- Began operation in 2018.
- Currently, under the Patrol Alpha Bureau and located at the Southeast Patrol Division.
- Responsible for all citizens complaints and offense that occur in the city of Dallas.
- Animal Cruelty Unit is staffed with:
  - 1 Sergeant
  - 5 Detectives

- Forensic examinations on all animals suspected of animal cruelty.
- Necropsies on dead animals to obtain evidence for prosecution.
- Veterinarian statements for courtroom testimony for each suspected animal cruelty case

#### Overview



- Animal Cruelty includes many types of mistreatment from failing to provide essential care to the torture or the malicious killing of an animal.
- Animal cruelty correlates with other acts of violent behavior. Studies have suggested animal cruelty is a sentinel indicator of other types of maltreatment or abuse such as family violence, child and elder abuse or neglect, aggravated assault, murder, illegal drug distribution, and gang violence.

### Cruelty to Livestock Animals



#### Intentionally or knowingly:

- Torture a livestock animal
- Fails to unreasonably provide necessary food, water, or care while in the person's custody
- Abandons unreasonably in the person's custody
- Transports or confines in a cruel or unusual manner
- Administers poison to a livestock animal, other than cattle, horses, sheep, swine, or goats belonging to another without legal authority or the owner's consent.
- Causes one livestock to fight with another
- Uses live livestock as a lure in dog race training
- Trips a horse
- Seriously overworks a livestock animal



### Attack on Service Animals



- Intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly:
- attacks, injures, or kills an assistance animal.
- incites or permits an animal owned by or otherwise in the custody of the actor to attack, injure, or kill an assistance animal and, as a result of the person's conduct, the assistance animal is attacked, injured, or killed.



#### Cruelty to Non-Livestock Animals



- Intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly:
- Tortures or in a cruel manner kills or causes serious bodily injury
- Without the owner's effective consent, kills, administers poison to, or causes serious bodily injury to an animal
- Fails unreasonably to provide necessary food, water, care, or shelter for an animal in the person's custody
- Abandons unreasonably an animal in the person's custody
- Transports or confines an animal in a cruel manner
- Without the owner's effective consent, causes bodily injury to an animal
- · Causes one animal to fight with another animal, if either animal is not a dog
- Uses a live animal as a lure in dog race training or in dog coursing on a racetrack
- Seriously overworks an animal



### Dog Fighting



- Intentionally or knowingly:
- Causes a dog to fight with another dog
- · Participates in the earnings of or operates a facility used for dog fighting
- Uses or permits another to use any real estate building, room, tent, arena, or other property for dog fighting
- Owns or possesses dog-fighting equipment with the intent that the equipment be used to train a dog for dog fighting or un furtherance of dog fighting
- Attends as a spectator an exhibition of dog fighting



## Cockfighting



#### Knowingly:

- Causes a rooster to fight with another rooster
- Participates in the earnings of a cockfight
- Uses or permits another to use any real estate, building, room, tent, arena, or other property for cockfighting
- Owns or trains a rooster with the intent that the rooster be used in exhibition of cockfighting
- Manufactures, buys, sells, barters, exchanges, possesses, advertises, or otherwise
  offers a gaff, slasher, or other sharp implement designed for attachment to a rooster
  with the intent that the implement be used in cockfighting
- Attends as a spectator an exhibition of cockfighting



### **Bestiality**



- Knowingly:
- Engages in an act involving contact between:
  - A.) The person's mouth, anus, or genitals and the anus or genitals of an animal
  - B.) The person's anus or genitals and the mouth of the animal
- Fondles or touches the anus or genitals of an animal in a manner that is not generally accepted and otherwise lawful animal husbandry or veterinary practice, including touching through clothing
- Causes an animal to contact the seminal fluid of the person
- Inserts any part of a person's body or any object into the anus or genitals of an animal in a manner that is not generally accepted and otherwise lawful



# **Bestiality** (cont.)



#### · Cont.

- Possesses, sells, transfers, purchases, or otherwise obtains an animal with the intent that the animal be used for conduct listed above
- Organizes, promotes, conducts, or participates as an observer of conduct listed above
- Causes a person to engage or aids a person in engaging in conduct described above
- Permits conduct described above to occur on any premises under the person's control



# Bestiality (cont.)



#### · Cont.

- Engages in conduct described above in the presence of a child younger than 18 years of age
- Advertises, offers, or accepts the offer of an animal with the intent that the animal be used in this state for conduct described above



# Suspected Animal Cruelty (SAC)



Support for DPD Cruelty Unit: DAS provides support to the Dallas Police Department's (DPD) Cruelty Unit for Suspected Animal Cruelty (SAC) through:

- Transport
- o Housing
- o Care/Feeding
- Security
- Veterinary Services (Follow Up)
- DAS provides Operation Kindness (OPK) necessities for Forensic Examination and treatment through:
  - Space
  - Tools
  - Equipment

- SAC Intake FY23
  - 3,477 Total Animals
    - 3,183 Birds
    - 32 Cats
    - 242 Dogs
    - 9 Livestock
    - 11 Other
  - Average Length of Stay
    - 12 days

#### SAC Intake FY24

- 1,999 Total Animals
  - 1,651 Birds
  - 61 Cats
  - 269 Dogs
  - 2 Livestock
  - 16 Other
- Average Length of Stay
  - 23 days

DALLAS POLICE DEPARTMENT (DPD)



DPD Cruelty
Detectives determine
possible cruelty
outcomes based on
information and
evidence. DPD
Detectives file a
seizure warrant for
the animal(s) if not
abandoned.

DALLAS ANIMAL SERVICES (DAS)



DAS Field Officers will provide transport to DAS, housing, and care for the SAC animal(s). OPERATION KINDNESS (OPK)



Operation Kindness provides veterinary forensics examinations and testimony. DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S (DA) OFFICE



DPD takes findings provided by OPK for SAC court case filing or releases the animal(s) due to a lack of evidence.
