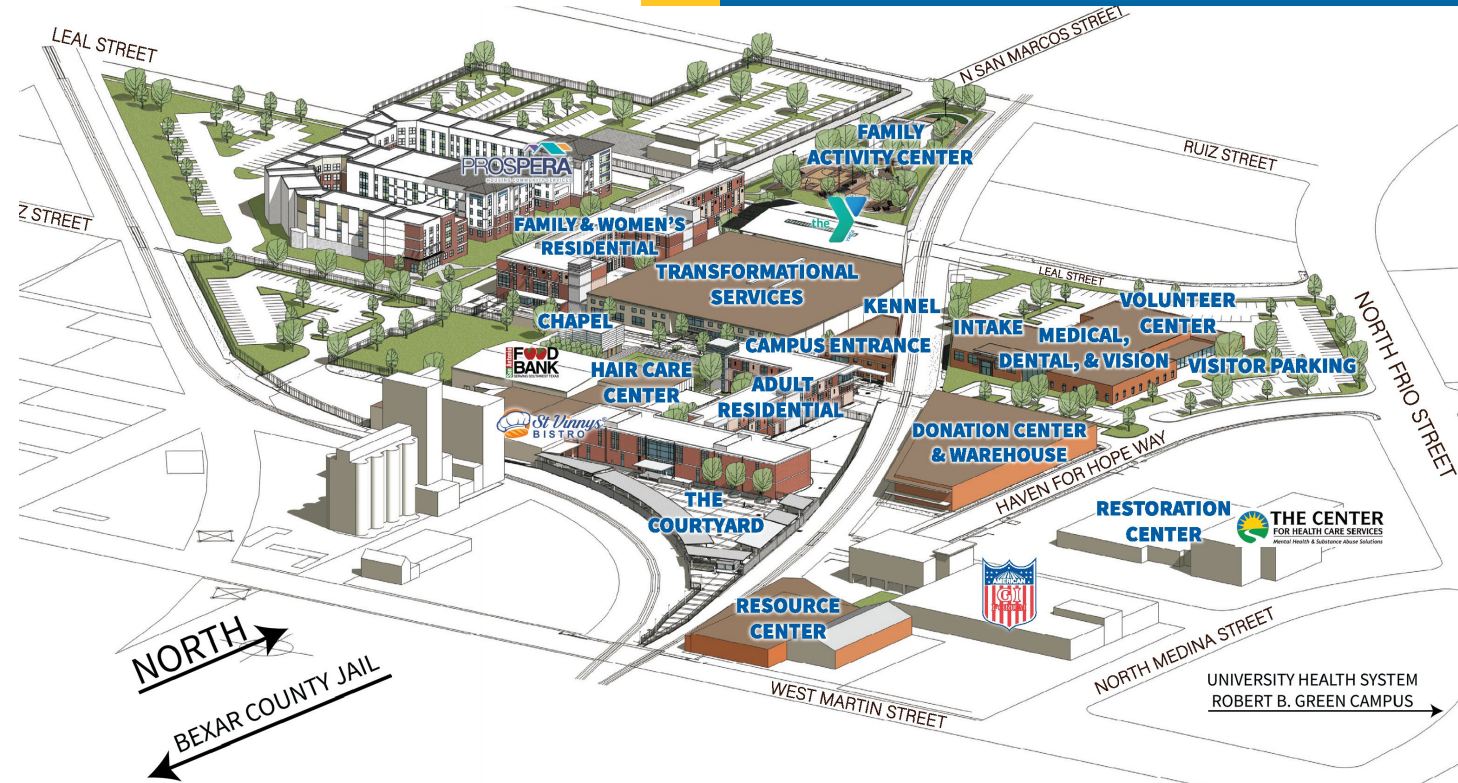


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Haven for Hope

History

- In 2006, with homelessness on the rise, San Antonio Mayor Phil Hardberger asked the business community for support. Business and civic leader Bill Greehey stepped up and began the effort to create Haven for Hope as an independent 501(c)3 nonprofit organization.
- The campus became fully operational in June 2010. Mr. Greehey is still an active participant in with Haven and serves as Chairman Emeritus of the Board of Directors.



Haven's Options for Clients



North Campus Transformational Services Our Residential Program

- Average stay of 4 months, but can stay as long as needed
- Dorm-style residential living
- Have a U.S. state or government-issued photo ID
- Be a resident of Bexar County with proof of residency for at least 12 months in the past two years
- Clients commit to sobriety while on campus
- Clients are active with employment and housing plans
- Individuals and families reside here



South Campus Our Low Barrier Shelter

- Average stay of 2 months, but clients can stay as long as needed
- Everyone sleeps indoors year-round
- Have a U.S. state or government-issued ID
- Connected to housing, employment & all services needed through the Resource Center
- Clients can remain active in their addictions, but are not allowed to use at Haven
- No minors allowed

Haven's Impact on Homelessness

Key Statistics

- In 2024, Haven for Hope served 9,843 unduplicated individual clients. Since opening in 2010, Haven has served more than 53,000 clients
- In 2024, Haven served 1,388 children and 611 family households
- We served 508 Veterans and 820 Young Adults

- The average length of stay is 98 days on the N. Campus; 27 days on S. Campus
- 593 clients secured jobs in 2024
- 80% of South Campus clients stay less than 30 days

Trauma-Informed Agency

- Haven integrates this Trauma-Informed Care Policy holistically in its service provision and daily operations, whether on campus, in the community, or in our daily interactions with one another. Through this policy, Haven affirms its accountability to provide a universal trauma-informed approach which assumes that every individual has experienced trauma of one form or another and works to cultivate a culture and environment that supports healing and recovery to avoid inadvertent re-traumatization.
