BACKGROUND

Texas Capital Bank desires to make a \$1 million contribution delivered to Southern Gateway Public Green Foundation for the naming of the elevated open area surrounding the Rain Wall, the Texas Capital Landing.

Pursuant to Section IV-A of the Park Naming Policy, a Park and/or Trail (or portion thereof) is eligible for Official Naming or Renaming, the Park Naming Opportunity shall be considered for a mutually agreed upon monetary contribution, real property donation, personal property donation, or a combination of the above, subject to approval of the Park and Recreation Board. The development agreement with Southern Gateway Public Green Foundation allows them to pursue naming rights opportunities.

The management agreement with Fair Park First allows them to pursue naming rights opportunities.

BACKGROUND

On December 6, 2023 and December 13, 2023, the City of Dallas advertised for bids for the construction of the Kleberg Rylie Recreation Center Gymnasium Renovation and Repairs Project. A pre-bid conference was held on December 19, 2023, with five potential bidder(s) in attendance.

In response to the advertisement, the Office of Procurement Services received bids from eight firms on January 5, 2024. The bid procurement process complied with the City's Administrative Directive 4-5: Contracting Policy, Section 10 Procurement Processes. Brown and Root Industrial Services, LLC was selected as the lowest responsible bidder in an amount not to exceed \$429,000.00.

This action will award a construction services contract from Department of Housing and Urban Design Community Development Block Grant - Disaster Recovery Fund (CDBG-DR) for the Kleberg Rylie Recreation Center Gymnasium Renovation and Repairs Project located at 1515 Edd Road to Brown and Root Industrial Services, LLC, in an amount not to exceed \$429,000.00. The scope of work includes gym floor removal and haul offsite of the south half of the existing gymnasium's athletic wood flooring, temporarily relocate existing bleachers during demolition phase, prepare and patch concrete floor slab, install pourable sealer over floor spa cracks, install vapor barrier over existing floor slab, install new athletic wood flooring system and re-stripe gym, adjust all door thresholds to new floor system, gym equipment sleeves and re-install existing gym bleachers. On January 18, 2023, HUD distributed an Allocation Amendment Notice increasing the amount of CDBG-DR Funds allocating additional CDBG-DR Funds to the City of Dallas in the amount of \$15,967,000 from the Continuing Appropriations Act, 2023 (Pub. L.117-180).

Pursuant to the aforementioned notice, the City is permitted to submit a single budget and Action Plan including all funds allocated under both laws; and

On February 10, 2023, City Council was briefed by memorandum on the Proposed 2022 Amended CDBG-DR Budget and draft Action Plan; and

On March 2, 2023, the Community Development Commission was provided an update on the proposed 2022 Amended CDBG-DR Budget and draft Action Plan; and

On March 8, 2023, City Council authorized preliminary adoption of the Proposed Amended CDBG-DR Budget and draft Action Plan and a public hearing to receive comments on the proposed use of funds by Resolution No. 23-0354; and

On April 4, 2023, City Council was scheduled to be briefed on the Proposed 2022 Amended CDBG-DR Budget and draft Action Plan. An overview of the program was presented; and

Federal regulations require that a public hearing be held on the City's Proposed 2022 Amended CDBG-DR Budget and draft Action Plan; and

A summary of the Proposed 2022 Amended CDBG-DR Budget and draft Action Plan was made available for public review and comment on or about March 8, 2023 through April 11, 2023 and a notice was published in the Dallas Morning News on or about March 19, 2023 to provide residents an opportunity to submit written comments through April 11, 2023; this satisfied the requirements set forth in HUD regulations; and

On April 12, 2023, City Council authorized the final adoption and increase in appropriations for the 2022 Amended Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) Budget and Action Plan to accept additional CDBG-DR funds in the amount of \$15,967,000, increasing the total amount to be received from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development from \$24,433,000 to \$40,400,000 (Grant No. B-21-MF-48-0003, P-21-DA-48-LDZ) and Federal Assistance Listing No. 14.218 & 14.228) according to the approved schedule.

Shakespeare Dallas, a 501 (c) 3 nonprofit founded in 1971, began its relationship with the City of Dallas in 1980 at the Band Shell in Fair Park. The company utilized the Band Shell to perform the works of William Shakespeare until 1988 when Starplex was constructed at Fair Park, necessitating the relocation of the Shakespeare performances. Samuell-Grand Park was selected, and Shakespeare Dallas held its first performance there in 1989.

Since the relocation of Shakespeare Dallas to Samuell-Grand Amphitheater, a number of improvements and amenities have been added, including a permanent stage, restrooms, the Sherry W. Shannon VIP Pavilion, and a new stage deck in 2019.

In 2014, the initial 20-year Use Agreement with the City of Dallas ended and on May 14, 2014, the City entered into a 10-year with two 5-year renewal options Use Agreement with Shakespeare Dallas. The agreement also approved Shakespeare Dallas to charge adult admission tickets at a rate of \$10 for Thursday through Sunday performances.

With 33% of all tickets still offered free of charge and a moderate top ticket price on Tuesday – Sunday of \$20, the company is struggling to reach its financial goals.

The company plans to increase the top ticket price to \$25 in 2025 and \$30 in 2026. These additional funds will be used to offset increasing production costs and outreach opportunities that support Shakespeare in the Park. Additionally, all surplus cash at year-end will be moved to a cash reserve that is dedicated as a Rainy Day Fund, to offset lost income from inclement weather and other organizational challenges.

We are committed to keeping our performances as accessible as possible and this change will give us the flexibility to distribute additional free tickets to those in our community who have the most need.

BACKGROUND

This action will authorize Amendment #1 to the Project Specific Agreement (PSA) with Dallas County for funding of Phase 2 of the Trinity Forest Spine Trail project. The City is funding a total of \$28,535,000.00 towards the cost of Phase 1 and Phase 2 of the project. In the PSA, Dallas County provided \$3,335,000.00 for Phase 1 construction and, by this Amendment #1, will provide \$2,000,000.00 towards construction of Phase 2. The actual award of the construction contract will be by separate action.

The Trinity Forest Spine Trail was identified in the *Dallas Trail Network Master Plan* as the primary link in southeast Dallas to the trail network. 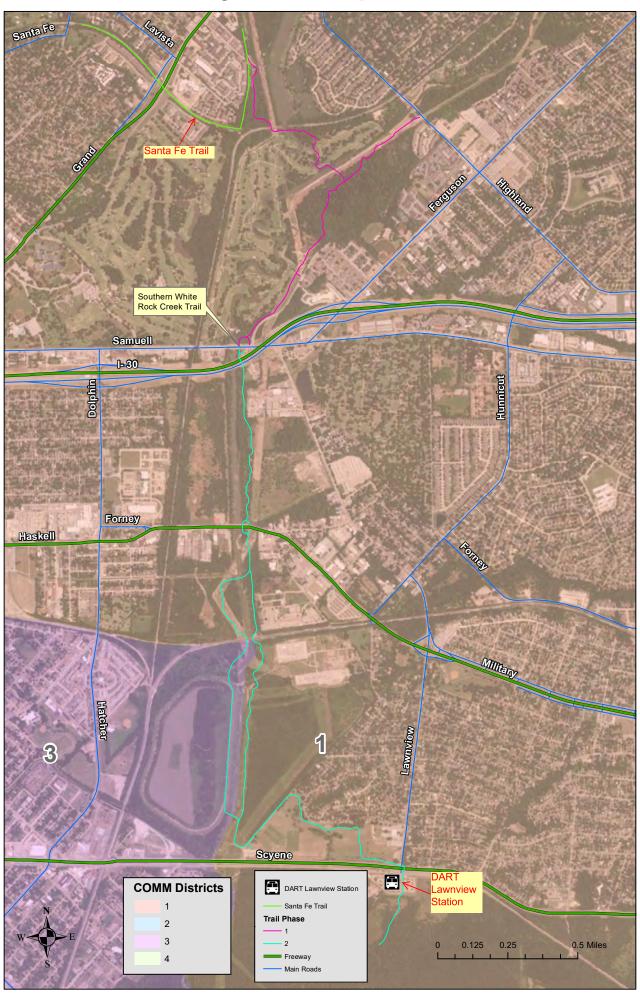

SUBJECT

Authorize a site approval for the installation of Four Chromatic Gates art piece from the previously approved site at Exall Park to Glencoe Park located at 3700 Glencoe Street. Financing: No cost consideration to the city.

BACKGROUND

A developer has purchased Energy Plaza and is transforming the building into a mixed use facility. The courtyard area, home to Four Chromatic Gates will be repurposed into a greenspace. The developer requested this piece be re-sited. The artwork has been moved to storage and is awaiting conservation.

Glencoe Park is heavily used and is proximate to the Park Trail system and has no Public Art. The University Crossing Public Improvement District (PID) has offered to fund the conservation and installation of the artwork as well as provide lighting and a seating area. The PID will monitor the art and provide ongoing maintenance.

SCOPE OF PROJECT:

- Relocate from storage to Glencoe Park

DRAFT TIMELINE:

- Pending conservation and site preparation and pad.

SELECTION METHOD:

- University Crossing PID will secure conservation, art handling and transportation/installation at Glencoe Park. The PID will provide a seating area around the art and provide continued monitoring and maintenance.

PRIOR ACTION/REVIEW (COUNCIL, BOARDS, COMMISSIONS)

On November 2, 2023 Park Board reviewed and approved Exall Park location for Four Chromatic Gates.

FISCAL INFORMATION

No cost consideration to the City.

COMMITTEE ACTION

The Planning and Design committee will consider this item on April 4, 2024 and will present its recommendation to the Park and Recreation Board on April 18, 2024.

Title: Four Chromatic Gates

Artist: Herbert Bayer

Description:

Abstract Aluminum, four gates, in graduated sizes, painted solid sky blue, lipstick red and sun yellow. As if cut out and expanded from a flat shape, they are set at angles to break up space.

The Four Chromatic Gates are a reminder of the origins of Energy Plaza, the 9th tallest building in the Dallas skyline and one of the five buildings designed by architect I.M. Pei in Dallas. The Four Chromatic Gates were commissioned by ARCO from the Bauhaus sculptor and designer Herbert Bayer as a design consultant. The colors of the gates were ARCO's corporate colors.

About the artist:

Herbert Bayer (April 5, 1900 – September 30, 1985) was an Austrian and American graphic designer, painter, photographer, sculptor, art director, environmental and interior designer, and architect. He was instrumental in the

development of the <u>Atlantic Richfield Company</u>'s corporate art collection until his death in 1985.

Since he immigrated to the United States in 1938, he has been an advertising and design consultant for the Container Corp. of America and the Atlantic Richfield Co. During his 10 years in Santa Barbara, he has created hundreds of artworks including several of enormous proportions: 21 tapestries, 10 large sculptures, nine major murals in the United States and Mexico and an earthwork at Kent, Wash. In the same decade, he has had 11 solo exhibitions and participated in 29 group shows.
