WHEREAS, on August 8, 2018, City Council adopted the Resilient Dallas plan, that identified challenges posed by food deserts and identified efforts to improve local public health, to reduce emissions and mitigate the impacts of climate change as part of the strategy to make Dallas neighborhoods and our community thrive by Resolution No. 18-1026; and

WHEREAS, on May 27, 2020, City Council adopted the Comprehensive Environmental & Climate Action Plan, including initiatives ranging from air quality to zero waste improvements, including buildings, energy, transportation, water resources, green space, food security, urban agriculture emissions, and air quality, in order to reduce emissions, adapt to the future and ensure equitable action towards a clean healthy environment by Resolution No. 20-0688.

Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DALLAS:

SECTION 1. That the City Manager is hereby authorized to execute a service contract with Agritecture, LLC (VC23365), approved as to form by the City Attorney, for a comprehensive food and urban agriculture plan for the Office of Environmental Quality and Sustainability for a term of two years, in an amount not to exceed \$250,000. If the service was bid or proposed on an as needed, unit price basis for performance of specified tasks, payment to Agritecture, LLC shall be based only on the amount of the services directed to be performed by the City and properly performed by Agritecture, LLC under the contract.

SECTION 2. That the Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to disburse funds in an amount not to exceed \$250,000 (subject to annual appropriations) to Agritecture, LLC from Service Contract No. MGT-2021-00015263.

SECTION 3. That this resolution shall take effect immediately from and after its passage in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the City of Dallas, and it is accordingly so resolved.
