- 6. discussing or deliberating commercial or financial information that the city has received from a business prospect that the city seeks to have locate, stay or expand in or near the city and with which the city is conducting economic development negotiations; or deliberating the offer of a financial or other incentive to a business prospect. [Tex Govt. Code §551.087]
- deliberating security assessments or deployments relating to information resources technology, network security information, or the deployment or specific occasions for implementations of security personnel, critical infrastructure, or security devices. [Tex Govt. Code §551.089]

Legislative Session Overview



- House Speaker Dennis Bonnen is not seeking reelection
- 15 Senate seats up for reelection; in the 86th Session the Senate was made up of 19 Republicans and 12 Democrats
- All 150 House seats up for reelection; in the 86th
 Session the House was made up of 83 Republicans and
 Democrats



Legislative Session Overview



- The City is expecting numerous harmful bills that could preempt local authority including:
 - Funding threats
 - Economic development tools
 - Transportation planning flexibility
 - Housing fees
 - Local policy decisions

- City Attorney's Office (CAO) works in conjunction with the Office of Strategic Partnerships and Government Affairs (OSPGA) to pursue the legislative agenda and track thousands of bills that could impact city operations

- 116th Congress City of Dallas Efforts
- 116th Congress Unfinished Business
- 117th Congress Preview





- Secured a direct allocation of \$234 million to the City from the Coronavirus Relief Fund, turning back efforts to limit allocations to the states
- Secured tens of millions of dollars in additional direct funding to the City from the CARES Act and other coronavirus relief bills
- Worked with the Finance Department and national organizations to lead national local government efforts to secure the broadest possible use of Coronavirus Relief Fund funds allowed by law





- Worked with the House Appropriations Committee and the House Transportation & Infrastructure Committee to secure additional Surface Transportation Block Grant funding for the Metroplex in the FY 2019, FY 2020, and pending FY 2021 Transportation Appropriations Act
- Secured an increase in the local funding share of Surface Transportation Block Grant and Transportation Alternatives Program in the Housepassed surface transportation reauthorization bill
- Increased funding for several core local government grant programs, including Community Development Block Grants, HOME, public safety grants, and the Urban Area Security Initiative in the FY 2020 and pending FY 2021 appropriations bills,





- Turned back the Administration's proposal to eliminate the Transit Capital Investment Grants Program
- Supported efforts for the Federal Railroad Administration and the Surface Transportation Board to move the Texas Central high-speed rail project through the federal review process
- Promoted legislation sponsored by Representative Veasey to reauthorize the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant; the House leadership subsequently included it in the House-passed infrastructure package





- Continued progress on Hensley Field, including visits from White House and Navy officials
- Continued to educate and lobby the City's delegation on municipal finance in order to protect the tax exemption for municipal bonds and to build support for the reinstatement of advanced refunding of municipal bonds
- Tracked a wide array of regulations related to fair housing, payday lending, clean water, telecommunications, the Community Reinvestment Act, immigration, nutrition, and Surface Transportation Board review of Texas Central, including preparing and filing the City's comments



116th Congress – Unfinished Business



Additional pandemic relief

 State and local government fiscal assistance remains the top sticking point

FY 2021 appropriations

- The House has passed 11 of the 12 annual appropriations bills;
 the Senate has not passed any (even at the Committee level)
- Congress will most likely buy time with a Continuing Resolution through December 2020
- The CR will also include extensions of other expiring programs (transportation, health care, flood insurance, etc.)



116th Congress — Unfinished Business



Reauthorization of surface transportation programs

- The House has passed a five-year reauthorization of highway, transit, highway safety, and intercity passenger rail programs
- The Senate Environment & Public Works Committee has approved a five-year reauthorization of highway programs
- CR will punt long-term reauthorization to the 117th Congress
