SUBJECT

Authorize a three-year service price agreement for grounds maintenance and xeriscaping for the Water Utilities Department - Shawnee Mission Tree Service, Inc. dba Arbor Masters Tree Service, most advantageous proposer of two - Estimated amount of \$732,170 - Financing: Dallas Water Utilities Fund

BACKGROUND

This action does not encumber funds; the purpose of a service price agreement is to establish firm pricing for services, for a specific term, which are ordered on an as needed basis according to annual budgetary appropriations. The estimated amount is intended as guidance rather than a cap on spending under the agreement, so that actual need combined with the amount budgeted will determine the amount spent under this agreement.

This service price agreement will provide grounds maintenance and xeriscaping for the Water Utilities Department. This service price agreement will furnish all mowing, trimming, edging, flower beds, mulching, and xeriscaping services. Xeriscaping is landscaping and gardening that reduces or

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eliminates the need for supplemental water from irrigation. It is promoted in regions that do not have easily accessible, plentiful, or reliable supplies of fresh water.

A six-member committee from the following departments reviewed and evaluated the qualifications:

•	Office of Procurement Services	(1)*

The committee selected the successful respondent on the basis of demonstrated competence and qualifications under the following criteria:

•	Experience/qualifications	30 points
•	Cost	30 points
•	Staffing plan/approach	25 points
•	Business Inclusion and Development Policy	15 points

As part of the solicitation process and in an effort to increase competition, the Office of Procurement Services used its procurement system to send out email notifications to vendors registered under relevant commodity codes. To further increase competition, the Office of Procurement Services uses historical solicitation information, the Internet, and vendor contact information obtained from user departments to contact additional vendors.

On November 10, 2015, the City Council authorized a living wage policy that requires contractors to pay their employees a "living wage" rate as established annually by the Massachusetts Institute of Technology Living Wage Calculator for Dallas County by Resolution No. 15-2141. The current calculated living wage during the solicitation process of this contract is \$11.71; the selected vendor meets this requirement.

PRIOR ACTION/REVIEW (COUNCIL, BOARDS, COMMISSIONS)

On February 8, 2017, City Council authorized a three-year service contract to provide grounds maintenance and xeriscaping for Water Utilities facilities with Good Earth Corporation and Texas Blooms Organic Landscape Company by Resolution No. 17-0263.
