. Call to Order & Roll Call

(Chairman John Mark Davidson)

Chairman Davidson calls the meeting to order at 5:36pm. He confirms a quorum and proceeds to take roll call of members present. Davidson, proceeds to the next agenda item.

II. Purpose of the CPOB

(Chairman John Mark Davidson)

- a. The mission of the Community Police Oversight Board (CPOB), formerly known as the Civilian Review Board, is to enhance the public's trust that complaints of misconduct against Dallas Police Department (DPD) employees are conducted fairly and thoroughly, are transparent and ensure the City of Dallas residents have an accessible means to the complaint process. To help ensure this accountability, the Office of Community Police Oversight (OCPO) provides functional support and technical assistance to the CPOB.

Chairman Davidson, opened the meeting, noting it was an official Community Police Oversight Board (CPOB) session open to the public under the Texas Open Meetings Act. Attendees were reminded to maintain order and respect; disruptive behavior would result in removal after one warning.

The Chair reaffirmed the Board's mission to build public trust by ensuring that complaints involving Dallas Police Department personnel are reviewed fairly and transparently, with support from the Office of Community Police Oversight (OCPO). The Board also aims to recognize positive conduct among officers.

Accessibility accommodations, including translation or sign language services, are available by contacting ocpo@dallas.gov at least 72 hours before meetings.

The meeting proceeded to Public Comment, allowing each speaker up to three minutes. The Chair reminded participants to stay on topic, avoid personal attacks or profanity, and direct comments to the Chair. Disruptive behavior may result in the loss of speaking privileges. The Chairman calls the first public speaker for item number III.

III. Public Comment/ Open Microphone

(3 Minutes Per Person)

- a. During the open microphone period at the beginning of each Board meeting, up to five people are allowed to speak. Those who wish to speak must register before the meeting begins. Speaker registration will open 15 minutes prior to the start of the Board meeting. Each person who speaks at a public meeting must state his or her name, address, and, if applicable, who he or she represents. The first five registered speakers will be called in the order they signed up to speak at the beginning of the meeting.

Monica Solis: Community member Monica Solis, a resident of District 3 (ZIP 75232), expressed concern regarding alleged collaboration between the Dallas Police

Department (DPD) and ICE. She referenced photos showing DPD and ICE presence at Hampton Station on August 22 near an elementary school, stating that such actions create fear in the community. Ms. Solis urged the Board and DPD to end any cooperation with ICE, citing incidents of ICE targeting families and workers in her district. She also voiced opposition to the use of Flock surveillance cameras, asserting that they are being used to aid ICE operations and further traumatize residents. She called on the Chief of Police to uphold the department's commitment to transparency and accountability by refusing to collaborate with ICE or grant access to surveillance systems.

Sam Williams: Community member Sam Williams, a resident of District 9, reported witnessing what he described as a suspected abduction in District 3 on October 3rd at 5:30 a.m. He stated that masked and armed individuals wearing gear labeled "Police" detained a person near a white van, though no marked squad cars were present. Mr. Williams submitted photos and audio recordings from the incident, noting that the individuals self-identified as police when questioned. After contacting the missing persons hotline and non-emergency line, he learned that no incident report had been logged. He expressed concern that ICE agents may be impersonating police officers or that DPD officers may be conducting operations without proper identification, both of which he described as serious violations of public trust and potentially of state law. Mr. Williams urged the Dallas Police Department and city leadership to adopt clear policies prohibiting collaboration with ICE or similar agencies, to document all interactions with federal entities, and to ensure accountability and transparency in such operations to protect Dallas residents.

Victor Macias: Community member Victor Macias, a U.S. Army veteran and resident of District 8, spoke in opposition to the proposed Dallas Police Academy at the UNT Dallas campus. He stated that, based on discussions with faculty and students, the majority on campus oppose the academy's establishment, particularly given the predominantly Hispanic and Black population in the area. Mr. Macias expressed skepticism toward claims that the academy would promote progressive policing, arguing instead that law enforcement often uses excessive force and escalates encounters. He also criticized recent statements by the Dallas Police Chief and legislative measures such as the 287(g) program and Texas Senate Bill 8, which he said expand cooperation between local law enforcement and ICE. He noted concerns about overcrowding in Dallas County jails and the potential financial burden on taxpayers due to rising incarceration rates. Mr. Macias urged city leaders to invest in community-based solutions including after-school programs, job training, and economic opportunities rather than increased police funding. He concluded that true public safety comes from investment in people and resources, not from expanding police infrastructure.

Mr. Pierre Whiteside was called to the podium for public comment. He approached and stated, "I actually yield back my time; I have no comment."

Next, **Deloris Philips** was called for public comment and was not present.

Aza Alvarez: Community member Aza Alvarez spoke about the growing fear among immigrant families in Dallas, stating that many residents are too afraid to attend public meetings due to concerns about law enforcement and immigration enforcement activities. Ms. Alvarez said she personally witnessed the incident discussed in a prior public comment and described how community members fled in fear but continue to live and work under anxiety. She urged the Board and the Dallas Police Chief to take a clear stance in support of residents rather than federal immigration agencies. Citing a 404 Media report, Ms. Alvarez expressed concern that Dallas Police Department officers had accessed Flock Safety camera data labeled under ICE and ERO (Enforcement and Removal Operations), which included searches across thousands of camera networks nationwide. She warned that such surveillance may be used for immigration lookups rather than local policing and referenced a separate Texas case involving the misuse of similar technology and data collection. Ms. Alvarez called for transparency and accountability regarding DPD's use of Flock camera data and its potential connection to immigration enforcement.

Chairman Davidson closed the Public Comment segment by stating that the community's voice matters and he appreciates their presence at the meeting.

V. CPOB Commends Police Officers Xavier Castillo and David Ferguson for Outstanding Community Service (Chairman John Mark Davidson)

- a. The Board will recognize Officers Xavier Castillo and David Ferguson for their compassion and dedication in assisting a homeless family in Dallas. Their actions connecting the family with shelter services and providing support beyond traditional law enforcement duties exemplify professionalism, empathy, and community service.

Chair Davidson informed attendees that the Office of Community Police Oversight (OCPO) website provides accessible options for both filing complaints and submitting commendations regarding Dallas Police Department officers. He emphasized the importance of recognizing not only concerns but also positive acts of service, kindness, and professionalism displayed by officers. The Chairman stated that the Board aims to highlight and commend exemplary conduct within the police department and announced the presentation of the Board's first official letter of commendation to Officer Xavier Castillo and Mr. Ferguson in recognition of their outstanding service.

Officer Castillo was not present. Officer Ferguson was able to accept the commendation, and a photo was taken with the Community Police Oversight Board.

Walter “Changa” Higgins, D3: Requests to make a comment from the chairman and the chairman obliges. Higgins, expressed appreciation for both the commendation of officers and the community members and activists who “show up and bring these issues to the forefront.” He stated that while the Board partners with the Dallas Police Department, its primary role is to provide oversight, emphasizing, “We are the Community Police Oversight Board... our job is to provide oversight.” Higgins concluded by commending community members for their courage and engagement in addressing concerns related to ICE and police practices.

Chairman Davidson proceeded to the next agenda item also giving instructions to board members that they will be allotted 3 min. of time each to address any questions for Chief Comeaux. Based on a recommendation by Board Member Friedman, D14 the board would address the chief based on seniority.

VI. A Dialogue with Chief Daniel Comeaux on Public Safety and Community Partnerships

- a. The Community Police Oversight Board will host a dialogue and questions and answers with Chief Comeaux on public safety and community partnerships. Topics may include DPD audit reports, OCPO access to police data, racial disparities in arrest reports, updates regarding the DPD law enforcement training center at UNT-Dallas, DPD’s emergency response times, staffing levels for DPD, DPD’s use of technology and drones, DPD’s coordination with state and federal agencies, and DPD’s role in federal immigration enforcement.

Ozzie Smith, D1 (Vice Chair): Vice Chairman Smith thanked Chief Comeaux and DPD staff for attending and opened the discussion by asking for an update on the voter-approved HERO Amendment, which mandates the Dallas Police Department (DPD) to employ a minimum of 4,000 officers by May 30, 2025. Chief Comeaux confirmed that the department currently has approximately 2,300 officers and recently launched the second-largest police academy class in DPD history, which also includes 20 women, the second-highest number of female recruits in a class. He stated that while reaching 4,000 officers will take time, DPD is on track, having already exceeded its goal of hiring 300 officers by reaching over 325 hires. Chief Comeaux added that the upcoming November academy class is projected to include more than 50 recruits, higher than previous years, and expressed confidence that the department will surpass its target of 350 hires in the next fiscal year. Board Member Smith thanked the Chief for the update and requested to reserve his remaining time to speak later in the meeting.

Branden Friedman, D14: Board Member Branden Friedman (District 14) thanked Chief Comeaux for attending and opened his remarks by expressing respect for the Dallas Police Department (DPD) and its officers, noting that “Dallas is a safer place than it was even just last year.” However, Friedman voiced deep concerns over DPD’s reported collaboration with ICE, citing recent news of a raid in Northwest Dallas where “multiple DPD units were involved.” He criticized ICE’s practices, calling them “a menace to society,” and questioned whether DPD’s cooperation with federal agencies may be coming at the expense of local response times, which he noted average 94 minutes for Priority Two calls, far exceeding the department’s 12-minute goal. Friedman asked pointedly, “Do you think it’s a wise use of officers’ time to assist ICE?”

Shouldn't ICE be given the lowest priority?" Chief Comeaux responded that the operation Friedman referenced was not an ICE immigration raid, but a federal human trafficking investigation involving "women who were being forced into prostitution." He clarified that DPD's role was limited to perimeter security and emphasized, "We had nothing to do from DPD as part of that investigation at all, other than protect the perimeter."

Comeaux stated that DPD has had "very little interaction with ICE on anything", explaining that much of the public concern stems from misinformation on social media. He said, "We'll run our units out there code one only to find out it's us with the U.S. Marshals arresting sex offenders, but someone is posting that it's ICE and it's not ICE." Chief Comeaux also revealed that the federal government recently offered DPD \$25 million to participate in the 287(g) program, which would formally involve DPD in immigration enforcement, but he personally declined the offer, stating, "Absolutely not that was me who said that." He concluded by urging against spreading fear or drawing unnecessary attention: "There's nothing happening in Dallas... every time we do something like this, we're bringing more attention to Dallas and we don't need that attention." Board Member Friedman acknowledged the Chief's clarification, replying, "Let's hope it stays that way."

Brian Bah, D5: Asked Chief Comeaux whether ICE officers wearing local police uniforms and identifying as Dallas police is occurring, noting concerns about similar cases elsewhere. He asked if such actions would be approved by DPD. Chief Comeaux responded emphatically: "That would never happen in Dallas...nor would that be legal." He confirmed he has not heard of this happening anywhere in the U.S. and stated he is very confident it has not occurred in Dallas and would not be condoned. Regarding concerns about "knock-in-question" federal cases where agents identify themselves as police, Comeaux clarified that while some federal agents may vocalize they are police in certain task forces, "none of that's happening here in Dallas." When asked directly if DPD uniforms could ever be used by federal agents, Comeaux stated: "We will not...a hundred percent...we will not, ever give our uniforms to any federal agent to do any type of enforcement. I can tell you that 100% will never happen."

Chairman Davidson: Thanked Mr. Bah for his questions.

Derric Pegram, D6: expressed concern about the fear experienced by children and parents in Pleasant Grove due to perceived confusion between police and ICE enforcement activities. He noted that young children can develop a fear of law enforcement when witnessing or hearing about detentions, saying, "The fear of a 5-year-old...their idea of a police...is very saddening." Pegram emphasized the importance of clear separation between DPD and ICE operations to ensure that children understand police as a positive presence and are not traumatized by enforcement actions. He stated, "I just pray that...you're not perpetuating that situation or that idea of what that looks like." Chief Comeaux responded, reiterating that "no one's going to be wearing a DPD uniform enforcing federal laws, it won't happen." Chairman Davidson acknowledged Mr. Pegram's comment, noting it was a statement rather than a question.

J. Victor Lander, D8: raised concerns about a video showing masked individuals wearing “Police” garb, asking Chief Comeaux whether this is illegal. Lander, a lawyer and former judge, stated, “I know that to be illegal,” and requested the video be reviewed again for the chief to see as the chief was not able to see it where he was in the chambers. Chief Comeaux explained that some units, such as narcotics or felony warrant teams, may wear police identification while covering their faces for operational safety and clarified: “That’s not illegal...we’ve arrested over 450 felony individuals responsible for over 2,300 arrests in the last three months.” Lander questioned whether any ICE raids were occurring within Dallas city limits with DPD assistance. Comeaux responded: “We have had no officers going out with ICE agents to make immigration arrests...we have not had that to this date.” Regarding potential future scenarios, Lander asked if DPD officers alleged to assist ICE in immigration enforcement would be acting improperly. Comeaux confirmed: “We as DPD are not doing any immigration enforcement. We don’t have the authority...nor have we done that, nor will we do that.” Finally, when asked if masked individuals wearing police garb would be breaking the law, Comeaux noted: “The federal government has said they are not breaking the law by doing that.” Lander concluded by thanking Chief Comeaux and yielding his time.

Walter “Changa” Higgins, D2: Raised detailed questions regarding DPD’s use of drones and Flock cameras, emphasizing civil liberties, privacy safeguards, and transparency. He cited DPD’s 130+ drone fleet with over 8,000 deployments in 2024, questioning how the department ensures compliance with the Texas Data Privacy and Security Act, particularly concerning video surveillance, warrants, and private property overflights. He also voiced concerns over potential data sharing with ICE and the accuracy of facial recognition systems, especially their bias against Black and Brown residents.

Executive Assistant Chief Monique Alex clarified that drone operations follow FAA rules and Texas Government Code 423, which prohibit recording without a felony warrant and aim to protect Fourth Amendment rights. She confirmed that DPD maintains a drone policy outlining approved uses, including felony warrants, protests, and large events, and agreed to provide the document to Director André for review.

Chief Comeaux added that drones have saved lives by reducing risks during SWAT operations, such as identifying suspects before officers enter buildings. He said community feedback has been largely positive, with many residents requesting drones as first responders. On Flock cameras, Chief Comeaux called them a major crime-fighting tool, citing examples where they helped capture murder suspects and prevent further killings, including one linked to a potential serial killer. He confirmed that ICE does not have access to Flock data unless a specific warrant is presented, and that the one past ICE-related request was for a human trafficking suspect, not immigration enforcement.

Higgins emphasized the board’s role in ensuring transparency and oversight, asking how the board could access usage and outcome data for drones and Flock cameras to “quantify whether the good outweighs the bad.”

Executive Chief Alex clarified that Flock does not use facial recognition, only rear license plate capture, and offered to work with Director André once Higgins clarifies what data he seeks.

Higgins also asked whether private companies have access to Flock data. Alex said she would verify, while Chief Comeaux explained that some private “repo” or towing services maintain their own license plate systems, separate from DPD’s network.

The discussion concluded with Chairman Davidson thanking Mr. Higgins as his time expired.

Jennifer King, D10: Board Member Jennifer King introduced herself as a longtime Dallas resident from District 10, representing the Hamilton Park and Lake Highlands areas. She described her district as diverse, vibrant, and multilingual, noting that local children speak over 30 languages and attend Richardson ISD schools. King praised DPD officers serving in local schools for keeping students safe, but acknowledged that fear and distrust toward police remain in some communities. She asked how DPD plans to build trust and “reach out to communities living in fear” through new or enhanced community engagement efforts.

Chief Comeaux responded that the department is committed to maintaining its Neighborhood Police Officer (NPO) program, emphasizing that while some cities have eliminated such roles, DPD will not. He described NPOs as essential to education, awareness, and relationship-building, noting that they engage directly with residents and businesses to prevent crime through education rather than enforcement. He stated, “If I can give you education and awareness and stop you from committing a crime, that’s a win for me.” King expressed support for community policing and asked about DPD’s recent recruiting success, specifically how many new hires speak multiple languages.

Chief Comeaux said that in the most recent academy class of 77 recruits, approximately 50% were Latino, about 20 were women, and roughly 20 were African American, reflecting strong diversity in hiring, though he did not have exact data on language skills.

King then highlighted a boxing gym in District 10 that effectively engages youth and asked about other youth outreach programs with similar goals.

Chief Comeaux commended the boxing initiative and mentioned the new park being built nearby. He said he plans to expand and promote DPD’s Explorer Program, calling it a “gateway to recruiting” and a positive way to connect young people with law enforcement through education, mentorship, and competitions.

King closed by thanking Chief Comeaux, expressing appreciation for DPD’s efforts, and emphasizing the importance of ensuring residents “feel safe and not targeted” amid current challenges.

Timothy Jackson, D7: Thanked Chief Comeaux for attending and urged him to continue engaging with the Board “preferably on a quarterly basis.” He shifted focus to the public safety of appointed officials, stating they “don’t have the same protections as elected officials.” Jackson recounted a recent personal incident in which he was assaulted twice by a community member during and after a public safety meeting on

October 2, expressing concern that both offenders were only charged with Class C misdemeanors.

Jackson said, “People who sit on these boards don’t really have the protection that we should have,” and emphasized that “threats and harassment toward board members should not be acceptable.” He urged DPD to consider stronger charges or added protections for appointed officials who are assaulted or threatened due to their public service.

Executive Chief Alex responded that DPD must follow the Texas Penal Code, noting that a Class A assault charge can be applied “if pain is felt,” regardless of a person’s title. He clarified that special protections exist for certain elected officials, but not for appointed ones, and encouraged board members to request extra patrols from local substations if they have safety concerns.

Jackson reiterated that despite informing officers “even with the pain, if you will”, a higher charge was not filed. He warned, “We serve our city and shouldn’t be in fear that if we vote a certain way, we won’t be protected the same way someone else will.”

Executive Chief Alex agreed, stating, “I don’t disagree with appointed officials, but there’s currently no statute or policy providing additional protection for them.”

Chairman Davidson thanked Mr. Jackson for his questions.

Mary Ellen Smith, D11: Attending her first Board meeting, expressed appreciation to Chief Comeaux for his presence and remarks. She stated, “It’s good to hear what you plan for the city and what you’re looking to do for the city. I really appreciate it.”

Julia A Simon, D13: Newly appointed to the Board, thanked Chief Comeaux for attending and posed two questions: first, about his key priorities for strengthening police–community relations, and second, how DPD prepares officers to engage with a community influenced by misinformation or “fake videos.”

Chief Comeaux explained that he and his command staff actively engage with community groups, particularly Latino organizations, to dispel false rumors and clarify DPD’s independence from federal agencies. He emphasized that DPD officers are trained to remain professional and calm under pressure, citing that “Dallas Police Department is one of the best in the United States” and highlighting the department’s exceptional training and professionalism during protests.

Simon followed up, asking how DPD addresses public misperceptions when the Chief cannot be everywhere personally. Comeaux responded that about 40 command staff members and neighborhood patrol officers regularly attend community events to “put the word out there,” maintaining direct communication with local leaders to reinforce trust and transparency.

Jonathan Maples, D2: Thanked Chief Comeaux for attending and reaffirmed his strong support for community policing, commending the department for retaining Neighborhood Patrol Officers (NPOs). He emphasized that personal relationships between officers and residents “bring down the temperature of any situation,” noting his close collaboration with NPOs in his district.

Chief Comeaux agreed, adding that he encourages residents and officers to exchange direct contact information to strengthen trust and reduce misinformation, saying it's "so important to build those relationships rather than rely on social media for answers."

Maples then discussed the issue of transparency regarding DPD's role in ICE operations, to which Chief Comeaux clarified that in a recent case, DPD's involvement was limited to perimeter security during a human trafficking and prostitution operation, with no direct participation in enforcement actions.

Maples also raised concerns about sex trafficking in Northwest Dallas, urging DPD to maintain enhanced safety measures implemented for major events like FIFA beyond those events.

Lastly, Maples expressed deep concern about racial disparities in DPD arrest data, stating that "over 75% of arrests each month are of Black and Brown people." He urged DPD to investigate the cause, whether due to over-policing or inequitable enforcement, and asked Chief Comeaux to "get to the bottom of why those numbers look like that."

Chairman John Mark Davidson, D15: thanked Chief Comeaux for attending and echoed the Board's appreciation, stating, "It's not lost on us that you're here... these conversations are healthy, and the community needs to hear them." He invited the Chief to return for continued dialogue and asked if he wished to address any misconceptions or false information circulating about DPD.

Chief Comeaux responded by outlining key departmental efforts:

- The crime reduction plan remains in place, with an increased focus on arresting individuals with felony warrants, which he credited for the decline in violent crime.
- During Domestic Violence Awareness Month, DPD made over 100 domestic violence arrests in the first eight days, emphasizing the need for education and community engagement to prevent such crimes.
- Enhanced traffic enforcement based on council district input has contributed to 32 fewer traffic fatalities and 40 fewer murders this year, meaning "70 fewer families grieving."
- The Chief reaffirmed that Neighborhood Patrol Officers (NPOs) will remain in place to support community trust.
- He also announced plans to hire civilian investigators for the Internal Affairs Division to strengthen transparency and reduce bias, noting that the program will begin as a pilot initiative.
- Comeaux stressed accountability, saying, "When we do bad, I'll stand up and say we did bad. When we do good, I want you to know it," adding he has terminated 13–15 officers for misconduct since taking office.

Chairman Davidson concluded by thanking Chief Comeaux for his candor and commitment to transparency, inviting him to return for future discussions. The Chief humorously closed by saying he was heading to get "a turkey leg from the fair."

VII. Discussion of disqualifying factors for recruits during the hiring process with DPD (Executive Assistant Chief of Police Monique Alex)

Chairman Davidson introduced the next agenda item by referencing a prior question from Board Member Higgins, noting: “Board Member Higgins asked if the Board could receive a summary outlining what types of misconduct would or would not disqualify an applicant from being considered for employment with DPD.” He explained that this matter was being addressed today and that a response had been committed to by the department.

Executive Deputy Chief Alex reported on applicants with prior law enforcement experience from 2024 through September 20, 2025, noting:

- Applicants: 30 applied; 7 passed, 17 failed, 2 withdrew, 14 currently in background.
- Disqualifiers: Applicants are ineligible if previously rejected or terminated from a law enforcement agency for conduct violating DPD rules, or if they admit to such conduct.
- Common causes of failure: Use of force violations, sexual conduct, intoxication, sexual harassment, lying to a supervisor, DWIs, and administrative violations. Conduct at a previous agency that would violate DPD rules could result in failure.
- Background process: Investigators review prior agencies’ personnel files. Any conduct that would result in DPD termination disqualifies the applicant.
- Additional steps: Passing the background does not guarantee hire; applicants must still complete psychological and medical exams, and polygraph issues can arise due to prior conduct.

Chief Alex concluded by opening the floor for questions regarding these disqualifiers for applicants with prior law enforcement experience.

Walter “Changa” Higgins (D3): inquired about the Brady List and its implications for DPD hiring practices.

Deputy Chief Monique Alex clarified that the Brady List is maintained by the county, not DPD, and includes officers with questionable conduct (e.g., dishonesty or falsifying reports). Placement requires meeting specific thresholds, and officers may be added or removed depending on case outcomes. While some DPD officers appear on the list, they cannot testify or serve in public-facing or investigative roles.

Alex also explained that new TCOLE regulations (as of September 2024) prevent officers with sustained misconduct from transferring to other law enforcement agencies within Texas.

Board Member Jonathan Maples (D2) asked whether being on the list constitutes an integrity issue and how such officers remain employed. Alex confirmed that sustained allegations, such as untruthfulness, require disclosure in court but do not always result in termination; the record remains permanent.

Chairman Davidson: closed the discussion after confirming there were no further questions.

Deputy Chief Alex committed to follow up next month on (1) DPD's drone policy and (2) policies on charges involving violence toward appointed officials, following a concern raised by Board Member **Timothy Jackson (D7)** about his personal experience in a related matter.

Alex confirmed she will attend all future meetings, as the Internal Affairs Division (IAD) now reports directly to her.

- VIII. Internal Affairs Division (IAD) Report (Major Juan Salas)**
- a. The Internal Affairs Division (IAD) provides briefings on the Dallas Police Department and IAD activities, and continued collaboration and partnerships with the OCPO and CPOB.

Major Juan Salas: thanked the Board and shared that as of August 3, paperwork had been submitted to create three new senior civilian investigative positions within IAD. He emphasized these roles will be filled by external candidates with approximately 20 years of investigative experience, ensuring highly qualified personnel join the unit.

He noted that the division continues efforts to fill an existing vacancy and that all necessary paperwork for these positions has been completed. Salas concluded by inviting any questions from the Board.

Timothy Jackson, D7: Commended the plan to hire outside investigators but raised concerns about their background and objectivity. He asked whether the new hires would be former police officers who might defend their peers or individuals with specialized Internal Affairs (IA) training. Jackson noted the importance of credibility, emphasizing that those with prior IA experience would bring greater trust and independence to the role.

Major Juan Salas: Explained that the new civilian investigative positions will have strict qualifications, including a bachelor's degree in criminal justice, at least 20 years of law enforcement experience, and a minimum of three years in a leadership role within a large public sector organization.

Timothy Jackson, D7: Board Member Jackson acknowledged the public's likely perception that the department may be "hiring more cops to look out for other cops." He emphasized the importance of clarity and transparency, asking again whether the incoming investigators will have prior Internal Affairs experience, as their professional philosophy and approach would differ from those without such a background.

Major Juan Salas: Expressed this will be up to the public as the applicants will actually go through all the different filters to get hired.

J. Victor Lander, D8: followed up on Jackson's concern, noting that Internal Affairs experience was not listed among the job requirements. He asked Major Salas to include prior Internal Affairs experience as a qualification for the new civilian investigator positions. Major Salas agreed to do so, confirming he would add that requirement to the job criteria.

Jonathan Maples, D2: Asked about the hiring timeline and qualifications for the new civilian investigator positions. Major Salas stated the paperwork was submitted on October 3 and that applicants must have 20 years of law enforcement experience and three years in a leadership role within a large public sector organization.

Maples noted that with that level of experience, candidates would likely come from outside Dallas or even out of state, adding that "after 20 years, police work is still the same game." He acknowledged community concerns about impartiality but concluded by saying the board would "depend on you guys to get it right, and we will support."

IX. Office of Community Police Oversight Staff Report

a. Directors' Report

(Michele Andre)

Update with highlights of Commission and staff activities since September 9, 2025, and a report on internal operations, staffing, the FY 2025-26 budget, attendance at the 2025 NACOLE Annual Conference, upcoming events, and meetings.

Director Michele Andre: Director Andre reported that she had provided the board with a memo outlining accomplishments and goals, including updates from the previous meeting and a draft Standard Operating Procedure for board feedback. She stated, "I wanted to make sure, before finalizing that document, I received some feedback from the board. If you have any questions on the memo, I'm here to answer any questions."

Chairman Davidson noted this was a special meeting aligned with the start of the fiscal year and explained that upcoming staff reports would provide a "year at a glance" review of accomplishments. No board questions were raised at that time.

Jonathan Maples, D2: Praised the Director and staff, stating, "Well done to you and your staff. This board has come a long way, and I want to give you your flowers."

J. Victor Lander, D8: Judge Lander reviewed the initial draft of the policies and procedures created by Director Andre and stated they were "excellent, well done." He noted he would conduct a more detailed legal review but praised the work, emphasizing: "It's amazing to me that the office never had that before... I'm very glad to see that. So thank you to you, not just to you, but your staff."

b. Special Investigator Report

(Investigator Greg Huff)

i. Briefing on FY 2024-2025 Complaint, Investigation, and Critical Incident Activities

Special Investigator Greg Huff reported that OCPO conducted six independent investigations and reviewed 19 investigation requests during the fiscal year, all of which were completed in compliance with City Code and DPD General Orders to ensure objectivity and fairness. He noted improved cooperation, citing an officer who voluntarily participated in an interview.

Huff stated there were nine critical incidents reviewed by the Board, with one formal critical incident review completed and findings to be presented that evening.

The office reviewed 1,317 complaints, assessing them through body-worn camera footage, reports, and documentation, and reviewed approximately 80 Internal Affairs and division referrals to confirm investigations met thoroughness and legal standards.

Chairman Davidson, opens up the segment for any questions

Walter “Changa” Higgins, D3: inquired about year-over-year complaint comparisons. Investigator Huff stated that the 1,317 complaints were comparable to the previous fiscal year. Director Andre added it represented a slight reduction and offered to provide detailed figures via email.

Chairman Davidson then confirmed there were no further questions from the Board.

ii. Critical Incident Briefing

1. **September 22, 2025, Death in Custody** – Dallas Police responded to a call regarding a shooting in the 1600 block of S. Hampton Rd. The preliminary investigation determined that the suspect was attempting to enter a home, when one shot was fired. Upon officers’ arrival, the suspect was arrested for criminal mischief and transported to a local hospital by Dallas Fire Rescue for a superficial injury. After receiving medical treatment, Dallas police transported the suspect to Lew Sterrett Jail. While there, the suspect suffered a medical emergency and was transported by Dallas Fire Rescue to a local hospital, where he was pronounced deceased.

Video is presented regarding the critical incident for the board to review during this agenda item.

The board exchanged comments and questions regarding the video while it was playing. Questions included what happened at the hospital, the type of intoxication.

Chairman Davidson, opens up the segment for any questions

Walter “Changa” Higgins, D3: Asked if the Board could vote to have the Office investigate a case before the official investigation concluded. Director Andre clarified that while the Board may vote, the Office cannot begin its review until all administrative and criminal investigations are complete, per ordinance. She noted that the Office continues to monitor such cases and provides updates, including video, at subsequent meetings.

Jonathan Maples, D2: raised a related question about medical procedures for individuals taken to hospitals while under arrest or in distress, citing a recent incident involving a community member’s death. Major Salas responded that DPD’s responsibility is to ensure medical care is provided, but hospital protocols determine treatment and release decisions.

Chairman Davidson then confirmed there were no further questions from the Board.

iii. Consideration of Critical Incident Review

- 1. OCPO reports to the Board at the conclusion of both the criminal and administrative investigations of critical incidents, attesting to whether the criminal investigation was thorough, objective, impartial, and consistent with appropriate investigative protocols.**

- a. CN2024-002**

- i. On July 25, 2023, around 11:00 am, Dallas Police officers observed a stolen U-Haul truck in plain clothes. A second stolen U-Haul arrived, noticed the officers, and backed into a patrol vehicle, disabling it. The truck sped away, pursued by uniformed officers, and deliberately collided with vehicles and a tree on Lemmon Ave. The driver fled on foot onto Love Field, where Senior Corporal Craven chased him, and the driver fired two rounds. Craven returned fire, hitting the driver once in the knee. The driver dropped his gun, was arrested, and taken to the hospital; he survived. No officers were shot.

Discussion for this item was prompted by Chairman Davidson and discussed by the board. Prior to voting, a recommendation was proposed and a final question.

Branden Friedman, D14: Suggested that when the Board makes recommendations to the Police Chief, they include a specific response deadline, such as 30 days, to track how often recommendations are implemented or ignored. Director André noted that, for the current recommendation, a 60-day timeline was given.

Walter “Changa” Higgins, D3: Asked if the ordinance already requires a response timeframe, and Director André clarified that it only mandates acknowledgment of receipt, not a specific deadline for response.

c. Policy Analyst Report

(Policy Analyst Siara Obasuyi)

i. Legislative Briefings

1. Briefing presentation on the 89th Texas Legislature - Post Session Review.

Policy Analyst Siara Obasuyi presented a briefing on the 89th Texas Legislative Session, noting that over 9,000 bills were filed, with 1,231 becoming law. Of 13 bills tracked by OCPO, four passed and nine failed. The enacted bills addressed oversight board eligibility (SB 1957), use of less-lethal weapons (SB 2570), officer exemptions in deadly conduct cases (SB 1637), and expanded ICE partnerships (SB 8). OCPO also submitted two amendments during special sessions on officer personnel record transparency, though none passed. Looking ahead, OCPO will monitor DPD's policy updates, engage the community on new laws, and prepare for the 90th legislative session.

ii. Briefing on FY 2024-2025 Policy Research and Recommendations

Policy Analyst Siara Obasuyi reported that during FY 2024–2025, OCPO completed twelve formal policy recommendations aimed at improving accountability, transparency, and public trust with DPD. Key initiatives included amending the ordinance to allow a designee to handle critical incidents when the director is unavailable, enhancing complaint process transparency, updating public-facing materials for accessibility, clarifying DPD's "guilt or innocence" complaint policy, and expanding the mediation program for community-based resolution. OCPO also engaged in state legislative efforts, observed DPD de-escalation training for policy insight, and will publish all policy recommendations and their status on the OCPO website.

d. Briefing on the FY 2024-2025 Communications and Engagement Initiatives (Communication Advisor Waldir Guerrero)

Communications Advisor Waldir Guerrero presented the FY 2024–2025 communications report, highlighting major achievements in transparency, outreach, and organizational efficiency. Key accomplishments included launching the quarterly OCPO newsletter with record engagement, developing a media response statement, enhancing public awareness through outreach materials and events, and improving internal coordination with new tracking tools and stakeholder lists. Guerrero also created visual and digital resources such as meeting timers, video bumpers, and redesigned agendas to strengthen professionalism and public engagement. Upcoming initiatives include a CPOB University Awareness Campaign and new onboarding materials for board members. The Board commended Guerrero for his significant contributions and visible impact on improving community engagement and communication.

e. Community Engagement Report (Sr. Outreach Specialist Alma Perez)
i. Briefing on FY 2024-2025 Community Engagement by Council District

Senior Outreach Specialist, Alma Perez: Presented highlights from OCPO’s recent and upcoming community engagement efforts, emphasizing outreach, partnerships, and visibility across Dallas.

Key Highlights:

- **Community Engagement:** Participated in major events such as DISD FAMJAM, DPD’s ACT Community Fair, and the Di LOLAS Cancer Awareness Walk, reaching thousands of residents and fostering collaboration with multiple city departments and nonprofits.
- **Citywide Outreach:** Attended over 90 community events during FY 2024–2025, strengthening trust and awareness of OCPO’s mission.
- **Targeted Programs:** Hosted bilingual workshops and family events in high-need areas like Vickery Meadow and District 8, promoting dialogue and empowerment.
- **Digital Expansion:** Launched official Facebook and Instagram pages in 2025 to improve accessibility, visibility, and public education.
- **Partnership Impact:** Recognized strong collaborations with organizations such as the All-Stars Project and Dallas County Health Department.

Looking Ahead:

OCPO plans to expand bilingual outreach, enhance digital communication, and deepen partnerships with community organizations to maintain transparency and engagement.

On August 1, 2025, Michael Polsky submitted a complaint to the Dallas Police Department with the following allegations:

3. Officers refused to tell Polsky where his child was taken to.
4. Officers did not recognize Polsky as the conservator of his child.

Internal Affairs Division Preliminary Review

The Internal Affairs Division forwarded this complaint to the Officer's Patrol Division to investigate. The complaint was assigned to Division Referral number DR2025-084. Lt. Verhalen was assigned to this investigation.

Lt. Verhalen interviewed Michael Polsky and learned of his complaint. Lt. Verhalen then interviewed the sergeant and 5 officers. Lt. Verhalen also reviewed Body-Worn Camera footage for each of the officers involved in the incident. Lt. Verhalen then interviewed Agent Polar of Texas Child Protective Services.

Lt. Verhalen concluded that officers completed a thorough investigation. Lt. Verhalen's finding for the allegation of improper or no investigation was **UNFOUNDED** for all the officers involved.

Texas Department of Family and Protective Services

The Texas Department of Family and Protective Services concluded its investigation into allegations of abuse that occurred on 7/25/25. The department's findings for allegations of medical neglect and physical abuse were both **RULED OUT**. A finding of ruled out means it was reasonable to conclude that the alleged abuse or neglect did not occur.

OCPO Preliminary Review

On September 24, 2025, Michael Polsky submitted an Independent Review Request to the Office of Community Police Oversight. The OCPO conducted a preliminary investigation and did not find any violations of Dallas Police Department policies.

On August 17, 2025, Senrick Wilkerson submitted a complaint to the Dallas Police Department and made the following allegations:

- Wilkerson complained of being falsely accused of rape.
- Wilkerson advised that false arrest warrants were issued on November 29, 2010, and then dismissed on the same date.
- Wilkerson complained that the Dallas Police Department failed to exercise due diligence when he was arrested on those fraudulent warrants.
- Wilkerson further alleged that he was illegally forced into a sham and illegal trial where he was illegally convicted on sex charges.

Internal Affairs Division Preliminary Review

The Internal Affairs Division sent a letter to Wilkerson dated October 1, 2025, advising that no investigation would be conducted due to a determination that there was no violation of departmental policies or procedures. The letter went on to note that this was

also a duplicate complaint that had been submitted on December 26, 2023, and had not been investigated for the same reasons.

A review of Internal Affairs records showed that Wilkerson has made 14 similar complaints to the Dallas Police Department since 2011. None of the prior complaints have been investigated past the preliminary review stage.

OCPO Preliminary Review

On October 9, 2025, Senrick Wilkerson submitted an Independent Review Request to the OCPO, in which he complained about his illegal conviction based on the use of falsified government documents by the Dallas Police Department. OCPO's preliminary review concurs with the Internal Affairs Division's determination that there are no policy violations and no duplicate complaints. The OCPO also recognizes this complaint as being filed 60 days after the date of occurrence, and it involves being a guilt or innocence issue to be determined by the courts.

On September 27, 2024, police responded to an unresponsive male inside an apartment. Police arrived and located a 19-year-old male lying halfway on the bed, face down. Dallas Fire Rescue found no signs of life, and the male was declared deceased at the scene. A handgun was found on the floor. The handgun did not contain any rounds, and

a spent shell casing was found under a pillow that was on the ground. The Medical Examiner moved the body, and a gunshot wound to the abdomen was observed.

Digital messages from the night before revealed the victim discussing what to do with his gun if he ever shot himself. The victim also discussed what to do with his pets.

Internal Affairs Division Preliminary Review

The Internal Affairs Division conducted a preliminary review and sent a letter to Lynn Roth dated September 19, 2025. The letter stated in part:

We determined that there was no violation of departmental policies or procedures, and no investigation is warranted.

OCPO Preliminary Review

On October 10, 2025, Lynn Roth submitted a request for an independent review of her complaint. Roth also submitted emails between her and Detective Clark explaining why the handgun was released to Roth. The Office of Community Police Oversight conducted a preliminary review and found no evidence of a violation of departmental policies or procedures. The OCPO concurs with the Internal Affairs Division's review.

Plautz was stopped and arrested for family violence. After being arrested, Plautz admitted that her children (ages 8 years, 6 years, and 6 months) had been left home alone. The 8-year-old and 6-year-old were released to the care of Child Protective

Services. The 6-month-old was released to their father (complainant Mackenzie Engrum). Plautz was also arrested for abandoning her children and for a traffic warrant.

BWC – Officer Muhummud

- 23:02:25 Officers begin to ask Plautz questions after she has been detained. Plautz states she wants to “execute” her 5th amendment right.
- 23:07:08 Plautz again mentions her 5th amendment right. Officers place Plautz in custody for family violence.
- 23:09:30 Plautz is searched incident to arrest.
- 23:14:00 Officers learned that the children are home alone.

SUBJECT **Complaints Received from October 1, 2025, to October 31, 2025**

This memorandum provides a summary of complaints received and resolved by OCPO in October 2025. From **October 1 to October 31, 2025**, the **Office of Community Police Oversight (OCPO)** received a total of **88 complaints**. Each complaint undergoes an initial review by OCPO, in collaboration with the **Dallas Police Department's Internal Affairs Division (IAD)**, to determine the appropriate type of investigation:

Investigation Types

- **Control Number (CN):**
For allegations that could result in a written reprimand or higher. Investigated by the Internal Affairs Division.
- **Division Referral (DR):**
For less severe allegations that may result in corrective actions such as Advice and Instruction, Documented Counseling, or a Supervisor's Report of Correction. Investigated by the officer's division.
- **No Investigation (NI):**
For cases that will not be investigated by IAD (e.g., allegations submitted after 60 days or failing to meet legal requirements).
- **Public Integrity (PI):**
For allegations of criminal conduct by police officers. These are investigated by the **Public Integrity Unit**. All complaints that may rise to the level of a criminal offense, including anonymous submissions, are forwarded to this unit.
- **Administrative Inquiry Investigation:**
Investigations into misconduct or improper police handling may be needed even without formal complaints. This includes cases involving unidentified employees, vague allegations, City Manager referrals, third-party claims, anonymous criminal activity reports, directives from leadership, and instances where the complainant may be untruthful.

Reasons for No Investigation (NI)

- **Does Not Meet Criteria:** Complainant refused to provide a written statement (per TX GC 614.022)
- **Duplicate Complaint:** Allegation already under review or previously addressed.
- **Failure to Articulate:** No clear allegation of misconduct provided.
- **Guilt or Innocence:** Complaint challenges legal guilt, not officer conduct
- **Information Only:** Request for or provision of unrelated information
- **More Information Needed:** Insufficient information to proceed.
- **No Violation:** Preliminary review finds no policy violation.
- **No Violation (BWC):** Body Worn Camera review confirms no misconduct.
- **Non-Employee:** Complaint involves a non-DPD individual.
- **Sixty Day:** Complaint received more than 60 days after the incident with no good cause.
- **Third Party:** Complainant was not a victim or witness of the incident.

Complaint Classification Summary

The **88** complaints received, and pending were categorized as follows:

- **18** classified as *No Investigation (NI)*
- **3** classified as *Division Referral (DR)*
- **5** classified as *Control Number (CN)*
- **1** classified as *Public Integrity (PI)*
- **62** complaints are *pending determination*

Non-Pending Complaints

The remaining complaints (those already reviewed) were further categorized:

- **9** classified as *No Violation (BWC)*
- **4** classified as *Division Referral (DR)*

Completed Cases

During the month of October 2025, there were **22** cases in which an investigation was completed.

Breakdown of Completed Cases:

- **17** cases classified as *Division Referral (DR)*
- **5** cases classified as *Control Number (CN)*

Completed Cases Findings

- 1 case was listed as *Exonerated*
- **11** cases were listed as *Unfounded*
- 2 cases were listed as *Not Sustained*
- **7** cases were listed as *Sustained*
- 1 case was listed as *Complete*

Most Common Allegations:

- **Improper or No Investigation: 12** occurrences
- **Discourtesy/Unprofessionalism: 6** occurrences
