Handgun Prohibition Notice for Meetings of Governmental Entities

"Pursuant to Section 30.06, Penal Code (trespass by license holder with a concealed handgun), a person licensed under Subchapter H, Chapter 411, Government Code (handgun licensing law), may not enter this property with a concealed handgun."

"De acuerdo con la sección 30.06 del código penal (ingreso sin autorización de un titular de una licencia con una pistol oculta), una persona con licencia según el subcapítulo h, capítulo 411, código del gobierno (ley sobre licencias para portar pistolas), no puede ingresar a esta propiedad con una pistola oculta."

"Pursuant to Section 30.07, Penal Code (trespass by license holder with an openly carried handgun), a person licensed under Subchapter H, Chapter 411, Government Code (handgun licensing law), may not enter this property with a handgun that is carried openly."

"De acuerdo con la sección 30.07 del código penal (ingreso sin autorización de un titular de una licencia con una pistola a la vista), una persona con licencia según el subcapítulo h, capítulo 411, código del gobierno (ley sobre licencias para portar pistolas), no puede ingresar a esta propiedad con una pistola a la vista."

"Pursuant to Section 46.03, Penal Code (places weapons prohibited), a person may not carry a firearm or other weapon into any open meeting on this property."

- 3. deliberating a negotiated contract for a prospective gift or donation to the city if deliberation in an open meeting would have a detrimental effect on the position of the city in negotiations with a third person. [Tex. Govt. Code §551.073]
- 4. deliberating the appointment, employment, evaluation, reassignment, duties, discipline, or dismissal of a public officer or employee; or to hear a complaint or charge against an officer or employee unless the officer or employee who is the subject of the deliberation or hearing requests a public hearing. [Tex. Govt. Code §551.074]
- 5. deliberating the deployment, or specific occasions for implementation, of security personnel or devices. [Tex. Govt. Code §551.076]
- 6. discussing or deliberating commercial or financial information that the city has received from a business prospect that the city seeks to have locate, stay or expand in or near the city and with which the city is conducting economic development negotiations; or deliberating the offer of a financial or other incentive to a business prospect. [Tex Govt . Code §551.087]
- 7. deliberating security assessments or deployments relating to information resources technology, network security information, or the deployment or specific occasions for implementations of security personnel, critical infrastructure, or security devices. [Tex Govt. Code §551.089]

The February 27, 2024, Commission on Disabilities meeting was called to order at 2:03 p.m. with quorum being met.

The meeting agenda, posted in accordance with Chapter 551, "OPEN MEETINGS", of the Texas Government Code, was presented.

PUBLIC SPEAKERS

Chairman Kalkanli opened the floor with roll call and for any public speakers, advising the public of available time and requesting that they turn on their camera's when speaking.

With no public speakers, Chairman Kalkanli moved to the next order of business.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Chairman Kalkanli opened the floor to approve minutes from last year September 26, 2023 and January 23, 2024. Commissioner Puga mentioned the following edits to be made:

- September minutes should state that quorum was lost, as had been done in previous months for consistency and best practice.
- January minutes in Commissioner's reports should read "black and brown", instead of brown and black.

Chairman Kalkanli mentioned the following edits to be made:

• January minutes should read as follows Chairman Kalkanli discussed his passion for education, children's rights, disability rights, and human rights.

Commissioner Revi mentioned the following edits to be made:

• January minutes on page 2 line 9 should read the work that "she" and Commissioner Olsen.

Commissioner Bellew asked if the motion could separate the minutes because he did not feel comfortable on approving minutes when he was not in attendance of the meeting. There was discussion on voting procedures and Roberts Rules of Order. Chairman Kalkanli presented the motion again for a vote, separating September 2023 minutes which were approved with edits, then January 2024 minutes which were approved with edits.

MEETING SUMMARY

Chairman Kalkanli introduced the new Human Rights Office Christorpher Graves. Mr. Graves briefly spoke of his professional background.

Chairman Kalkanli, moved to the next item on the agenda, Officer Reports. Chairman Kalkanli shared he attended the 15th Annual Research, Art, and Writing Graduate conference held at the University of Texas at Dallas on February 17, 2024. Chairman Kalkanli presented an academic paper on the Nazi persecution of people with disabilities.

Commissioner Puga shared that she attended the installment of Rev. Freddy Haynes as the new President and CEO of the Rainbow PUSH Coalition on February 15, 2024. Commissioner Puga shared that she also attended the Black Beauty Effect documentary Red Carpet Premiere, and another Black History event in District 8, honoring Black leaders on February 17, 2024. Chairwoman Puga advised that when contacting 311, request a Service Request number.

Commissioner White shared a free food delivery program in South Dallas ran by Kroger. This program will deliver food to a centralized location for those that are home bound or have limited mobility to pick up their groceries.

Commissioner Puga mentioned the Annual Report. Chairman Kalkanli stated that they were informed that the report has been submitted and no further action was to be taken.

Commissioner Huschka shared that she is working with a Dallas volunteer attorney program to

offer pro bono clinics to families with special needs and disabilities in need of legal assistance. Commissioner Huschka requested that if any of the other Commissioners knew of any persons that were in need, they could reach out to her.

SUB-COMMITTEE REPORTS

Commissioner Revi provided a presentation on behalf of the Transportation subcommittee. Commissioner Revi reviewed the fee schedule for violators of handicap parking and referenced Texas Transportation code. Commissioner Revi also shared video public service announcements produced by neighboring cities.

Commissioners Hooker and Bellew inquired about the sub-committees, Chairman Kalkanli instructed them to reach out to staff and information will be shared with the Commissioners.

BRIEFING

Christopher McGreal, Attorney of Disability Rights Texas, provided a basic overview of Disability Rights in Transportation. Mr. McGreal provided a detail presentation on Title II and Title III of the Disabilities Rights Act regarding Transportation. Once the presentation was complete, Commissioner Puga inquired about undue burdens and reasonable means. Mr. McGreal responded to Commissioner Puga's question.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Chairman Kalkanli announced the FIFA World Cup 2026 will be taking place in North America with some of the matches being in Dallas. Chairman Kalkanli encouraged any Commissioners that were interested in collaborating with him to contact appropriate parties and inquire about the initiatives currently being worked on.

Commissioner Puga announced that Dallas will be hosting Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated's Boule on July 11, 2024. She requested the Office of Equity and Inclusion ensure that meeting locations are accessible for all attendees.

Commissioner Revi announced there was a new skate park for children, and her concerns regarding what accommodations were being made for those with disability. Commissioner Revi mentioned that she felt this was something that the Commission should be involved in.



Office of Emergency Management (OEM)



Blue Sky Days: Prepare in collaboration with stakeholders to enhance the capability of the city, residents, and guests to respond and recover from disasters.

Black Sky Days: Support the on-scene response by coordinating resources and connecting partners so that response objectives are met, and recovery begins as quickly as possible.

OEM manages these functional areas:

- Emergency Operations Center
- Emergency planning
- Training and exercise
- Public info & warning systems
- Emergency logistics
- Command One
- Community preparedness
- Grant management
- Disaster finance



Our Hazards



- A hazard becomes a disaster when it intersects with people or property
- The Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (HIRA) outlines the hazards that Dallas faces, which include;
 - Flooding
 - Tornado
 - Winter Storm
 - Hazardous Materials
 - Public Health Emergency
 - Earthquake
 - Terrorist Attack

- Severe Weather (hail, high winds, lightning)
- Extreme temperatures
- Aircraft Accident
- Drought

 The HIRA is a foundational document that drives planning, training, and exercise



Community Preparedness



- Community Emergency Response Team (CERT): 20-hour program that trains residents in basic disaster preparedness, teams are then formed and maintained as part of city's emergency response capability.
- **Disaster Preparedness Presentations:** Aim to increase awareness and understanding of natural and manmade hazards, teach disaster safety and emotional resilience skills, as well as the importance of personal preparedness.
- Public-Private Partnerships: collaboration between our office and private sector organizations that can then help during disasters
- OEM Community Partners: OEM led organization of nongovernmental organizations that can provide services during and after disasters



Get Informed



- Community Hazards: Understand the hazards that affect the City of Dallas
- Disaster Plans: Learn about city response plans, evacuation plans, and shelters. Ask about the plans that exist in places you spend time (school, church, work, etc.)
- Warning Systems:
 - NOAA Weather Radio
 - FEMA App
 - Outdoor Warning System
- Assistance Programs: Learn about special assistance programs that may be available to you



Make a Plan



- Complete a Communications Plan: Your plan should include contact information for family members, your support network, and caregivers
- Consider Medications: Organize prescriptions, OTC drugs, and vitamins
- Assistive Medical Devices: Plan for how you will keep medical equipment running without electricity and how you would evacuate, if necessary
- Pets: Plan for your pet's needs. All City of Dallas shelters will accept pets.
- Emergency Facilities and Numbers: Keep a list of nearest medical facilities, local hospitals, and accessible transportation
- Visit ready.gov to find more information on making a plan



Build a Kit



- Medications: talk to your doctor about creating an emergency supply of medicines. Keep a list of your prescription medicines as a hard copy and digitally.
- Devices: keep model information and note where medical devices or assistive technologies come from.
- Food and Water: keep a three-day supply of water and nonperishable food on hand, if possible. Don't forget pet food!
- Contact List: keep a copy of your communications plan contact list, including doctors, relatives, or friends in a watertight container
- Backup eyeglasses, contacts, hearing aids, and batteries



DAFN Key Resources



- State of Texas Emergency Assistance Registry: Registration portal that allows individuals to provide key information that may help responders after disasters
- Oncor Critical Care of Chronic Condition Customer: Registration process to notify Oncor that you have a critical need for power
- FEMA Ready.Gov: Online resource with information about general disaster preparedness and many resources specific to people with disabilities
- **Disability Rights Texas:** Online resource with Texas specific preparedness information, an "Emergency Ready Sheet", and a disaster resilience email list



Working Together



- Planning: We want to include the disability community in our planning efforts so that we can ensure our plans are effective.
- **Training:** We are committed to making our disaster preparedness presentations and the Community Emergency Response Team classes accessible to everyone.
- Exercises: When we conduct exercises, we would like to include the disability community so that first responders gain experience
