WHEREAS, in November 2017, a Capital Bond Program was approved by voters; and

WHEREAS, the Park & Recreation Department sent a justification memorandum to the City Manager's Office and received their concurrence to utilize the Special Need/Justification consultant selection process to select Arredondo, Zepeda & Brunz, LLC as uniquely qualified to provide the professional staff that is needed to continue to support the 2017 Bond Program for the Park & Recreation Department; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary to authorize a professional services contract with Arredondo, Zepeda and Brunz, LLC for staff augmentation support to complete the 2017 Bond Program projects for City Parks and Fair Park, in an amount not to exceed \$428,960.00.

Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DALLAS:

SECTION 1. That the President of the Park and Recreation Board and the City Manager are hereby authorized to execute a professional services contract with Arredondo, Zepeda and Brunz, LLC, approved as to form by the City Attorney, for staff augmentation support to complete the 2017 Bond program projects for City Parks and Fair Park, for a term of one year, in an amount not to exceed \$428,960.00 (subject to annual appropriations).

SECTION 2. That in order to reimburse and finance the authorized disbursements described herein, the City intends to issue one or more commercial paper notes as part of its General Obligation Commercial Paper Notes Series A, and Series B, and use the proceeds thereof to reimburse the disbursements described herein.

SECTION 3. That the Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to disburse funds in an amount not to exceed \$428,960.00 to Arredondo, Zepeda and Brunz, LLC, in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contract from Bond Program Administration Fund, Fund 0294, Department PKR, Unit 3856, Object 3070, Activity BPPK, Commodity 92500, Vendor 080851, Encumbrance/Contract No. PKR-2023-00021282.

SECTION 4. That this resolution shall take effect immediately from and after its passage in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the City of Dallas, and it is accordingly so resolved.
