BACKGROUND

The Park and Recreation Board has the authority by City Code Sec.32-11.2(3) to approve alcohol consumption on park property. A request has been received by Alison Matis, with Juneteenth Unity Festival, to serve alcohol from 4:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. on Saturday, June 15, 2024. This will be the third (3) year for this recurring event with no issues reported from past events. The estimated attendance is 900 participants.

The Alcoholic Beverage Permit Conditions document has been given to the event organizers, who will be required to meet all the conditions to include naming the City of Dallas as an additional Insured as specified by the City's Risk Management Office. Alcohol consumption will be restricted to a designated enclosed area staffed by Dallas Police.

FISCAL INFORMATION

Event organizers will pay a \$200 alcohol permit deposit and a \$250 non-refundable alcohol permit fee. Estimated Revenue: \$250.

The Alcoholic Beverage Permit Conditions document has been given to the event organizers, who will be required to meet all the conditions to include naming the City of Dallas as an additional Insured as specified by the City's Risk Management Office. Alcohol consumption will be restricted to a designated enclosed area and those consuming alcohol beverages will be subject to wearing a designated wristband.

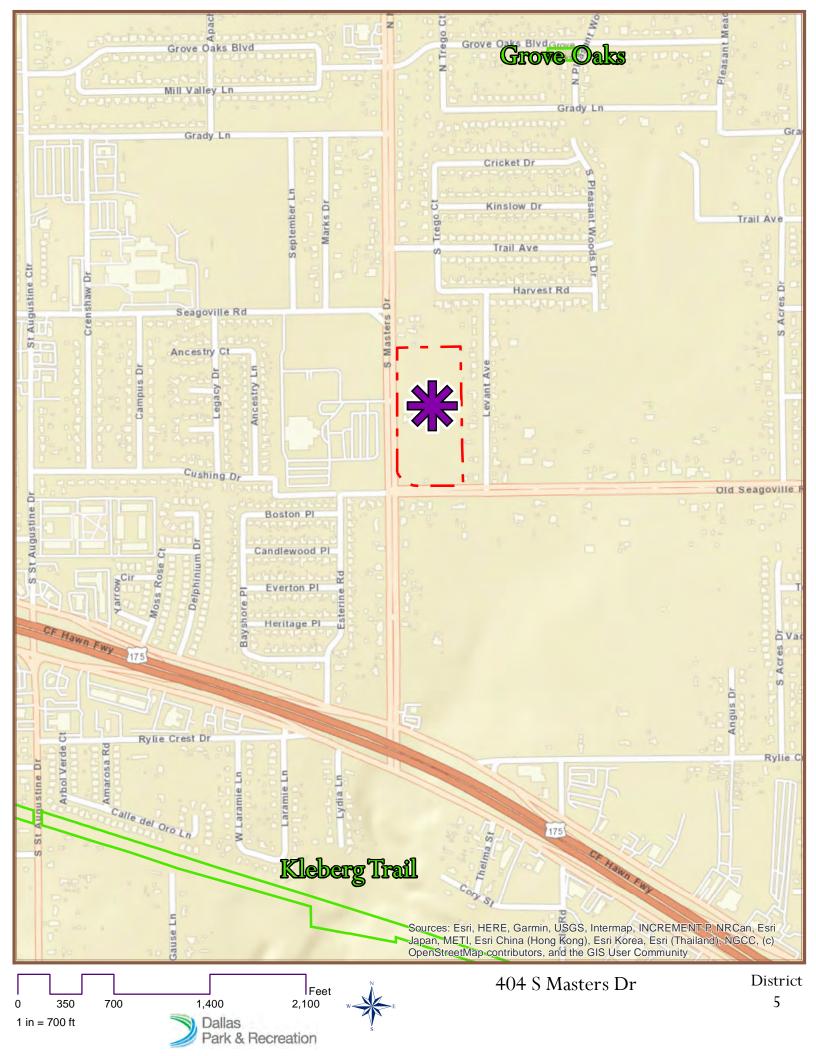

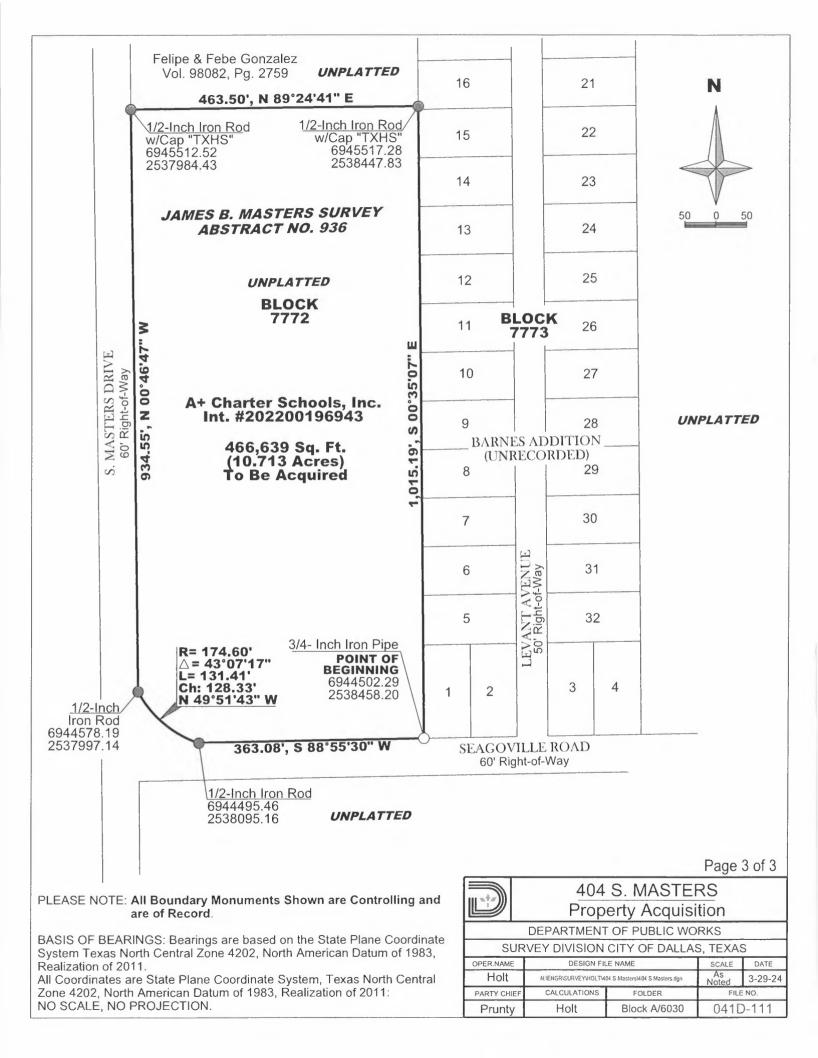

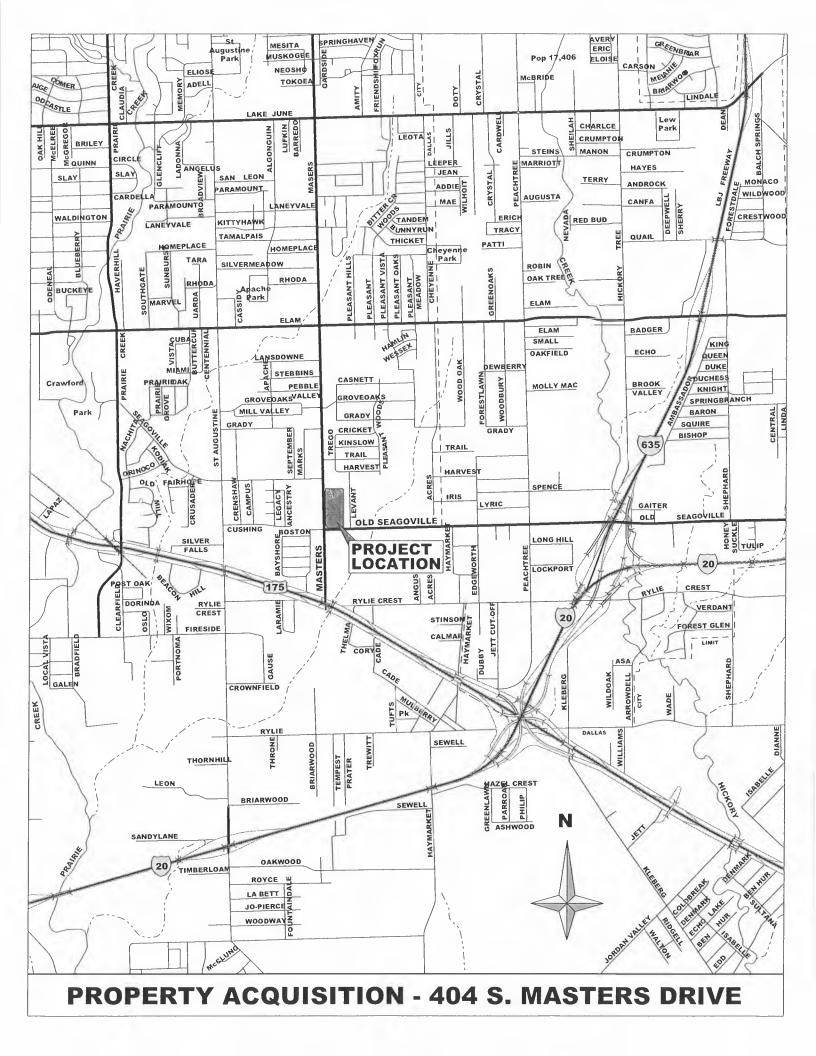

BACKGROUND

This item authorizes acquisition of three easements of approximately 4,859 square feet of land (0.11 acres) from Fairhill School, located at 16150 Preston Rd, being more particularly described in Exhibit A attached hereto, for development of the Cotton Belt Trail (Project). The three easements consist of: 1) 1,252 square feet of Trail Easement, 2) 2,849 square feet of Drainage Easement, and 3) 758 square feet of Drainage Easement for a total of 4,859 square feet of land (0.11 acres). The total purchase price for the acquisition of the three easements is \$45,545.00 based on an independent appraisal (\$41,545.00 plus closing costs and title expenses not to exceed \$4,000.00).

The hike and bike trail easement will be used for the Cotton Belt Trail Project. The Project is a collaboration between the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG), DART, and local governments, namely Grapevine, Coppell, Carrollton, Addison, Dallas, Richardson, and Plano. When completed the Cotton Belt Trail will extend over twenty-four miles providing connections into many local governments' trail networks across the DFW area including the extensive Dallas Trail Network.

The Project has been designed and is being constructed concurrent with DART's Silver Line project. The construction of critical project construction areas is nearing completion for Phase 1. Phase 2 requires acquisition of the easement area at 16150 Preston Rd.

DALLAS PARK AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT GOLF COURSE OPERATIONS POLICY

This policy provides for the day-to-day operations of the Dallas public golf courses. It is the responsibility of the Park and Recreation Director to ensure that all golf courses and golf programs are available to the general public and to ensure that proper supervision is provided for all golfing activities.

A. HOURS OF OPERATION

- 1. Daylight to sunset, seven (7) days per week, 364 days a year.
- 2. Green fees are not charged on Christmas Day. The golf professional may choose to operate the course on Christmas Day, with notice provided to the department. All revenue collected by the golf pro on Christmas Day is subject to the revenue sharing contract with the City of Dallas.
- 3. The City of Dallas reserves the right to close a golf course as needed for maintenance and/or improvement projects, weather conditions including freeze, frost or flood and lightening, if necessary, and for public health safety precautions. The date of closing will be posted at the course a minimum of two days in advance, when possible.

B. <u>FEES</u>

Green Fee and Cart rates will be approved by the Park and Recreation Board and are posted in the golf pro shops. Temporary discounts on green fees, special promotions and pilot programs to maximize play and revenue at one or more golf courses will be approved by the Director. See current fee schedule for a list of the green fees at the golf courses.

- Weekday Regular rates at Keeton are charged Monday Friday.
- Weekday Regular rates at Luna Vista, Stevens, Cedar Crest and Tenison are charged Monday Thursday.
- Senior and Junior daily rates and Senior and Junior annual card rates are available Monday Friday, excluding holidays as identified in Section C.
- In addition, Senior Daily, Junior Daily and Junior annual cardholder rates are available on weekends and holidays after 1 p.m.

C. <u>RECOGNIZED HOLIDAYS</u>

The following list of holidays shall require charging at Holiday (Weekend) rates.

New Year's Day January 1st 3rd Monday of January Martin Luther King, Jr. Day Presidents' Day 3rd Monday of February Good Friday Friday before Easter Sunday Memorial Day Last Monday in May June 19th Juneteenth Independence Day Julv 4th 1st Monday in September Labor Day Indigenous Peoples' Day 2nd Monday of October Veterans Dav November 11th Thanksgiving Day and following Friday 4th Thursday and Friday in November Christmas Day CLOSED

When a listed holiday falls on a weekend, the holiday, at the direction of the City, may be recognized on the day recognized by the City of Dallas, or federal holiday observation day. For example, when a holiday falls on a Sunday it is recognized on the following Monday. In these situations, Holiday (Weekend) rates will be charged in accordance with the current fee schedule.

D. PLAYER REGISTRATION

All players must check in at the pro shop prior to starting their round. Player registration forms for both green fee players and annual card players will be maintained on a daily basis by course personnel.

E. RAIN CHECKS - GREEN FEES

Rain checks for green fees will be issued to individuals when the course becomes unfit for play due to weather. No rain checks will be issued if the same weather conditions existed when the individual began the round.

Rain checks for green fees may also be issued to individuals when a valid complaint regarding course conditions has been voiced. Rain checks in this case are issued on a case-by-case basis and when redeemed will only be applied towards green fees.

Rain checks for golf carts may also be issued to individuals when a valid compliant regarding condition of the golf cart has been voiced. Rain checks in this case are issued on a case-by-case basis and when redeemed will only be applied towards applicable cart fees.

Rain checks for green fees and cart fees will be issued on a prorated schedule based on the number of holes played before the situation warranting a rain check

occurred. Rain checks are valid only at the course where purchased.

Rain checks must be redeemed within ninety (90) days of date issued. Any value left on the rain check will be forfeited.

F. <u>RESERVATIONS</u>

- 1. In- Person or by Phone:
 - a. Advanced reservations for weekday, weekend, and holiday tee times can be made up to seven (7) days in advance by phone or in person upon opening of the pro shop.
 - b. The number of advanced reservations made by a single individual can be limited based on, but not limited to, tee time availability for a given course on a given day, and number of tee times attempting to be made (e.g., will encroach upon being classified as a tournament).
- 2. Online:
 - a. The City of Dallas has enacted the following policies and procedures to accommodate customers who wish to reserve tee times online via the City of Dallas, Park and Recreation Department website. There is no fee for booking on the website however, reservations not cancelled at least 24 hours in advance will be subject to charge of \$20 on the credit card used to book the reservation.
 - b. Online tee times are available 7 days in advance beginning at 8:00 A.M.
 - c. Online tee times cannot be made later than 7 days in advance.
 - d. To be entered into the reservation system, players will be asked for their first and last name, address, phone number, and email address.
 - e. A credit card will also be required to complete the tee time reservation but will not be charged until time of tee time.
 - f. Guest information is for in-house use only and will not be sold or shared with outside vendors. Email addresses will be used for sending automatic tee time confirmations and notices of interest regarding City of Dallas golf course activities.
 - g. Tee times can be made for a maximum of 8 players. Groups of 8 or more must contact the appropriate pro shop in person or by phone.
 - h. Fivesomes are not permitted to book online these groups must contact the pro shop in person or by phone.
 - i. All fees are due upon arrival at the course.
 - j. Cancellations and/or changes to tee time reservations cannot be made on the website. Cancellations or changes must be made by contacting the appropriate course pro shop or in person no later than 24 hours prior to the scheduled tee time.

k. Tee time reservations accepted by the City of Dallas golf courses will receive an automatic email confirmation.

G. TOURNAMENT OR EVENT PROCEDURES

- 1. Any interested group of 16 or more players may apply to schedule a tournament or an event. Any group may be denied if, in the opinion of the golf professional, that group has disrupted play, damaged City or concessionaire property, or has otherwise displayed unacceptable behavior in the past at any City of Dallas golf course.
- 2. Tournaments and events may be scheduled up to one year in advance at each of the six municipal golf courses. Reservations can only be made by completing the tournament or event reservation form and remitting payment by close of business ten (10) days prior to any tournament or event. 90% of reserved fees must be guaranteed by the group and paid for within ten (10) days of the tournament or event.

In the event of inclement weather or some other act that forces the golf course to be closed prior to the start of the tournament, all fees paid will be returned or the tournament or event will be rescheduled, whichever the group chooses.

- 3. The golf pro and/or representative reserves the right to limit the number of tournaments/events for any association and/or group. A complete reservation includes proximity markers, scorecards and score sheets at no extra charge. Additional fees will be charged for personalized scorecards, personalized score sheets, cart identification placards, scoring after the event, carts for officials, bag service, valet parking, prizes, driving range balls, foot and other like services. A tournament services fee may be charged per each player to cover the cost for services such as advanced paring for groups, assignment of players to carts/cart identification placards, and assignment of groups to specific holes. Additional fees may be charged for driving range balls, scoring after the event, bag services, valet, food and other like services.
- 4. Regular Weekend tournament or event tee times will begin 10:00am or later. If more than one tournament or event group is scheduled on a weekend day, start times must not begin prior to 10:00 a.m. If one tournament or event group scheduled is too large to be accommodated before dark, the necessary number of tee times may begin prior to 10:00am to finish before dark. Regular Weekday tournament tee times may begin at any time.
- 5. Shotgun starts are allowed on weekdays (Monday through Friday). Starting

times must begin by 8am or within one hour of daylight to ensure maximum utilization of golf course or other times when the golf professional determines it is in the best interest of the golf course. Modified shot gun start tournaments are allowed on weekends and holidays with a maximum of 40 players. Tournament or events must start by 8:00am or within one hour of daylight.

- 6. Golf carts are mandatory for all tournament/event players and will be provided for each tournament reservation. U.S.G.A. sanction, NCAA, UIL and junior tournaments are not required to rent golf carts.
- 7. All tournament/event food and beverage items must be purchased from the course food service. State law prohibits alcoholic beverages from being brought on, or removed from, golf course premises. All alcoholic beverages must be purchased from the golf course food service. Coolers are available from the golf course food service (with a deposit) and are permitted on golf carts. The golf pro and/or his representatives reserve the right to inspect ice chests/coolers on golf course property. No outside coolers are permitted. Pro Shop staff are not allowed to search golf bags, backpacks, or purses for alcoholic beverages that have been brought onto the property in violation of the TABC law.
- 8. Any merchandise prizes to be awarded on site must be purchased from the course golf shop. Cash prizes are not condoned and not permitted by the United States Golf Association.

H. ANNUAL CARDS

The Special Services Business Office staff will maintain adequate records showing the type of card and cardholder's name. An alphabetical listing of all current cardholders is available at each golf course and Special Services Business Office.

Junior Annual cards are sold at any time and are valid one year from the date of purchase. Summer Cards are available for sale beginning June 1 – August 31. Juniors seventeen (17) years of age and younger are eligible to purchase a summer or annual green fee card. Refer to fee schedule for applicable rates per round for each golf course. The card is not transferable.

I. <u>PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL PLAY</u>

Prior to the beginning of each school year, no later than July of each year, Dallas Independent School District (DISD) and Dallas Park and Recreation Department will develop a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) outlining the high school play program for the upcoming school year. The specifics of the MOU will be the guidelines for the golf program for the upcoming school year.

The MOU will include, at a minimum, the following:

- 1. Prior to the beginning of each school year, Dallas Public Schools will submit a written proposal, describing the school's need for use of the golf facilities. Each participating high school will be assigned a "home course" and a district tournament schedule.
- 2. The golf schedule will be prepared and distributed to the courses by the School District Athletic office via the Park and Recreation Department office. Each golf pro will determine the specific days of play per week for the designated high schools.
- 3. Each high school golf coach will provide the course pro with a list, in writing, of his team players. School golf teams are limited to a ten (10) player squad beginning with each school year. Coaches must attend all high school events and practice rounds held at the golf course.
- 4. All high school team participants are required to register prior to beginning of play.

J. <u>COMPLIMENTARY GREEN FEES</u>

1. Complimentary green fees and ½ cart rental at all courses will be provided, any day of the week, at any time, with advanced notification to the golf pro manager to the following: (excluding guest)

City Council Members; City Manager; Assistant City Managers; Park Board Members; Park and Recreation Department Director; Park and Recreation Department Assistant Director; Superintendent of Special Services; PGA, LPGA Golf Professionals, and GCSAA; and NRPA members (with prior approval of the Park and Recreation Director). Guests accompanying the VIPs are not eligible for complimentary green fees.

2. Complimentary green fee and ½ cart rentals will be provided to employees or volunteers at the golf course where they are employed or volunteer. Tee times are available to employees or volunteers at the golf course where they are employed or volunteer anytime on weekdays, and on weekends and holidays after 11:00am, (excluding guest). Based on volume of play, the golf professional may restrict times when complimentary green fees are available. This applies only to the following employees and volunteers:

Full and part time golf course administration staff, maintenance and pro shop employees; volunteer security officers and volunteer marshals. Each volunteer will be provided complimentary play on a week by week in-kind service basis.

3. Golf Professionals may discount food and drink products to resident golf course pro shop and maintenance personnel, at their discretion. City will receive appropriate contract percent of all food and drink sales.

K. <u>GOLF CARTS</u>

- 1. Golf carts are available for rent at each course with a valid driver's license. Customer information will be maintained for all carts rented will be maintained on a daily basis by course personnel.
- 2. Privately owned carts, to include personal transport devices commonly referred to as Segways, or similar devices, may be brought on the course with the payment of a daily trail fee.
- 3. Power carts are allowed off cart path in the fairways utilizing the 90 degrees rule, at the discretion of the Park and Recreation Director or his representative, dependent upon good turf conditions. Power carts must always stay on cart path adjacent to greens and tees, and out of tree groves. Repeated violation of this procedure may result in loss of cart privileges.
- 4. Pull carts are available for rent through the golf pro shop with payment of a daily rental fee.

L. <u>PLAYING REGULATIONS AND GENERAL CONDITIONS GOVERNING</u> <u>CONDUCT ON GOLF COURSE PROPERTY</u>

1. Each player shall be registered and all persons must have green fee receipt in possession at all times during play or while on property.

City Code #32-11: Entering a place of amusement without paying a fee: It shall be unlawful for any person to enter or attempt to enter any theater, or other public place of amusement, or any sporting event, where any exhibition, sporting event, performance or entertainment is being given without paying the admission fee and without having an entrance ticket and against the consent of the lessee, agent or manager thereof.

2. Local rules for each course are listed on the respective scorecard.

- Fivesomes are allowed Monday Friday and after 12 noon on weekends and holidays. Fivesomes are permitted before 12 noon on weekends and holidays at Keeton, Stevens, and L. B. Houston. All fivesomes are required to rent carts.
- 4. Each player must have a bag and a set of clubs including putter.
- 5. No practicing on the golf course except at designated driving ranges putting green and chipping areas.
- 6. To maximize speed of play "Ready Golf" rules are promoted and encouraged by golf pro and/or his representatives.
- 7. Players are to wear shoes that are not detrimental to the turf. For example, baseball spikes, football, soccer, or high heel shoes are not permissible. Soft spikes are approved. Metal spikes are prohibited on golf course property.
- 8. Players coming off #9 green have the right-of-way on #10 tee.
- 9. Players shall be responsible for any damage to the greens, golf course or to private property created by his/her actions including errant golf shots causing damage on or off course property.

Players Responsibility to Private Property (Park and Recreation Board Minutes, Vol. 12, p. 180) Players will be required to report immediately to the clubhouse any damage to private property, including golf carts, giving the address, damages and other pertinent details at any municipal golf course. Players shall be responsible for any damage to private property created by their acts at any municipal golf course.

- 10. U.S.G.A. rules will govern all competitions.
- 11. Shirts must be worn in the clubhouse and on the golf course at all times.
- 12. Thrashing of pecan trees is prohibited. (City Code 32-3)
- 13. Littering a public park is prohibited. (City Code 7A-8)
- 14. Fishing, jogging, horseback riding, bicycles and motorcycle riding are prohibited on Dallas public golf courses.
- 15. Walking dogs on Dallas public golf courses during normal play times, daylight to sunset, is prohibited.

16. There will be <u>no hunting of golf balls</u> by persons other than those so June 2024 8

authorized by the appropriate golf pro. Lost golf balls are the property of the golf pro.

- 17. Fighting, using profane, abusive or threatening language, unnecessary loud or boisterous language or conduct, causing injury to staff or fellow patrons through deliberate action or gross negligence or other disruptive actions of the program shall not be permitted.
- 18. Golf Pro Shops are for golf patrons. Tabletop games (i.e. cards, dominoes, chess, checkers, etc.) or other games/amusement in the pro shops or pavilions is not permitted.
- 19. All food and beverage items must be purchased from the golf course food service.
- 20. State law prohibits alcoholic beverages from being brought onto or removed from the property where alcoholic beverages are sold. Per TABC guidelines, all alcohol sold to customers must be consumed or disposed of before leaving the property.
 - a. No outside coolers are permitted on golf course property. As stated in Section G.7., coolers are available to rent from the golf course food service with a deposit to be used for beverages purchased from the facility.
 - b. Personal coolers found to be on property containing unopened alcohol will be confiscated, tagged with the customer's name, and held in a secure location until they leave the property. Opened alcoholic containers brought onto the property, with the exception of those with a replaceable cap, will be poured out upon discovery.
 - c. Guests found to be in possession of alcohol brought onto the property after initial notification by staff that this is prohibited, and after the round has begun, will result in the golfer being asked to leave the property.
 - d. Consumption of alcohol is prohibited in golf course parking lots. (City Code 32-11)
 - e. Pro Shop staff are not allowed to search golf bags, backpacks, or purses for alcoholic beverages that have been brought onto the property in violation of the TABC law. If staff witnesses a guest with alcohol brought onto the property, staff must be able to document in detail and should report this on the City's Incident Report for documentation purposes. The names of frequent offenders of this policy will be reported on the tee sheet and tracked by Pro Shop staff.

21. Patrons that violate these rules or who participate in prohibited activities are subject to being suspended from the course where the violation occurred and possibly all City of Dallas courses depending on the circumstances of the incident or incidents. The point at which suspension may be initiated depends on the severity of the infraction and its subsequent overall affect upon the safety and welfare of the course staff and patrons. Any violation of the Texas Penal Code (i.e. disorderly conduct, obscenity, assault, harassment, criminal trespassing) will be addressed by the Dallas Police Department.

The following procedures will be followed when handling a violation of city ordinances or state statutes:

- Summon City Police or other appropriate personnel for assistance
- City of Dallas Park and Recreation Department will act as a complainant in order to file charges against the alleged violator.

The following procedures will be followed when handling a violation of this golf course operations policy:

- Verbal notification of the infraction and request for voluntary compliance.
- Failure or refusal to comply will result in the violator being asked to leave the property.
- Golf Pro shop staff will complete the required incident reports and any other documentation required to report the incident to Park and Recreation Department staff.
- Golf Pro shop staff will review the incident with the Superintendent of Special Services and if warranted, the violator may be suspended from the use of the golf course, or golf courses, for a maximum period of 45 days.
- A letter of suspension from the department Director will be sent to the individual(s) being suspended with a copy to the appropriate Golf Pro, the Assistant Director, and the Superintendent of Special Services.
- Dallas Police Department will be contacted as necessary to issue a trespassing card and enforce the suspension when a suspended patron returns to the premises during the period of suspension. At this point, procedures for handling violators of city ordinances and/or state statues will be followed.
- Failure to observe the following regulations may result in expulsion from golf course property.

The Jane Elkins Historical Marker details the little-known story of Jane Elkins who was the first woman hanged in the State of Texas.

Jane Elkins was an enslaved woman whose story is little known in Dallas County, yet her life and death represent significant milestones deserving of recognition. Elkins was the first recorded bill of sale in the county when she was sold for \$400 in 1844. Nine years later, she became the first woman hanged in the state of Texas after being accused of murdering a white man; though she pleaded not guilty, she was convicted without the benefit of a fair trial. Ms. Elkins' life is worthy of recognition because she personifies the essential but obscured role African Americans have played in Dallas County's economic development. A marker that educates the community about the life and death of Jane Elkins opens opportunity for reflection and dialogue about the hidden but vital ways African Americans contributed to Dallas County's economic growth and highlights historic inequities in the justice system.

Under the Interpretive Signage Policy, State Historical Markers are to be approved by the Park and Recreation Board upon recommendation of the Planning and Design Committee, which is why this item is being brought to the Board today for approval.

The Dallas County Historical Commission (CHC) and the Texas Historical Commission (THC) both vetted the information provided and ultimately approved the state historical marker applications (2022). The Texas Historical Commission (THC) funded the marker fee.

The Fire and Lynching of 1860 Historical Marker details the conditions of the period and lynching and the naming of Martyr's Park, a memorial to the men.

On July 8,1860, the temperature in Dallas reached 115 degrees. A combustible fire beginning outside W.W. Peak and Brothers Drugstore destroyed most of downtown. At the time, national tensions ran high over the right to enslave human beings. Many were driven by suspicion of northern abolitionists and a rush to judgement. A local committee of vigilance conducted a swift investigation. Without trials for the accused, a committee of 100 white men ordered all Dallas slaves to be whipped. On July 24, 1860, three slaves, Sam Smith, Patrick Jennings and "OLD CATO," were hanged on newly built Gallows. In 1891, the site of the hanging was named Martyr's Park, a memorial to the men and to the inhumane legacy of slavery in Dallas.

Under the Interpretive Signage Policy, State Historical Markers are to be approved by the Park and Recreation Board upon recommendation of the Planning and Design Committee, which is why this item is being brought to the Board today for approval.

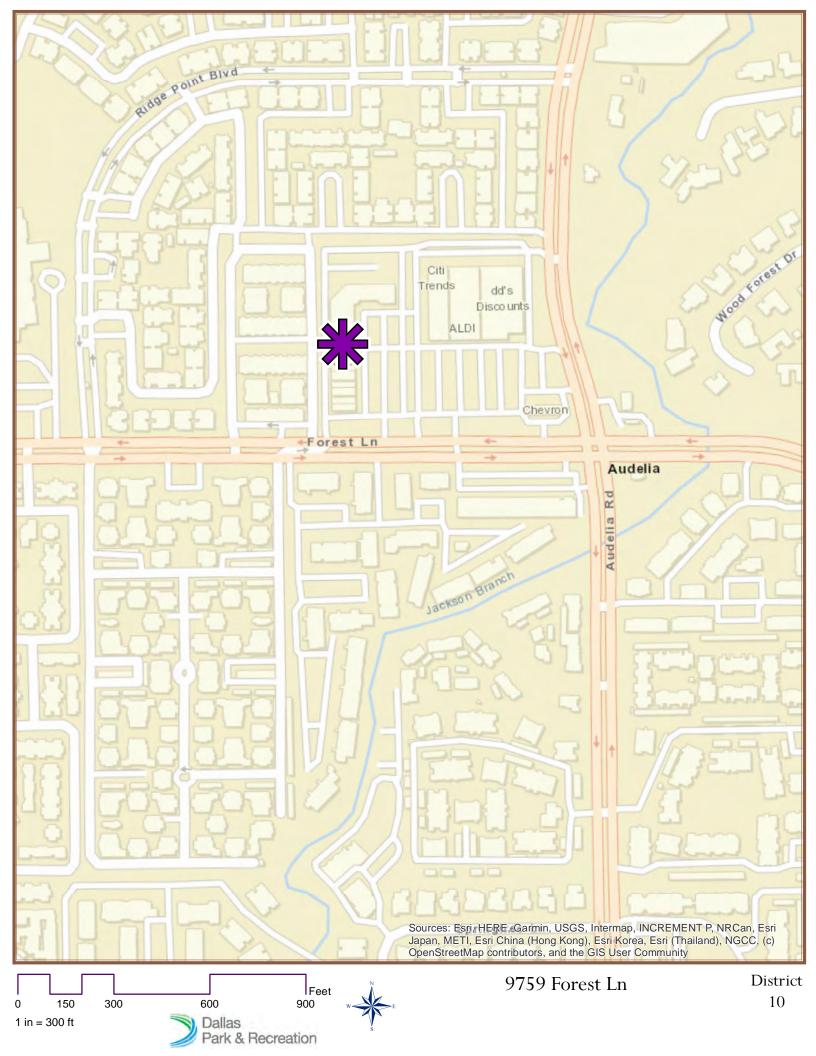

BACKGROUND

This item authorizes the acquisition of a hike and bike trail easement from Prime Diamond Investment, LTD of approximately 764 square feet of land located at 18325 Waterview Pkwy (Project) (**Exhibit A**). The total purchase price for this acquisition is \$17,500.00 based on an independent appraisal (\$14,5000.00, plus closing costs and title expenses not to exceed \$3,000.00).

The hike and bike trail easement will be used for the Cotton Belt Trail Project. The Project is a collaboration between the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG), DART, and local governments, namely Grapevine, Coppell, Carrollton, Addison, Dallas, Richardson, and Plano. When completed the Cotton Belt Trail will extend over twenty-four miles providing connections into many local governments' trail networks across the DFW area including the extensive Dallas Trail Network.

The Project has been designed and is being constructed concurrent with DART's Silver Line project. The construction of critical project construction areas is nearing completion for Phase 1. Phase 2 requires acquisition of the easement area at 18325 Waterview Pkwy.

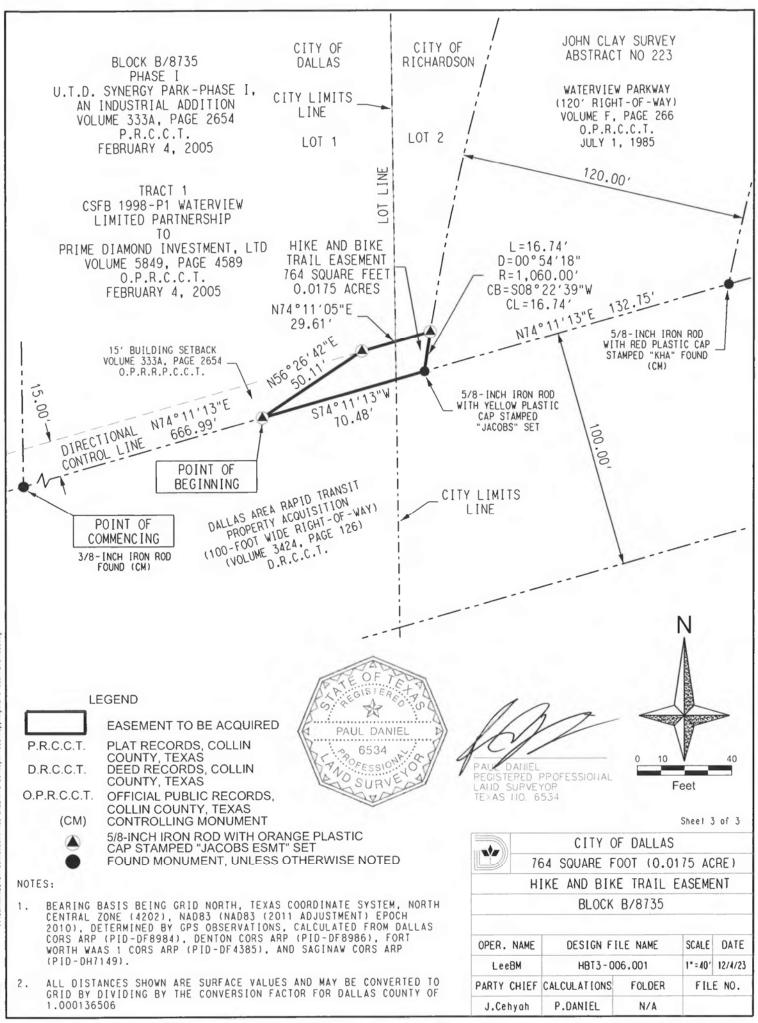

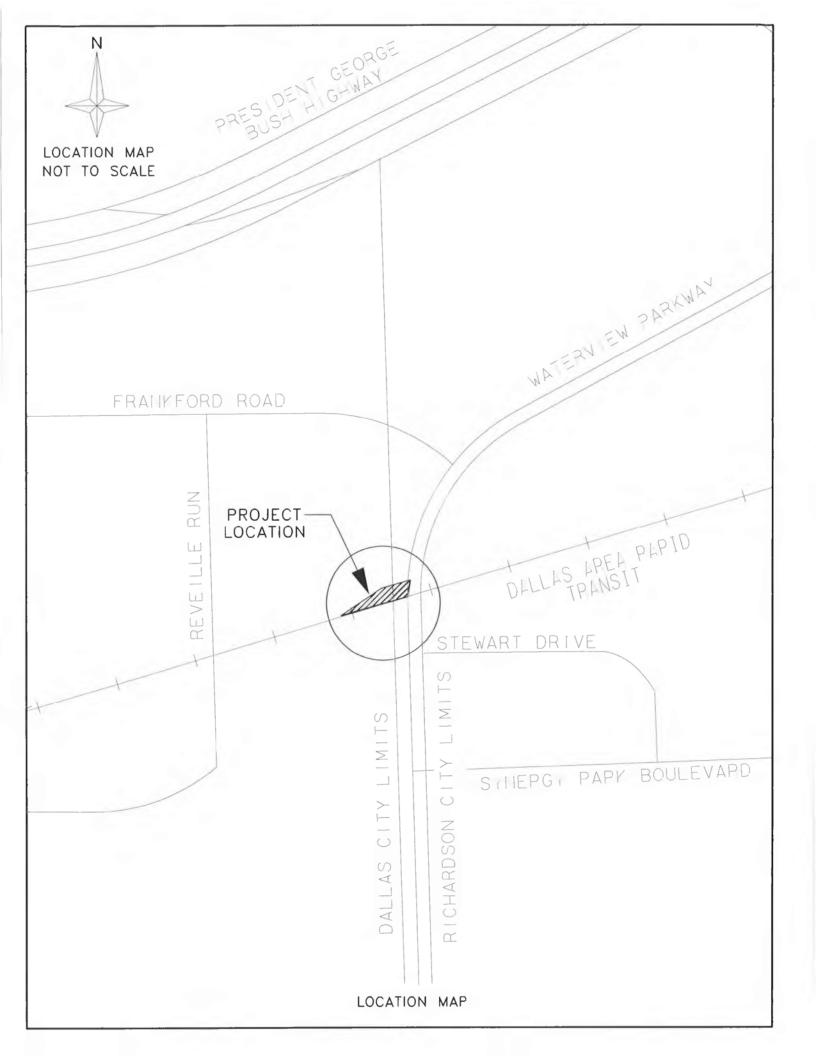

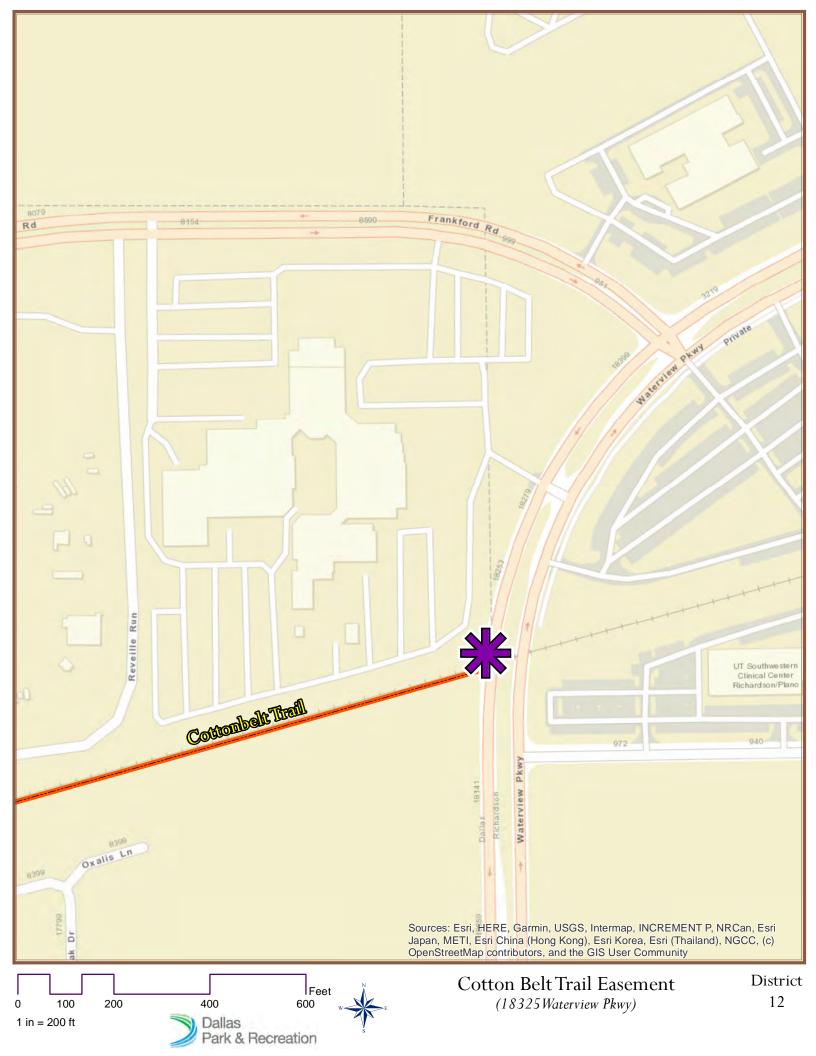

BACKGROUND

This action will authorize Change Order No. 1 to the construction services contract with RoeschCo Construction, LLC for the construction of the University Crossing Trail Lighting Project from Ellsworth Avenue to the Matilda Bridge to improve lighting at Glencoe Park. The original scope of work includes installing light poles from Glencoe Park to Matilda Bridge.

This change order scope includes the installation of nine additional light poles, including the construction of drilled pier footings, light pole bases, fixtures, and wiring along the trail alignment starting from Martel Avenue to Ellsworth Avenue along the University Crossing Trail.

This change results in an increase for additional work scope in the amount of \$201,278.75 increasing the contract amount from \$1,235,000.00 to \$1,436,278.75. Change Order No. 1 adds 180 days to the contract time.

The University Crossing Public Improvement District (UCPID) has an agreement in place with the Texas Department of Transportation to fully fund the required matching funds, not to exceed \$795,395.00.

On January 14, 2021, the Park and Recreation Board authorized an Advance Funding Agreement (AFA) with the TxDOT for a TA Set-Aside Program Project (Agreement No. CSJ 0918-47-204, CFDA No. 20.205) to accept funding for construction of the University Crossing Trail Lighting Project, in the amount of \$1,024,444.00.

On January 14, 2021, the Park and Recreation Board authorized an agreement with UCPID to accept funding for construction of the University Crossing Trail Lighting Project, in an amount not to exceed \$795,935.00.

On February 10, 2021, the City Council authorized: (1) an AFA with TxDOT for a TA Set-Aside Program Project (Agreement No. CSJ 0918-47-204, CFDA No. 20.205) for construction of the University Crossing Trail Lighting Project in the amount of approximately \$1,024,444.00, of which the Federal portion is \$687,280.00, State participation is \$41,769.00, and the City of Dallas' local match is \$295,395.00; (2) a portion of the required local match in the amount of \$27,335.00 to be paid by warrant check to the State at the beginning of the project; (3) the establishment of appropriations in the amount of \$687,280.00 in the University Crossing PID Trail Fund (in addition to direct State participation in the amount of \$41,769.00); (4) the receipt and deposit of TA Set-Aside Program Funds in the amount of \$687,280.00 in the University Crossing PID Trail Fund; (5) allocation of \$295,395.00 in the University Crossing PID Trail Fund as the City of Dallas' local match; and (6) execution of the agreement including all terms, conditions, and documents required by the agreement by Resolution No. 21-0329.

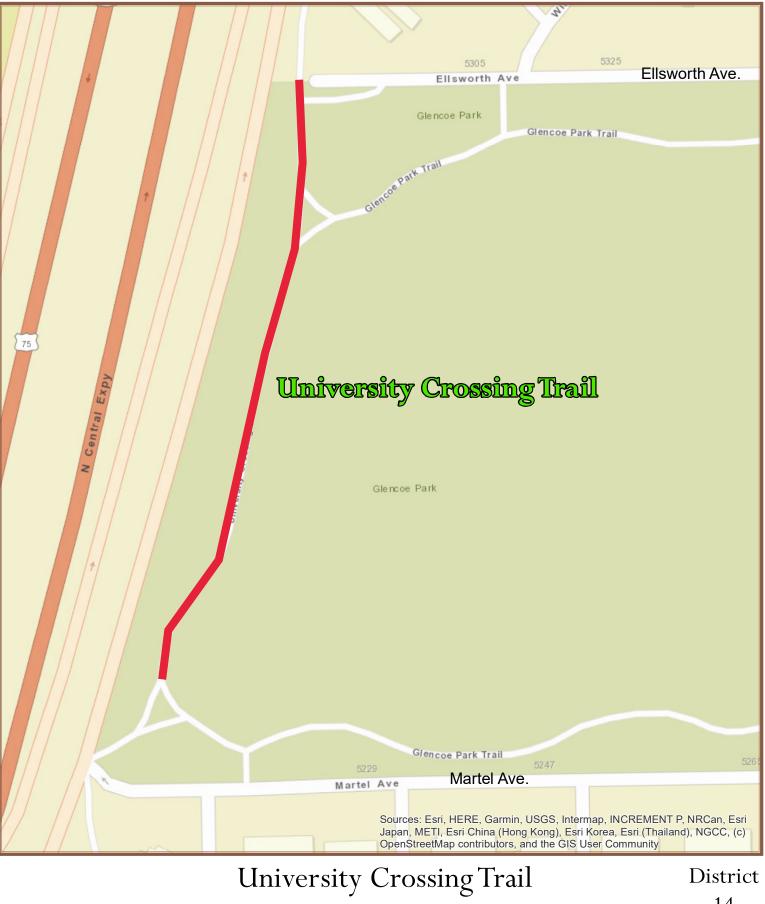
