<u>SUBJECT</u>

A resolution accepting the FY 2018-2019 Annual Report on the status of Tax Increment Financing Reinvestment Zone Number Ten (Southwestern Medical TIF District or District) and authorizing the City Manager to submit the annual report to the Chief Executive Officer of each taxing jurisdiction that levies taxes on real property in the District, and to the State Comptroller, as required by state law - Financing: No cost consideration to the City

BACKGROUND

Currently the City has 19 active tax increment financing (TIF) districts. State law (the TIF Act, Chapter 311 of the Tax Code) requires that the governing body of a city shall submit an annual report on the status of each reinvestment zone it has created to the Chief Executive Officer of each taxing unit that levies taxes on real property in the zone, as well as the State Comptroller. On April 27, 2005, City Council authorized Ordinance No. 25965, as amended, establishing Tax Increment Financing Reinvestment Zone Number Ten (Southwestern Medical TIF District). On January 11, 2006, City Council authorized the Project Plan and Reinvestment Zone Financing Plan for this District by

Ordinance No. 26204, as amended.

The Southwestern Medical TIF District's assessed 2019 tax value was \$297,730,146.00, an increase of \$230,319,092.00 or (341.7%) over the adjusted base year value (\$67,411,054.00). The District's value increased by \$31,720,554.00 or (11.9%) from the previous year. This increase will result in the collection of approximately \$1,738,916.00 (City - \$1,430,926.00; County - \$307,989.00) incremental revenue for the Southwestern Medical TIF District.

PRIOR ACTION/REVIEW (COUNCIL, BOARDS, COMMISSIONS)

On April 27, 2005, City Council held a public hearing and authorized the establishment of Tax Increment Financing Reinvestment Zone Number Ten, the Southwestern Medical TIF District by Resolution No. 05-1361; Ordinance No. 25965, as amended.

On January 11, 2006, City Council authorized the Project Plan and Reinvestment Zone Financing Plan for the Southwestern Medical TIF District by Resolution No. 06-0129; Ordinance No. 26204, as amended.

On January 30, 2020, the Southwestern Medical TIF District Board of Directors recommended that the FY 2018-2019 Annual Report be accepted and approved.

The Economic Development Committee was briefed by memorandum regarding this matter on February 3, 2020.
