87th Texas Legislative Session Wrap-Up



- 87th Legislative Session was dominated by the following:
 - COVID-19 Pandemic
 - Ominous Budget / Economy
 - Power Grid Crisis
 - Broad-based ban on local regulations
- Conservative Priorities
 - Permitless Carry
 - Election Law
 - Bills identified by the Governor, Lt. Governor, and Speaker
 - Social Issues



87th Legislature Statistics



- 7,385 total bills filed
- 1,174 sent to governor
- 1,400+ bills filed of interest to the City of Dallas
- 165 bills passed of interest to the City of Dallas
- 10 bills of interest to the City of Dallas are effective immediately
