
# **USTA Park Agency Tennis Assessment**





# **Input Sessions**

Input Sessions were facilitated by Brio2 Solutions Co-Directors Jodie Adams and Dr. Peggy Riggs:

- Used the SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Threats) Analysis Method for staff input and participation; A multi-Voting Process (with dots) occurred to prioritize items for all four SWOT Analysis areas
- 2. Staff completed written surveys to provide confidential information
- 3. Conducted internal interviews with assigned staff
- 4. Conducted external interviews with selected representatives from various organizations and groups
- 5. Brio2 Solutions will finalize an outside examination of the results of the activities in order to draw conclusions and make recommendations for Dallas Parks and Recreation Tennis Section (including Pickleball)
