
Objectives of Bike Plan Update



1. Update the Bike Network Map

- Reflect changes since the 2011 Bike
 Plan
- Coordinate with bike plans and projects from other agencies
- Ensure the bike network:
 - Completes existing network gaps
 - Provides greater safety and comfort
 - Improves citywide trail connections

Existing Bike Network







Objectives of Bike Plan Update (cont.)




- 2. Recommend updates to the City's policies and design standards for bike facilities.
- 3. Prioritize full list of projects and use the 15 priority projects to develop more detailed project costs and cross section.
- 4. Educate residents about this mobility option and ensure equity.

- Feasibility Review
- Public and Stakeholder Input

- Connections to Existing & Future Trails
- Low-Stress Routes
- Access to Destinations
- Connections to Areas of High Active Trip Potential
- Interconnectivity& Directness
- Bike Rider Safety& Comfort






CITY OF DALLAS BIKE PLAN UPDATE


June - July 2023

- 3,200 participated in the online survey
- 1,200 provided comments on bike route opportunities and issues
- 314 provided additional comments



more than 60%

of survey respondents mentioned conflicts with cars, fears for safety, and lack of access to bike facilities as barriers to biking in Dallas



of respondents were in support of bike-friendly policy change



35%

of online map comments described a location with a challenge/barrier to biking



Advisory Committees



Two Committees Guided the Study:

- Bicycle Advisory Committee (BAC) (17 members)
 - Residents nominated by Mayor and each Council Member, plus two representative nominated by project team
 - 5 meetings (plus one joint meeting with the TAC)
- Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) (34 members)
 - City of Dallas staff from several departments (Transportation, Public Works, <u>Park & Recreation</u>, Planning & Urban Design, etc.)
 - Regional transportation partners (DART, NCTCOG, Dallas County, TxDOT)
 - o 8 meetings



Next Steps



- Update the draft plan and bike network with comments from the public, TAC, and BAC
- Brief City Council (anticipated October 18th)
- Incorporate City Council comments as needed and finalize the plan
- Take final plan to City Council for adoption (November 2023)
- Implementation!
