AGENDA ITEMS AND DISCUSSION

Item # 1 Call to Order

David Noguera called meeting to order at 12:03 pm.

Note taker: Alisha Palma

Item #2 Public Testimony - public comment on items 3, 4, 6, and 7

This is a new addition being added to the agenda and expected to be on all agendas in the future. This item allows members of the public to speak on an item that is expected to have action.

Commissioner John Wiley Price requested that a sign in sheet be provided for speakers on action items.

Item #3 Consideration approval of the minutes August 8, 2019 Board Meeting - David Noguera

Mr. Ken Smith asked for a correction to be made, specifically noting Carl Simpson was not present at the previous meeting. Item # 6 reads Carl Smith and should read Ken Smith.

David Noguera asked for a motion to approve the minutes with the correction.

Ken Smith made the motion to approve the minutes with the correction.

Commissioner John Wiley Price seconded the motion.

David Noguera asked if there were speakers on this item, there were none.

Carl Simpson abstained from voting, the remaining members voted aye.

Item was approved.

Item #4 Consideration and Approval of Treasurer's Report - Orlando Alameda

Albert Gonzalez reviewed the Treasurer's Report for the month of September. This includes the Checking Activity Report and the Fund Balance Report.

Ken Smith asked about the organization's monthly fees for the account.

Albert Gonzalez stated that our finance person David Lee is working on expanding our Chase account services to include online capacity and the fees charged may change in the next month. After such time staff will review our account charges to determine if DHADC can eliminate all checking account fees.

David Noguera asked if there were any other questions about the treasury report, there were none.

Commissioner Price made the motion to approve the report as presented.

Diane Butler seconded the motion.

All voted in favor. Item was approved unanimously.

<u>Item # 5</u> Discussion on the Inventory Report - Albert Gonzalez

Albert Gonzalez reviewed the DHADC Development Report Production and Inventory Status Report. He indicated there had not been a change from the previous month but there would be for October due to scheduled closings for Marcer Construction, Confia Homes and Hedgestone Investments in October.

Ken Smith asked about the totals on the Production Report, specifically lots in inventory and why there is a lots in inventory for the bottom project line item.

Albert Gonzalez replied that the Report could not be verified by staff at this time, but are planning on identifying the status of Land Bank lots in DHADC inventory and Developer's inventory. In addition, he commented that with the increased level of activity and investment by the Housing Department it was more than likely warranted to begin monitoring inventory specifically in that neighborhood.

David Noguera asked if there were any other question or comments regarding the Inventory Reports. There were none.

<u>Item # 6</u> Discussion and the Review of Dallas Urban Land Bank Demonstration Program Interlocal Contract between DHADC and Dallas County, Dallas County Hospital District, Dallas Independent School District, Dallas County Community College District – Albert Gonzalez

Albert Gonzalez reviewed the Interlocal Contract which DHADC is required by state statue to renew with the City's taxing partners on an annual basis. Specifically, he stated staff was recommending the following change to the proposed 2019-2020 Resolution. The amendment will be Section 2, Item A to read as follows:

"The Contract will begin on October 1, 2019 and continue for an initial term of up to six (6) years, unless this Contract is otherwise terminated. This Contract may be renewed for two (2)-year terms by mutual written agreement of the parties hereto, executed not less than three (3) months prior to the expiration of the initial term or the first renewal term, as applicable."

This item previously read in Resolution #18681, Section 2, Item A as:

"The term of this contract shall begin on October 1, 2018 and end on September 30, 2019."

In addition, he noted that a copy of last year's resolution and contract were in the board packets to review as a point of reference.

Commissioner Price stated there has been a change in the District Attorney's Office and any contract moving forward should indicate the new District Attorney. In addition, he commented that these type of contracts which are renewed annually should be boilerplate to minimize the amount of changes needed.

David Noguera asked if there were any other comments or questions, there being none moved on to item #7.

<u>Item # 7</u> Consideration and Approval of Land Bank application for 7 lots from Confia Homes, LLC – Albert Gonzalez

Albert Gonzalez briefly presented the application received from Confia Homes, LLC for the acquisition of 7 lots. He noted that the applicant is purchasing 5 lots and swapping 2 lots. The board had previously approved the swap and were pending an application to do so. The representatives for Confia were present and Albert Gonzalez stated that if there were questions not addressed in the board packet, they would be available for questions. Albert Gonzalez shared the application scoring is done in four (4) basic categories Project Summary, Application Experience is very important history and record of developer is looked at how they are preforming overall specially within the housing department, Performa Underwriting, Project Summary. Staff looks at the ability to perform with significant consideration to the timelines in our application which performance timelines. He stated we would like to see them go a little faster to avoid potential reversions. Underwriting looks at their financial statements and starting to look at ratios for comparability and any potential financial constraints the developer may face. He concluded by discussing the location of the lots with there associated MVAs along with visuals of elevations and floorplans.

Commissioner Price asked if the stated values were a potential reason for the swaps.

David Noguera explained the premise of the MVA and how it is used in identifying smaller markets in the City. He also explained what an emerging market would be characterized as and how it could impact development in its proximity.

Albert Gonzalez recommended to move forward with the exchange of the two lots and sale of the 5 requested lots.

Commissioner Price asked if there were any individuals in the audience who would like to publicly comment on this agenda item. There were none.

Commissioner Price stated if there is no concerns or comments from the audience he would like to make a motion to approve the sale of five lots and swap of 2 lots to Confia Homes. Kris Sweckard seconded the motion.

David Noguera asked for a vote. All voted in favor. Items was approved unanimously.

Item #8 Discussion of proposed Land Bank application modifications – Albert Gonzalez

Albert Gonzalez reviewed staff recommended changes to the Land Bank application in an effort to increase effectiveness and create consistency with other housing programs. He discussed the following items:

- Separating the overview from the application, creating two separate documents.
- Utilizing the 24 CFR Part 5 definition for determining homebuyer's annual income.
- Requiring monthly reports during the project life cycle.
- Requiring submittal of building permits and final green tag.
- Cash flow statements for the project life cycle (single family developments).
- Staff determination for required community outreach for applicants purchasing 10 or more properties which are deemed "scattered" sites.
- Copies of lease agreement forms to be consistent with Texas property Code 92.253 (single family developments).
- Compiled/Reviewed financial statements (single family developments)
- Tax returns, (single family developments)
- Update attached exhibits to reflect modifications.

There was significant discussion regarding the request for tax returns. Albert Gonzalez stated that the returns were necessary for smaller startup firms without the 3 year financial documentation. David Noguera expressed concerns about adding more paperwork and possible obstacles to new developers applying for lots. He asked if staff had communicated with any developers about the possible request. Albert Gonzalez stated he had but only with 3 who did not express any objections.

At this time David Noguera asked Ricardo Alonso, Confia Homes, to approach the board and express his thoughts. Mr. Alonso relayed that he didn't have any issue with the request if it became a requirement.

Diane Butler stated that businesses should be able to provide basic financial statements and tax returns when necessary.

David Noguera asked staff to continue discuss changes with developers.

With no other comments, the board moved on to item #9.

David Noguera left the meeting at this time and asked Albert Gonzalez to finish the remaining agenda items.

Item # 9 Discussion of November Board Meeting/Retreat - Albert Gonzalez

Albert Gonzalez stated that the idea of having a board retreat in the month of November was being considered and encouraged board members to contact him with any thoughts, topics or issues which could possibly be addressed.

Ken Smith indicated that he would like to see a flowchart of the timeline for DHADC acquisition of properties to project completion by a developer.

Diane Butler and Commissioner Price asked staff to research if there was any flexibility in the law to pursue other housing types beyond single family.

Commissioner Price asked that a copy of the state statutes be provided to the board members at the next board meeting.

Albert Gonzalez asked if there were any individuals signed up for public comment. There were none.

Open Mindframe Ventures, LLC

Background:

Open Mindframe Ventures submitted an application for the recent NOFA offering this past July. However, because it is a competitive application for a cluster of lots this applicant did not make it to the underwriting round. Staff met with the applicant to review what could be done to improve their proposal for the next offering, including proposing a smaller project and re-evaluating price points. Staff recommended working with the Land Bank program to pursue a smaller project. Open Mindframe Ventureshas contracted with Ergo Construction to be the homebuilder on this project.

Project Summary:

Open Mindframe Ventures proposes to build for sale, single family homes within Council Districts 7 with a total project cost of \$1,181,816. The proposal requests the acquisition of 8 lots from the City of Dallas' Land Bank Program: 2722 Goodwill, 2715 Goodwill, 4006 Roberts, 4010 Roberts, 4014 Roberts, 3715 Carpenter, 4211 Carpenter, 4226 Carpenter. The applicant will build homes with a sales price point of \$140-\$180k. There will be 4 models, the Lauryn which is listed as 3 bedrooms, 2 baths with a 2 car garage, the Dakota which is listed as 3 bedrooms, 2 baths with a 2 car garage, the Cadie which is listed as 3 bedrooms, 2.5 baths with a 2 car garage and the Isaac which is listed as a 4 bedroom, 2 baths with a 2 car garage. The Isaac model will have approximately 1,923 SF, the Cadie model will have approximately 1,841 SF, the Dakota model will have approximately 1,815 SF and the Lauryn model will have approximately 1,548 SF.

The applicant's contracted homebuilder, Ergo Construction has been active the past 10 years in constructing a mix of affordable housing and market rate homes. This year Ergo Construction has built and sold 6 homes which identified as comparable to those being proposed in this application. These homes ranged in price of \$170,000 - \$260,000. The remainder of the homebuilder's portfolio consists of homes built well above of what would be defined as affordable housing. This is the first application for Land Bank lots from this applicant.

The applicant, Tifanny Dent has a background in construction management and certifications as a minority and woman owned business. Paul Baccus has over 10 years of homebuilding experience ranging from \$130k-\$900k in the Dallas metro. In addition, the partnership includes a realtor specializing in the housing at the proposed price points and a lender specializing in homebuyer assistance programs in Dallas

Open Mindframe Ventures has obtained a line of credit of \$2,000,000 specifically for the development of this project.

Project Costs:

The Applicant projects a total development cost of \$1,181,816 with an average profit margin of 9.7%. The applicant anticipates a construction cost of approximately \$79.96/SF for each of the Lauryn units proposed, a construction cost of approximately \$80.36/SF for each of the Dakota units proposed, a construction cost of approximately \$84.78/SF for each of the Cadie units proposed and a construction cost of approximately \$85.90/SF for each of the Isaac units proposed. The average construction cost per unit is expected to be \$147,727. This figure was derived from experience on similar projects in the Dallas market recently completed and under construction. Previous documented completed housing units

support the conclusion that the proposed construction cost is reasonable and achievable for this applicant. The applicant noted the construction costs breakdown, specifically materials used to support costs per SF. Therefore, cost reasonableness for construction of the units themselves has been established. The project budget also includes estimates of various other soft and carrying costs as well as typical costs of sale. Costs of the sale are included in Marketing and Closing costs. Other line items such as financing costs, permits and impact fees, professional fees and financing costs all appear reasonable as well. All soft costs are below the maximum allowable amount. In addition, the timeline for completed construction from acquisition is 100 days and sale from acquisition is 165 days.

Unit Sales:

The applicant included floor plans and elevations, with detailed square footage and unit features, along with proposed site plans. The units sold will range from 1,548 SF to 1,92 SF. The price point for the Lauryn units is expected to be \$140,000, the price point for the Dakota units is expected to be \$160,000, the price point for the Cadie units is expected to be \$175,000 and the price point for the Isaac units is expected to be \$180,000.

The Lauryn units at 1,548 SF will be listed at \$90.44/SF for an average sales price of \$140,000 each, the Dakota units at 1,815 SF will be listed at an average of \$88.15/SF for an average sales price of \$160,000, the Cadie units at 1,841 SF will be listed at an average of \$95.06/SF for an average sales price of \$175,000, and the Isaac units at 1,923 SF will be listed at an average of \$93.60/SF for an average sales price of \$180,000.

The proposed sale prices of the units appear reasonable given the existing market, observed sales and recent developer sales targeting similar AMIs. Home sales will be targeted to households earning between 50-115%. When applicable, the applicant works closely with mortgage lenders, realtors and non-profits which are well versed with down payment assistance programs in the area and utilize such programs regularly.

Lot Characteristics:

The proposed lots are categorized as I by the MVA. The 9 markets (A-I) identified by the City's Market Value Analysis on a spectrum of residential market strength or weakness. Those categorized A are the strongest areas in Dallas and I are the weakest as defined by a number of factors, such as foreclosure filings in the market and percent of vacant homes in the market. The applicant has previous experience constructing and selling affordable homes in markets identified as H and I. In addition, lot sizes range from 4000 SF to 7600 SF and all are appropriately zoned for residential use.

Applicant Financial Snapshot:

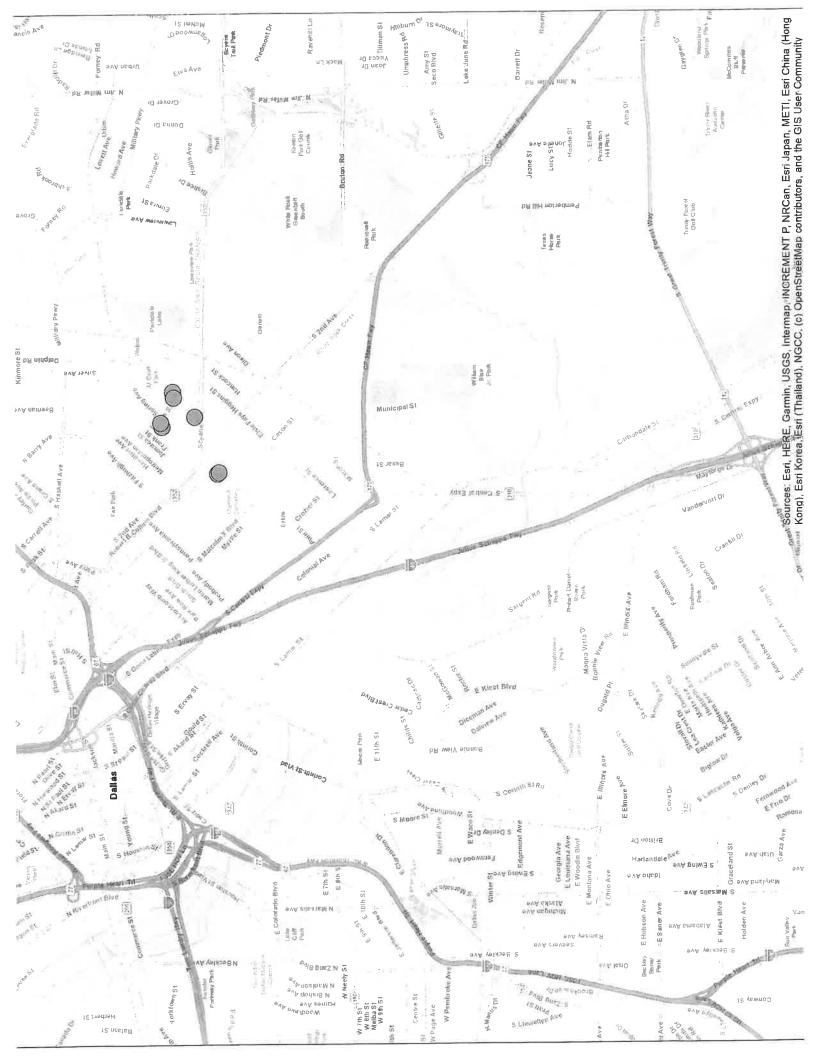
Reviewing the applicant's past 3 years financial statements indicated the applicant has enough equity and cash flow to support the initial investment requirements for the line of credit offered for the project. The line of credit provide enough cash flow in 1 fiscal year to finance the construction of the project based on projected costs, 1.6X. Based on the most recent financial statements provided the applicant currently has a manageable debt ratio (.48) and a projects a DSCR of 2.65 with a strong liquidity ratio. In addition, the applicant has a recently posted PM of 58%. There do not appear to be periods of cash flow issues in the forecast of the project.

Project Tax Impact:

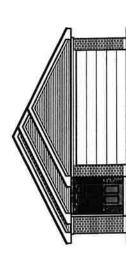
The applicant's project when completed is expected to generate approximately \$35,810 in annual property tax of which \$10,173 will be allocated to the City of Dallas. The 5 year projection, intended to correlate with the required 5 year affordability period, is projected to be approximately \$179,050 in property tax revenue of which approximately \$50,867 will be collected by the City of Dallas.

Recommendation:

The project as proposed by the applicant is recommended for approval of the sale of 8 lots as requested through the Land Bank application. The applicant has established overall cost reasonableness, demonstrated funding commitments to complete the project and has provided a proforma that projects potential buyers within the requirements of the city's housing policy and adequate cash flow assuming sales of the units to those potential buyers within a reasonable time frame. The project advances the city's housing policy by providing single- family home ownership opportunities for households earning between 115% and below of AMIs.
